

8. We also discussed the use of sodium pentathol as an anesthesia, and its relative effectiveness as a drug for loosening the tongue. [REDACTED] said that it is his conclusion after years of experience with it, that a patient will speak no more freely under the effects of sodium pentathol than he will after liberal consumption of alcohol.
