The group will continue to investigate the role of the central nervous system.

In human disease.

- One branch of these activities will be concerned with extending and analyzing a phenomenon established in previous studies, that the functional capacity of the central nervous system is impaired following prolonged periods of inadequate and unsuccessful adaptation. Two projects will be carried out. The first is an extensive analysis and comprehensive formulation of data already gathered in which the highest integrative function of patients diagnosed as having chronic and of patients with prolonged and a severe were assessed. As the analysis proceeds additional psychological tests and observations of such subjects will be required. The second is concerned with the observation that subjects with as well as ostensibly are defective in their capacity to intact patients with prolonged and form "temporary cerebral connections" or "conditioned reactions" as demonstrated by the electroencephalograph. These observations will be extended to include hospitalized patients with schizophrenic reactions, potients with lesions of the brain in regions other than the cerebral hemispheres, and subjects who are experiencing severe stress and/ or anxiety, especially in subjects who are adapting to a new environment.
- 2. Studies designed to examine the hypothesis that the mediator substance of axon reflex vosodilatation (neurokinin) is implicated in the mechanism of a variety of disease states.

- a) It has been established that neurokinin is present in increased amounts in the painful and tender regions of the scalp during vascular headache of the migraine type.

  Further characterization of the pharmacodynamic and biochemical features of this subcutaneous perfusate will be carried out. Also, a laboratory method will be sought for screening of agents possibly useful in treatment of migraine headache. This method would be based on the properties of agents that antagonize neurokinin or the neurokinin forming enzyme.
- b) Attempts will be made to measure the neurokinin content of perfusates and "washes" of abdominal viscera before and during interviews dealing with aspects of the patients' life situation that are particularly threatening. Patients with colostomies or ileostomies with and without ulcerative colitis will be one group studied. Subcutaneous perfusate of unticarious regions of skin will also be studied.
- 3. Biochemical and pharmacological studies of neurokinin will continue.
  - a) Methods are now being developed to prepare large quantities of neurokinin.
- b) In cooperation with the Department of partification and chemical characterization of neurokinin will be attempted.
- c) Pharmacological studies of the properties of neurokinin will be continued.

  Preliminary studies have indicated that neurokinin is antagonized in vitro by the steroid hormones of the adrenal cortex and by salicylate. This observation may be pertinent to the anti-inflammatory action of these agents. Studies of the action of these agents on the enzyme that forms neurokinin will be undertaken. Also it has been observed that LSD-25, an agent that induces delirium when administered in extremely small amounts, strongly potentiates one apparent action of neurokinin (stimulation of respiration). Study of Highest Integrative Aunotions: Progress Report, and Proposal for the Coming Year.

## I. Present Status of the Study:

The investigations of the highest integrative functions are fundamentally sized at increasing our understanding of the functions of the human cerebral hemispheres in overall adaptive behavior. They arose out of our laboratory and clinical experience during the past twenty years, and especially out of our interest in the phenomena exhibited by men exposed to extremely threatening life situations; and they were initiated during the period when we were investigating the untoward effects of Communist police procedures.

The body of evidence accumulated during these studies indicated that under extremely adverse circumstances sen may develop symptoms clinically difficult to distinguish from those produced by gross brain damage or by agents that impair cerebral metabolism; lack of discrimination, poor tolerance of frustration, heightened suggestibility, illogical thinking, breakdown of defense mechanisms, mental clouding, discrimination, and frank delirium.

The initial efforts to elucidate these phenomena began several years ago, and have largely been brought to a conclusion during the past twelve months.

The first step in this study was the systematic investigation of the highest integrative functions of people who had suffered damage to their cerebral hemispheres, the amount and location of which was known as precisely as possible. During the course of four years, 250 such people were studied. In order to provide them with the widest possible opportunity to expose their defects in function, many areas of their adaptive activity were explored, both outside and within the laboratory. Subjects were observed in their performance on clinical assay procedures, including some that are well known as well as others that were newly devised. They were exposed also to procedures

especially designed to investigate areas of behavior such as perseveration, which were of special interest. In addition to this, each was studied extensively by the usual clinical, neurological, and psychiatric methods. Finally, an extensive review was made of his life history, both before and after his brain injury, with special attention to his performance in the more complex areas of his life adjustment, such as his capacity to deal with the requirements and challenges arising in his family and in his work.

The second step in the investigation was a similar study of estensibly intect people with no known gross damage to their cerebral hemispheres. Two groups of such people have been investigated: 50 people with disorders such as chronic anxiety, tension, depression, and schizophrenia, and 25 people with bodily illnesses such as peptic ulcer, ulcerative colitis, or migraine headaches.

### II. Findings to date:

from the integration of all of the data obtained from people with damage to the cerebral hemispheres, it has been possible to define some of the adaptive functions of the human that are primarily subserved by the neopallius.

