This responds to your Freedom of Information Act (FOIA) request of 27 August 2009 for "copies of the five oldest open FOIA cases on record." A copy of your request is enclosed. Your request has been processed under the FOIA, and most of the documents you requested are enclosed on a CD-ROM. Certain information, however, has been deleted from the enclosures, and 48 documents (251 pages) have been withheld in their entirety.

Some of the information deleted from the documents was found to be currently and properly classified in accordance with Executive Order 13526. This information meets the criteria for classification as set forth in Subparagraph (c) of Section 1.4 and remains classified TOP SECRET, SECRET and CONFIDENTIAL as provided in Section 1.2 of the Executive Order. The information is classified because its disclosure could reasonably be expected to cause exceptionally grave damage to the national security. Because the information is currently and properly classified, it is exempt from disclosure pursuant to the first exemption of the FOIA (5 U.S.C. Section 552(b)(1)).

In addition, this Agency is authorized by various statutes to protect certain information concerning its activities, as well as the names of its employees. We have determined that such information exists in these documents. Accordingly, those portions are exempt from disclosure pursuant to the third exemption of the FOIA which provides for the withholding of information specifically protected from disclosure by statute. The specific statutes applicable in this case are Title 18 U.S. Code 798; Title 50 U.S. Code 3024(i); and Section 6, Public Law 86-36 (50 U.S. Code 3605).

In addition, some of the information has been deleted from the enclosures pursuant to the fifth exemption of the FOIA. This exemption applies to inter-agency or intra-agency memoranda or letters which would not be available by law to a party in litigation with the agency, protecting information that is normally privileged in the civil discovery context, such as information that is part of a pre-decisional deliberative process and attorney-client privileged information.

Personal information regarding individuals has also been deleted from the enclosures in accordance with 5 U.S.C. 552 (b)(6). This exemption protects from disclosure information that would constitute a clearly unwarranted invasion of personal privacy. In balancing the public interest for the information you request



against the privacy interests involved, we have determined that the privacy interests sufficiently satisfy the requirements for the application of the (b)(6) exemption.

Since some documents were withheld in their entirety and information was withheld from the enclosures, you may construe this as a partial denial of your request. You may appeal this decision. If you decide to appeal, you should do so in the manner outlined below.



We have also redacted the employee names of other agencies pursuant to (b)(6) or (b)(7)(C) to release those documents to you and avoid lengthy consultations.



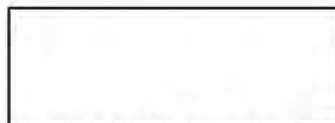

As far as I can tell from the conversations I had with the IAD organizations, the paragraphs marked (U) or (U/FOUO) are not really a problem and can be released. Hopefully the names mentioned in those U and FOUO paragraphs can be redacted. The problem in most cases was that some of the information should probably have been classified higher when the documents were first published, but it's too late now. So, I think that as long as most of the names of individuals can be redacted, the rest of the information can be released whether marked U or U/FOUO. I was mainly



concerned about making sure that the material marked with higher classifications was reviewed properly because it was really too late to do anything about the U and U/FOUO information. I hope this helps....

Thanks for your response on this one...I do have a question about the FOUO material. Do you mean to have all that material redacted? In some cases an entire document is marked FOUO with no portion marking, in others there is portion marking - sometimes with all paragraphs marked (U) and sometimes with some marked (U) and some marked (FOUO), and in some cases there are no markings except (U) on the paragraphs (i.e., no FOUO on the pages), and in some cases there are no markings at all on page or paragraph - and yet much of the material in all these documents is pretty much the same. So I am a little puzzled about how to handle. If I redact everything marked FOUO whether it is a portion or page marking, that will leave information that is nearly identical unmarked for release - ? How do you want me to deal with this information?

