Dear Kevin:

I have been anxious to chat with you about how things have been going. As I mentioned during our brief telephone conversation a couple of weeks ago, I get the Globe and Herald here in D.C. a few times a week, and on the weekends that I have been home. The papers have allowed me to keep up at least minimally on Boston news. It seems clear that things have been, and must still be, very hectic for you. The latest news I heard was that David was back on the air. I hope that is still the case and he is doing well.

As I think you are aware, I left the Attorney General's office (with Scott's blessings and on good terms) to come to Washington as part of the senior staff for the Kennedy Assassination Records Review Board. The Review Board is an independent federal agency appointed by the President

to oversee the review and release of the Kennedy assassination records. The Board is not conducting a re-investigation of the assassination. The purpose of the law is to allow the American public to have a complete record of the assassination available at the National Archives. The five member Board has until October 1996 to complete its job.

The Board will be coming to Boston to visit the JFK Library and conduct a public meeting in late March. I would like to inquire about whether or not you and David would be interested in having John Tunheim, Chair of the Board, on the show during one of the evenings that we are in town. Tunheim is the Deputy Attorney General in Minnesota. He does an excellent interview and handles calls very well. The evenings that Tunheim would be available are: Wednesday, March 22nd and Thursday, March 23rd. The Board's tentative schedule is to spend Thursday at the JFK Library and conduct the public meeting on Friday morning. If there is interest on your part, perhaps Thursday would be the best night for an interview.
