Re Paris letter to Bureau 5/25/65.

On 6/15/65, the Police Judiciaire (Criminal Police), Sûreté Nationale (PJSN), Paris, France, advised that following an extensive search of their records French Customs authorities have been unable to locate any record that FUEGER declared three mink coats and jewelry at the time she entered France. Our French source has concluded that these belongings apparently were not questioned and no record was made at that time that FUEGER was in possession of them.