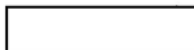

--if more information is now releasable in the documents already released he would then like to receive another copy of the documents with the additional information released, as well as any additional documents responsive to his request that may not have been previously released, incrementally if he would get records quicker if we provided them in stages

--he went on to say that perhaps after the first incremental release, he may decide he doesn't need anything else and close out his request

(U) I reminded Mr. Sims that I was a contractor, but that I would pass on his wishes to you and someone would get back to him. **Please let me know**

However, until we find out if he wants to pursue his request, don't spend any time searching for them. While talking to Mr. Sims you may tell him that at this point we don't know if unredacted versions still exist (unless you do know).

## Issue 2

(U) The documents currently scanned in the case were found in ADMS, printed (with the Doc ID # printed on the document) and then scanned into this case by a previous case officer. During Marty's original review/analysis of the case, he found that the documents were not originally separate documents, but part of compilation of documents (a cover letter with many documents attached). See docs A2344556/2344566, A2344324/2345566, and A2344676/234676. It appears that a previous case officer printed these three documents, and then separated them and had them scanned as separate documents.

I told Marty that if Mr. Sims is interested in pursuing his case, we would probably need to delete the document with the Doc ID # printed on them to alleviate any confusion and start over. At this point, I don't know if we have copies of the documents without any redactions.

(U) **The question I have regarding the documents is should they be scanned as three documents (Marty believes all the documents are included in the three compilation of documents) or should we separate each attachment within the three compilation documents and have them scanned separately?**

Good questions. Let's try to make this easy.

NPR is not a government agency, so release those names.

NRC (research council) - I did not look at the documents, but I would not consider them a government agency for FOIA purposes and would release the names. If you're not sure if it's "research" or Nuclear Regulatory, I would err on the side of caution. [REDACTED]

Unidentified names - release them. If there is nothing to tie them to a specific agency, then the requester is not going to be able to do so either. If for some reason he does, and another agency gets angry with us, that's the way it is. I'm sure that NSA names get released, too, because they

aren't ID'd as NSA names in documents that other agencies process.

After 9/11, DOD started protecting personnel lists of names b6 to protect them from terrorists, basically. Their memo indicated that this included active duty military personnel, civilian employees, contractors, members of the National Guard and Reserves, military dependents, and Coast Guard personnel when operating as a service of the Navy. Ordinarily, names of DOD personnel, other than lists of names, mentioned in documents that are releasable under the FOIA should not be withheld, but in special circumstances where the release of a particular name would raise substantial security or privacy concerns, such a name may be withheld. I believe that some agencies, like DISA, may have taken this memo to the extreme, and are protecting the names even when it's not a "list." I'd go ahead and do it for DISA, since they asked you to. However, if there are others, unless it's a list, release it.

There was talk a short while ago about disbanding DSS altogether. Anne never got the final word. She is waiting to hear back from the Defense Privacy Office to see what happened to DSS, and then whether we need to protect their names. My gut is that it doesn't fit the criteria laid out in the DOD memo for b6. Will get back to you as soon as she hears back from someone.

Pamela - (U) I am working on case 5518, involving (NSA-kept) minutes of the (early 1990's) meetings of the NSTISSC (National Security Telecommunications and Information Systems Security Committee), and am wondering about the release policy for employee names of the below listed organizations that sent reps to these meetings. Would they be releasable, as non-government?

- **NPR:** (see doc 568389, page 7, para. 23) This may stand for National Public Radio. If so, I cannot find that it is a government agency (neither could Marianne, when she helped me with organizations' phone numbers back in March.) It is not in the Federal Staff Directory (2002-Fall), nor mentioned on the Federal Predecessor List, nor in Local Guidance. I did a search in Highview for document titles involving NPR or National Public Radio and got no good hits.

- **NRC** (National Research Council) - see especially doc 568399, page 7 and doc 568431, page 2, Section II.A. National Research Council is listed in the Federal Staff Directory under quasi-official, international and non-government organizations, where it is said to be an independent advisor to the federal government. Although it operates under a congressional charter, its parent organizations are private organizations that receive no appropriations from Congress. Ref. the following docs not of my case: 473875 and 401823.