These have been called the "highest integrative functions" of the organism, and they have been placed in four general categories, wis:

- (a) The intact meopallius enables a man to express his appetites, drives, and feelings in a manner appropriate to life in a complex society.
- (b) It provides him with mechanisms for the achievement of complex goals (learning, memory, logic, etc.).
- (c) It enables him to maintain a high degree of telerance for frustration and failure when confronted by conflicting drives, and to recover promptly
  from the effects of frustration and failure when they occur.
  - //(d) It provides him with the capacity to maintain effective and well-



modulated defense reactions (i.e., repression, denying, pretending, rationalization, blaming, withdrawal, phantasy, depersonalization, obsessive-compulsive behavior, and bodily reaction patterns involving alimentation, respiration, metabolism, etc.).

Evidence from the study of the brain-damaged indicates that these highest integrative functions are not localized within the hemispheres. They fall off in a graded fashion dependent upon the amount of hemisphere tiesue that is lost, and without regard to its location. Moreover, they fall off long before less highly organized functions, such as simple memory, the ability to calculate, or the ability to carry out tasks of some complexity learned prior to the brain injury, are lost.

Evidence from the study of the obronically anxious, tense, depressed, and achizophrenic subjects indicates that their highest integrative functions, as judged by their performance on the tests and in their life adjustment, falls off in a manner not distinguishable from that of people who have sustained brain damage. They can, of course, be distinguished from people with gross brain-damage by the absence of localizing neurological signs, and by the intactness of some of their less complex functions; but in their inability to express their feelings appropriately, to utilize their goal-schieving mechanisms effectively, to tolerate frustration and failure, and to maintain well-modulated defense reactions, they are indistinguishable from those who have sustained direct damage to their brains. In many instances their functions are impaired to a degree equivalent to that produced by a large loss of besisphere tissue (100 grams).

or manifestations

These two groups of chronically ill people, in short, show manifestations of an impairment of their cerebral hemispheres. Because some of the disturbances of these people are transient, the impairment of their hemispheres is to some extent reversible and is said to be "functional"; but since many of their illnesses, like schizophrenia, ulcerative colitis, and chronic psychoneuroses, and their accompanying failures of life adjustment, are notoriously unremitting, it seems quite likely that some of these people have, in effect, a severe and permanent impairment of their neopallium.

This evidence of severe, and possibly permanent, impairment of the function of the cerebral hemispheres raised the question of whether other, and chemically detectable, evidences of altered brain metabolism might be found in people in whom, up to the present, only symptoms of disturbed function had been described. It seemed possible that substances associated with disturbed cerebral metabolism might appear in the spinal fluid, and might be found there in people with disturbances of cerebral function.

Therefore, the initial search was directed toward the detection, in the spinal fluid, of substances that might be related to disturbed brain matabolism.

This polypeptide has not been identified chemically, but in biological preparations it has many of the characteristics of a polypeptide found in blister.

This enzyme has been found to be present in the spinal fluids of 45 out of 50 people with various forms of active brain damage. It has been found also in the spinal fluids of 13 out of 15 people during attacks of vascular headache. It has not been found in the spinal fluids of 50 persons who

system. It was found in the

had no evidence of disease of the central nervous system. It was found in the fluid of some persons who were experiencing much stress.

of perhaps greatest interest, it has been found in the spinal fluids of 45 out of 50 people with active schizophrenis, but without other evidence of disease.

We believe that the finding of this enzyme-like substance and polypeptides under the circumstances described supports other evidence that metabolic disturbances occur in the brains of people with besidence and achizophrenia. We expect that the same substance will be found in the spinal fluids of people with other chronic disturbances of their highest integrative functions.

It is well known that profound disturbances of the highest integrative functions, accompanied by pronounced disturbances of mood, thought, and behavior, may be produced in people by exposing them to environments to which they can make no adequate adaptation, such as concentration camps, or prison procedures simed at interrogation and indoctrination. Therefore, it seems reasonable to infer that exposure to such a situation in itself produces an impairment of cerebral hexisphere function; and that this impairment may sometimes be very grave.

The investigations in Brain Function initiated in the

Program were based on the postulate that the functions of the human brain and possibly its structure may be damaged as a consequence of prolonged stress. This thesis is now almost fully documented. Early in the study, impairment of the highest integrative functions was defined through the elaboration of methods for the study of highly selected subjects with loss of known amounts of tissue from the cerebral hemispheres. These persons were studied by a large aggregate of quantitative behavioral indicators and by means of extensive information from their families and their essociates. It was then demonstrated that the highest integrative functions are impaired to a degree closely linked to the mass of tissue loss, regardless of site, and in a manner determined by the subject's development, previous life experience and prevailing high level adaptive reactions.

These methods were next applied to several groups of persons who had suffered prolonged stress. The evidence gathered indicates that the brain is vulnerable when severe threat is prolonged, and may be damaged when there is a failure in high level adaptation for long periods. Those persons who perceived themselves as most threatened, and who exhibited the most serious abreactions, were those who were most severely impaired in their highest integrative functions. Such defects were sometimes major and in some instances incompletely reversible. To explain such defects, a thesis currently entertained by the laboratory is that the observed dysfunction may be related to neurohumoral and biochemical aspects of inappropriate and faulty metabolism that are capable of investigation.

The program for the ourrent year will include extensive further documentation of the above thesis with explorations of the biologic mechanisms behind these damaging processes. It is hoped that, by so doing, ways and means of avoiding and eliminating the above described abreactions will be forthcoming.






