SUBJECT: Conference, [REDACTED] ARTIFICIAL, [REDACTED] 24 March 1954.

1. On 24 March 1954 between 8:30 and 12:30 P., [REDACTED] and the writer visited [REDACTED] and conferred with [REDACTED] ARTIFICIAL consultant in hypnosis, and [REDACTED] representative in [REDACTED]

2. In general, the conference was for two purposes: the first, to introduce [REDACTED] and; the second, to obtain a very general idea of [REDACTED] opinions on certain matters concerning the use of hypnosis in connection with proposed ARTIFICIAL [REDACTED] operations in the fall of 1954. [REDACTED] briefed [REDACTED] in general terms concerning the [REDACTED] project and told him his ideas of what he considered the possible uses of hypnosis for indoctrination, orientation, development of new personalities, control of activities, [REDACTED] of individuals to be used in the future in connection with the [REDACTED] ARTIFICIAL work.

3. [REDACTED] answered and discussed all questions at length with [REDACTED] and gave his views on the use of hypnosis in a project of this type. For the record, it may be said it closely parallels the views previously set out by ARTIFICIAL. In certain cases [REDACTED] admitted the answers were not known since to his knowledge no one in the field of hypnotic work had attempted such experiments. [REDACTED] very clearly indicated in his professional opinion that the overall [REDACTED] ARTIFICIAL work as outlined by [REDACTED] had great merit and that he felt that a large percentage of the discussed ideas could be carried out successfully.

4. [REDACTED] indicated a willingness to co-operate in this work in any way he could and arrangements were made so that he and [REDACTED] and, possibly later, [REDACTED] could get together and discuss the problems further.

5. In connection with the above [REDACTED] clearly stated that he and the writer are most desirous of talking with [REDACTED] and setting up a series of conferences in which the more specific aspects and technical ramifications of the [REDACTED] ARTIFICIAL work could be carefully examined. [REDACTED] assured [REDACTED] and [REDACTED] as soon as [REDACTED] returned from a lecture tour, which he at this time was making, another conference would be arranged.

6. [redacted] was very definitely convinced that by using the hypnotic techniques and if they were properly laid on, remarkable strides could be made in the use of this method in intelligence work. [redacted] stated he was certain [redacted] could arrange and would arrange his work so that he could accompany a team into the field for a test in support of the [redacted] ARTICHOKÉ work.

7. [redacted] and the writer left [redacted] where the conference was held [redacted] at 12:35 P.M. and [redacted] stated that he would leave a few minutes later. This had previously been agreed upon as a sound security precaution by all hands.