(U) Another problem is that the Nuclear Regulatory Commission was an observer on two subcommittees of the NSTISSC, and could have had reps at these meetings. Sometimes NRC is not spelled out to be any particular organization, so I do not know for sure if it refers to National Research Council (sometimes named in my documents) or Nuclear Regulatory Commission (which is never spelled out in my documents.) What do I do about names from an unidentified "NRC"?

(U) Then there is the problem of names that I can't associate with any organization. Should I release them? On the other hand, it is doubtful that the requester would take us to court over names, so we would probably never have to defend protecting them.

(U) In the process of checking name release policies, I have had problems getting someone on the phone at Dept. of Education's General Counsel Office (apparently I must know the name of the party I wish to reach or I get disconnected). I have also had trouble reaching the Defense Security Service (the number in the L.G. Phone Book is "no good as dialed".) Then there's the OMB, which (so far) won't call me back. I have left two messages now, a week apart. I am not sure what to do to get my question answered regarding release of representative's names for these agencies.

(U) Thank you for your guidance in these matters.

P.S.: L.G. lists DISA as an agency whose employee names are releasable, but that has changed. They now protect them with B6. I confirmed this with Robin Berger of DISA yesterday.

John - (U) Docs responsive in Case 5518 are all minutes of the meetings of the National Security Telecommunications and Information Systems Security Committee, a committee that met back in the early 1990's on the subject of info security, and was chaired by NSA. Many govt. agencies attended. A number of years ago, IAD reviewed the docs, and wanted all portions that had been classified, to continue to be protected. In a few situations, I thought the material was clearly unclassified. I have typed the paragraphs in question below. They are excerpts from various minutes, which I have numbered for ease of reference. Please take another look at these paragraphs and tell me if they may be released. Thanks.

1. The Chairman stated that the recent issuance of NSD 47, Counterintelligence and Security Countermeasures, by President Bush has raised some concerns regarding the relationship of the NSTISSC and the Advisory Group on Security Countermeasures (AG/SCM) and its Committee on Technical Security (COTS). The Chairman called upon the Executive Secretary to clarify this relationship. The Executive Secretary provided the following: [all paras following are marked unclassified and IAD did not identify them for redaction]

the President on 5 July 1990 and issued as NSD 42, "National Policy for the Security of National Security Telecommunications and Information Systems."

3. Contains information on dramatic political changes, the European threat transition, new threats in the Third World, and increased sophistication and capabilities of adversaries to exploit telecommunications and information systems.

Reflects early lessons of Desert Shield, identifies shortcomings and progress, and focuses on national security systems.

4. The threat is shifting away from traditional categories of information. U.S. information being targeted is in the areas of economic, financial, scientific and technological, much of which is maintained in unclassified data bases. Many examples were presented.

NSR-18 validates the shift in threat and recommends a review to determine whether current responsibilities should be expanded to encompass safeguarding categories of information that are not classified, but still require some level of protection.

5. A threat environment portion of the Threat IV report will contain information describing the threat, sizing and identifying the threat, threats to system life cycle phases, and a means for measuring the threat.

The report will provide detailed information on 12 areas: theater/contingency/tactical threat, denial and/or disruption of service, economic intelligence, drug trafficking, terrorism/counter-terrorism, target distribution, PSN, arms control, threats to space assets, foreign intelligence intentions, national INFOSEC threat fusion and a threat cases matrix.

6. The next item of business by the Executive Secretary was a review of NSTISSC actions either completed or still current since the last meeting. She noted that a complete list of actions was in attendees' folders, and highlighted two: [paras following are marked classified, and IAD wanted them protected and I agreed. Only this intro seems releasable to me]

7. [redacted] Chief, Office of Strategic Systems, NSA, provided a . . . . . (b)(3)-P.L. 86-36 briefing on the Protected Communications Zone (PCZ). The following is a summary of this presentation.

Lee,

I was going to call you first about the above 1993 case, but on second thought to save you time, decided to give you a little background to mull over, and then when you have a minute, we can discuss on the phone. Complex case 5518 is a request for NSTISSC minutes on which Jackie has already done a lot of meticulous work. What makes this case a special challenge is the multiplicity of agencies and associated personnel names appearing in the minutes.

