Aims of this study:

It has long been the opinion of the writer that the following behavior traits or behavior characteristics are the predominent characteristics of the masses. In this proposed study, the investigator proposes to relate certain ecological factors to the formation of some critical behavioral characteristics of masses. Employing content analysis of historical records, the investigator

the geographic conditions of the population decline and growth, food supply, floods and droughts, insect infestations, pestilences, and other natural diseases, civil wars, barbarian invasions, and the political policies and education systems of the ruling

to the formation of such behavioral characteristics as:

will trace the relationship of such ecological factors as:

- 1) Lack of religious feeling (in the sense of a supernatural being), and hence lack of an organized church;
- 2) Aversion to violence:
- 3) Passivity to brute forces, either natural or human;
- 4) Fatalistic view towards life: the strong tendency for one to adjust or adapt to the one's environment, however adverse, rather than to modify or conquer the environment;
- 5) Lack of spirit of adventure;
- 6) Lack of individual initiative;
- 7) Lack of the desire to be independent or different from others; rather, the strong tendency to conform to the existing social requirements and to imitate or follow the ones who have been successful socially or in business:
- 8) Lack of the spirit of team work;
- 9) The paradoxical tendency of the individual: On the one hand he is most self-sacrificial in the family almost to the point of selflesness; on the other, outside the family, he can be most selfish without moral or legal restraints;

- 11) Indifference to public welfare;
- 12) The feeling of racial superiority;
- 13) Absence of the sentiment of nationalism (and hence patriotism) (until the turn of the present century);
- 14) The strong tendency to compromise without regard to one's rights, justice or truth;
- 15) The strong tendency to look with suspicion in anything that is new (somewhat modified by the impact of the
- 16) The tendency (as it is almostly known to the in interpersonal relations;
- The apparent docility toward authority (which in has mistaken for "Cooperation" and has wrongly interpreted as an inherited trait developed from a "hydraulic society "founded upon the proposition that the individual had to be forced to do what was necessary for his society and thus for himself) but always with an inner feeling of bitter resentment or hatred and readiness to avenge authorities when they are overthrown and on the run.

These behavioral characteristics have confronted the with a number of serious psychological problems in their revolutionary efforts. Our second step in this study, therefore, will be to anyalyse the methods by which the Communists endeavor to solve these psychological problems.

A third step in this study will be an investigation of the successes and failures of the Communists in their efforts to solve these problems to date; and an analysis of the major conflicts between the character and Communist policy which invitably must be resolved in the future.

Hethods:

In parts one and two of our study we shall adopt a method of content analysis of certain historical documents and records.

In our third step of investigation we shall employ three general methods: (a) observation of the behavior of the of various age

groups who from time to time come from the (b) interviewing these people; and (c) giving tests to the younger (school age) groups brought up in the during the last decade.

We shall design our test forms in such a way as to discover these children's attitudes towards: (1) the state vs. the individual; (2) family, parents and other relatives; (3) various religions; (4) physical moral concepts on practical matters (as against abstract moral principles); (5) economic and political systems; leading personalities in history; (7) arts, drama and literature; and (8) personal plans and personal ambitions for the future.

In our observations and interviews of the peoples who have resided in the will be given to the influence of the attitudes and other behavior characteristics of the older generation over the younger generation who are brought up mainly or solely under the Communist rule.

Special points of emphasis:

Based on the findings of this investigation of the behavior characteristics of the old and young who have resided in the Communist during the last decade a tentative prognosis will be made as to how far an accomplishment of the Communist Revolutionary effort could be expected from psychological standpoint.

Many of the above mentioned behavioral characteristics are closely interrelated. Most of these behavior traits are bred in the family from generation to generation. Therefore in our historical analysis we shall pay special attention to the clanism (the writer prefers this term to "familialism" or "family system").

In our historical analysis besides the physical and economic forces, we shall give a close and critical examination to these two systems of philosophy to find out, if any, the evidences to substantiate my long suspicion that these two systems of philosophy as they are known to-day are partly original and partly invented by the later scholars since the

and the public examination systems, and their officially announced purposes and their underlying secret motives (which, as far as this writer is aware, have not even been suspected by the Scholars of culture), and consequently the building up of the elite class - known to the Scholars as - also had had some influence over the personality make-up of the people, and must also receive due evaluation in our investigation.

In our examination of these two philosophical systems, we shall have occasions to gather evidence to test this writer's theory that as well as other systems of thought (known as during the period of during the period of during the prevailing as a themselves the natural products of the then prevailing social conditions or rather of the reflections of the prevailing mental moods of the masses of that period.

In the absence of a supernatural religion and an organized church, it would be a tremendously difficult task for any government to achieve social solidarity and social stability. In our historical investigation we shall try to collect factual evidence showing how these phenomena were accomplished, and how they affect the modes of thinking and patterns of behavior of the people during each period.

In our study of the Communist psychological techniques in ruling

we shall try to compare the similarities and differences between

the ancient rulers and modern Communists, and to find out what

tangible effects on the behavior patterns of the masses have taken place.

In this study special attention will be devoted to the fact that in the above list of behavioral characteristics there are certain characteristics which will work favorably for the Communist efforts in remolding the society while certain others with their so deep historical erts will work against them. Our work will be trying to see how well the Communists exploit the favourable traits and what means they have employed to combat or destroy the unfavourable ones.

Relationship to other studies:

Many of the above listed behavioral traits or characteristics of the have been frequently mentioned in the writings of the experts. But they are very often fragmentary and scattered in various books and articles and more often than not, either erroneous, misleading or superficial in their interpretations or evaluations.

As far as this writer is aware, there has been no attempt to put these

number of interesting but not altogether correct views about history and the basic structure of the society. It should be regarded as a well balanced view and preview of an author who seems to be quite familiar with the historical background of society, but it can hardly be considered a scientific approach.)

Duration of project:

The magnitude of this proposal is such that many years profitably could be devoted to it. It is anticipated, however, that the most essential parts of the research and reporting can be accomplished in three years. It is hoped that the grant can be made for a minimum of two years with some assurance of continuation upon submission of satisfactory evidence of progress.

It is to be noted that the lists of ecologocal factors (ecological variables) and behavioral characteristics (defendent variables) are merely tentative ones and are to be grouped into smaller numbers of categories according to their similarities and differences in nature and according to the convenience of the analytical procedures. And as the investigation is making progress, new ecological factors and new behavioral characteristics will appear to require attention and a regrouping or reorganization of the categories of both ecological factors and behavior characteristics will become necessary so as to include the new factors or new characteristics. Such organization and re-organization will be reported to the Society as soon as it is done.

The investigator has now commenced to work out somewhat in detail a concrete procedure for historical analysis. As doon as this is completed, a copy will be submitted to the Society.

Detailed procedures for observation on behavior and interviews and giving tests will be worked out in a later stage.

It appears that the scope in the proposed plan is somewhat vast. However, as soon as the detailed haitorical procedure is worked out, the scope will be consequently narrowed down and the work in view will be more concrete and precise. The same is applied to observation of behavior, interviews and tests in a later stage of the investigation.

There is a relationship between Dr. search and this proposed plan which may be briefly eated stated as follows:-

(1) Both work towards the same goal: the scientific understanding of the national character.

- approach, emphasing the personality of the individual while this proposed investigation will try to reach its goal through historico-ecological approach, that is, to find its basic factors for the formation of the personality.
