ARTICHOKE Interviews with Contacts.

On Tuesday, 26 January 1951, between 9:30 and 11:30 All, and the writer talked with two contacts who have been cleared to the Secret level in connection with the ARFICHONE work. Set out below is a very brief discussion and the results thereof.

> and is a specialist on the effects of drugs and chemicals on the Central Nervous System. He is also a specialist on animal experimentation. It had previously been contacted by and the writer and had offered encouragement and assistance along ARTICHOKE explained at this contact that he lines. had been endeavoring to work out some type of measuring device which could be used in accurately measuring the sedative and hypnotic effect of certain drugs and chemicals on small animals which would be along lines of interest to ARTICHORE experimentation. stated that so far he had not been able to develop what he regarded as a sensitive enough apparatus but would continue this work as new ideas came to him. He stated that certain use could be made of the electroencephalograph in animals down to the dog level, and that this device could be used in connection with certain types of monkeys but this would, of course, entail heavy expenses and a considerable amount of time. again offered to test any "new" chemicals that would be developed and stated he would consider further types of animal experimentation as he found time to handle this. requested that we furnish him with new materials and he would watch the various reports that moved across his desk in connection with new and modified chemicals and drugs which he was studying for the

and had previously been interviewed by and the writer. who had been extremely co-operative previously, again volunteered his services in searches for new and promising materials and stated he personally would attempt to locate new chemicals and drugs or set in motion methods that would turn up new chemicals and drugs of interest to ANTICHOKE.