Eight referral or re-referral letters have been drafted for the case at this stage. As I go through the case, I find additional agencies and associated names appearing in the minutes, and it looks as though other referral letters may have to be drafted (or calls made) and some of the letters already drafted may need to have additional docs included. For example, in just two of the first four listed documents (A568389 and A568394) Department of Transportation, FEMA, FCC and OMB are present with names of personnel. In later documents, NIST, Departments of Energy, Education, and Health and Human Services appear. Most of these agencies also have included in the minutes names of their personnel who were present at meetings. None of the eight outgoing referral letters are going to the foregoing agencies.

When Jackie worked the case, her MR indicates that she relied to some extent on Local Guidance to determine FOIA releasability, though I did notice that she also made phone calls or cited calls made as early as 2002 to determine some agencies' wishes regarding the names of their personnel. Unfortunately, Local Guidance and even guidance on FOIA handling received directly from the agencies themselves some years ago may not apply to FOIA cases being worked today. As you know, Vivian also called around some months ago to ask many of these same agencies how they want names of their personnel handled in FOIA cases. (Guidance based on the responses is now in TOOLKIT, which you know.) Vivian sometimes was given guidance that differs from what was provided earlier, or from what Jackie used to make release decisions. For example, Jackie in her MR cites her interpretation of the AF's 2003 rules as being to use b3

for names. Vivian, however, was told to use b6/OGA to protect AF names. In her MR, Jackie also cites LG as a basis for releasing names from certain agencies/departments, including Commerce, FEMA, and Energy. But Vivian's calls to these agencies determined that for FOIA purposes these three agencies want a referral on names, as does DoT. DoT and FEMA with names appear in the two docs cited above in the second paragraph. In another example, Vivian's guidance says to refer names to DISA, but Jackie's MR says to redact, using b6. Not necessarily a conflict, but a little confusing.

I could go on, but I think that the above examples suffice to illustrate the difficulties presented by this case and the amount of work still remaining before the new batch of referrals can go out, never mind before the requester gets a response. Pls give me a call when you have a little time. I don't want to make your FOIA life any more complicated than it already is, but this case does present unusual problems. Again, this is no reflection on Jackie. It seems like she gets a lot of the hard cases, and over time, so much can change..

1. (U) Enclosed please find 15 documents (**Encl A**) which have been deemed responsive to a Freedom of Information Act (FOIA) request for "all records on or pertaining to Oliver Laurence North." Copies of the original request, appeal, appeal response, and narrowed request are enclosed (**Encl B**). Because of the unique manner in which we must respond to the requester, we are initially sending you documents to review that we believe can be released at least in part. Should any of the documents being reviewed by your organization, or any other organization, be denied in full, we will supplement those documents with additional documents in order to reach the requisite 100 pages. Therefore, we may, in the future, send additional documents for your review.

2. (U) Please review the records and **advise us of that information which you believe should be protected**. Material can be protected if it falls within one of nine categories of exempted information. The first exemption allows for the withholding of classified information. If the enclosures are properly marked, those portions will be protected. Therefore, we ask that you verify the classification of the material and re-mark any paragraphs which are not properly classified. If information is classified, it is exempt from disclosure pursuant to the first exemption of the FOIA (5 U.S.C. Section 552(b)(1)).

3. (U) In addition, information can be protected under the third exemption of the FOIA which precludes the release of information protected by statute. The statute which may be applicable in this case is Section 6 of Public Law (P.L.) 86-36. P.L. 86-36 protects, inter alia, functions and activities of NSA. In considering information which potentially falls within this category, the primary question is how closely related the information is to the central functions and activities of NSA. The closer the connection to sensitive NSA functions and activities, the stronger the justification for withholding under P.L. 86-36. This statute applies to classified and unclassified material.

4. (U) Another exemption which may apply to the enclosures is the fifth exemption. This exemption allows an agency to protect information which is deliberative and pre-decisional, if the release of such information would cause a foreseeable harm. For example, if the release of the information would hinder the flow of candid opinions or negatively impact

the deliberative process, it may be protected.

5. (U) You may also find information contained within the enclosures which meets the protection criteria of the second exemption, which protects information the release of which would allow for the circumvention of the rules or practices of an agency. If the information would allow someone to bypass procedures set in place to ensure security of systems, for example, or the information would expose vulnerabilities, it may be protected.

6. (U) **Please highlight those portions of the enclosures you believe should be withheld pursuant to the exemptions discussed above.** The FOIA requires that information which does not fall under an exemption be segregated from protected information and released. 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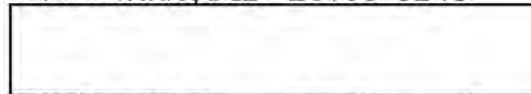

This further responds to your Freedom of Information Act (FOIA) request dated 4 March 1994 on behalf of Ms. Linda Hunt for all records this Agency maintains on Oliver Laurence North, case number 5622. A copy of your original request is enclosed. Currently, it is our practice to send an initial response letter to a FOIA requester within 20 days of receipt of the request to indicate that we have begun to process the request and provide the requester with certain information relating to this processing. In the past, however, it was our practice to send only a postcard giving a requester his/her case number. During the processing of this request, we discovered that we had only provided you with a postcard indicating your case number and that we had not addressed your client's request for a fee waiver.

For purposes of this request and based on the information you provided in your letter, your client, Ms. Linda Hunt, is considered a representative of the media. Unless she qualifies for a fee waiver or reduction, she must pay for duplication in excess of the first 100 pages.

Ms. Hunt's request for a waiver of fees has been denied. You may consider this an adverse determination, and you may submit an appeal to the appeal authority as indicated below. This decision was made in accordance with the provisions of the FOIA that permit an agency to waive or reduce fees if that agency determines that such an action would be in the public interest. In reaching this decision, several factors were examined: (1) whether the subject of the requested records concerns the operations or activities of the government; (2) whether the disclosure is likely to contribute significantly to an understanding of specific government operations or activities; (3) whether disclosure of the requested information will contribute to the understanding of the public at large, i.e., the general public must benefit from disclosure; and (4) whether you have a commercial interest the magnitude of which is sufficiently large, in comparison with the public interest in disclosure, that disclosure is "primarily" in your commercial interest.

The decision to deny your client's fee waiver request is based on Item (2) because the disclosure would not be likely to contribute to an understanding of government operations or activities when nothing new would be added to the public's understanding. Much information on Oliver North is already currently available to the public; therefore, the public would not be the primary beneficiary of the disclosure, as intended by the Act.

If you disagree with the decision regarding fee waiver denial, you may file an

appeal to the NSA/CSS Freedom of Information Act Appeal Authority. The appeal must be postmarked no later than 60 calendar days after the date of the initial denial. The appeal shall be in writing addressed to the NSA/CSS FOIA Appeal Authority (DC34), National Security Agency, 9800 Savage Road STE 6248, Fort George G. Meade, MD 20755-6248. The appeal shall reference the fee waiver denial and shall contain, in sufficient detail and particularity, the grounds upon which you believe waiver of fees is warranted. The NSA/CSS FOIA Appeal Authority will endeavor to respond to the appeal within 20 working days after receipt, absent any unusual circumstances.

We estimate that the duplication fees for this request will be approximately \$2,700.00. Fees are assessed in accordance with DoD Regulation 5400.7-R. Duplication fees are computed at \$0.15 per page. Our policy is to request advance payment prior to completing the processing of a FOIA request. Since this is only an estimate, if, as we process your request, we determine that duplication fees will be significantly greater than the estimate, we will notify you before continuing with our processing.

If you would like us to proceed with the processing of this request, we request that you remit to the FOIA office (see below for address) a check or money order made payable to the Treasurer of the United States in the amount of \$2,700.00. This responds to your narrowed Freedom of Information Act (FOIA) request on behalf of Ms. Linda Hunt for "all records on or pertaining to Oliver Laurence North." On 16 November 2006 during a phone conversation with me, you narrowed your request to the following 100 pages of records, excluding open source material or documents that originated with other agencies:

- 25 pages that relate to or mention Fawn Hall
- 25 pages that mention Oliver North and drugs (running or personal use)
- 50 pages in the following two categories; however, if we do not hold 25 pages responsive to each of the above categories, you request additional pages in this category to reach a total of 100 pages:
  - 25 pages that are NSA originated
  - 25 pages that are classified

A thorough search of our files was conducted, but no records responsive to the portion of your request for records that mention Oliver North and drugs were located. Initial processing has been performed under the FOIA, and we have located 100 pages of NSA originated, and/or classified records that we believe may be releasable. Eight documents (14 pages) are being provided with this response. Certain information, however, has been deleted.

Some of the information deleted from the documents was found to be currently and properly classified in accordance with Executive Order 12958, as amended. This information meets the criteria for classification as set forth in Subparagraph (c) of Section 1.4 and remains classified SECRET and CONFIDENTIAL as provided in Section 1.2 of the Executive Order. The information is classified because its disclosure could reasonably be expected to cause serious damage to the national security. Because the information is currently and properly classified, it is exempt from disclosure pursuant to the first exemption of the FOIA (5 U.S.C. Section 552(b)(1)).

In addition, this Agency is authorized by various statutes to protect certain information concerning its activities. We have determined that such information exists in these documents. Accordingly, those portions are exempt from disclosure pursuant to the third exemption of the FOIA which provides for the withholding of information specifically protected from disclosure by statute. The specific statutes applicable in this case are Title 18 U.S. Code 798; Title 50 U.S. Code 403-1(i); and Section 6, Public Law 86-36 (50 U.S. Code 402 note).

In addition, some of the information has been deleted from the enclosures pursuant to the fifth exemption of the FOIA. This exemption applies to inter-agency or intra-agency memoranda or letters which would not be available by law to a party in litigation with the agency, protecting information that is normally privileged in the civil discovery context, such as information that is part of a predecisional deliberative process, attorney-client privileged information and attorney-client work product.

The fact that we were unable to locate records responsive to a portion of your request and the deletion of information from these interim documents may be construed as a partial denial of your request; therefore, you are hereby advised of this Agency's appeal procedures. Any person denied access to information may file an appeal to the NSA/CSS Freedom of Information Act Appeal Authority. The appeal must be postmarked no later than 60 calendar days from the date of the initial denial letter. The appeal shall be in writing addressed to the NSA/CSS FOIA Appeal Authority (DJP4), National Security Agency, 9800 Savage Road STE 6248, Fort George G. Meade, MD 20755-6248. The appeal shall reference the initial denial of access and shall contain, in sufficient detail and particularity, the grounds upon which the requester believes release of the information is required. The NSA/CSS Appeal Authority will endeavor to respond to the appeal within 20 working days after receipt, absent any unusual circumstances.

The remainder of the pages responsive to your request includes documents containing other government agencies' information. Because we are unable to make determinations as to the releasability of the other agencies' information, the subject documents have been referred to the appropriate agencies for review. We will respond to you further when consultation with the other agencies has been completed.

Dear Authority:

By letter dated November 15, 2005, Louis F. Giles, Director of Policy, granted my client, Linda Hunt, status as a representative of the news media but denied her application for a public interest fee waiver. We hereby appeal this denial.

Mr. Giles based his denial solely on one of the four relevant criteria, concluding that "the disclosure would not be likely to contribute to an understanding of government operations or activities when nothing new would be added to the public's understanding. Much information on Oliver North is already currently available to the public; therefore the public would not be the primary beneficiary of the disclosure as intended by the Act."


Mr. Giles does not state that he has personal knowledge either of what is already in the public domain or what is in NSA's files. Nor does he state that the NSA's files would add nothing of significance to what is already known about Mr. North and his activities. Nor does he point to exactly where in the public domain the information he refers to is.

In Campbell v. U.S. Dept. of Justice, 164 F.2d 20, 36 (D.C. Cir. 1999), the D.C. Circuit considered a case in which only a partial fee waiver was given because the FBI had concluded that portions of the requested materials were already in the public domain. The Court stated: "Yet the FBI has never explained where in the 'public domain' these materials reside. Such an explanation is necessary because the mere fact that material is in the public domain does not justify denying a fee waiver; only material that has met a threshold level of public dissemination will not further 'public understanding' within the meaning of the fee waiver provision."

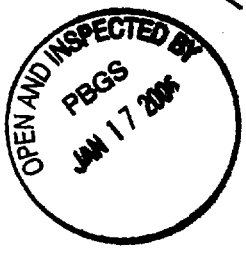
Campbell also noted that "the FBI has not indicated how closely related the requested material was to material already in the public domain," an omission which also characterizes Mr. Giles fee waiver denial. It stated that this was "an omission that precludes deference to [the FBI's] ultimate conclusion." Id.

As you note, under the FOIA Ms. Hunt is entitled to 100 free pages regardless of whether she is entitled to a fee waiver. As this request has been pending for 12 years, we ask that you send these 100 pages forthwith.

This replies to your letter dated 12 January 2006 appealing the National Security Agency's decision to deny your request for a fee waiver under the Freedom of Information Act (FOIA). Your original request, the Director of Policy's letter dated 15 November 2005, and your appeal letter have been reviewed. As a result of this review, I have concluded that the fee waiver should not be granted.

In reaching this decision, a number of factors were evaluated in light of the FOIA's purpose of promoting an informed citizenry. The key issue I considered in my review is whether "disclosure of the information is in the public interest because it is likely to contribute significantly to public understanding of the operations or activities of the government and is not primarily in the commercial interest of the requester." See 5 U.S.C. § 552(a)(4)(A). Implicit in this standard is a requirement to assess the nature of the information requested and whether it will likely be disseminated to the general public. In order to support a fee waiver, the connection between furnishing the requested information and benefiting the general public cannot be tenuous.

In your letter of appeal, you argued that the Director of Policy's response did not indicate what information on Oliver Laurence North is already currently available to the public and where in the public domain it could be located. The Office of Policy's initial search for responsive documents revealed a large majority of information pertaining to open-source documents (press articles), which more than likely can be found on the Internet or through other publications. Accordingly, I have determined that the public interest is better served in this instance by requiring, rather than waiving, the fee assessment.

You may want to consider narrowing the scope of your client's request since on appeal you clearly indicate a desire to receive (free of charge) 100 pages, which your client is entitled to, even if she is not granted a fee waiver. The Office of Policy can process your client's request several different ways. For example, they can process for the first 100 pages that -- (1) NSA believes are not open-source documents; (2) are NSA-originated material; or (3) are marked as classified.



This further responds to your Freedom of Information Act (FOIA) request dated 4 March 1994 on behalf of Ms. Linda Hunt for all records this Agency maintains on Oliver Laurence North, case number 5622. A copy of your original request is enclosed. Currently, it is our practice to send an initial response letter to a FOIA requester within 20 days of receipt of the request to indicate that we have begun to process the request and provide the requester with certain information relating to this processing. In the past, however, it was our practice to send only a postcard giving a requester his/her case number. During the processing of this request, we discovered that we had only provided you with a postcard indicating your case number and that we had not addressed your client's request for a fee waiver.

For purposes of this request and based on the information you provided in your letter, your client, Ms. Linda Hunt, is considered a representative of the media. Unless she qualifies for a fee waiver or reduction, she must pay for duplication in excess of the first 100 pages.

Ms. Hunt's request for a waiver of fees has been denied. You may consider this an adverse determination, and you may submit an appeal to the appeal authority as indicated below. This decision was made in accordance with the provisions of the FOIA that permit an agency to waive or reduce fees if that agency determines that such an action would be in the public interest. In reaching this decision, several factors were examined: (1) whether the subject of the requested records concerns the operations or activities of the government; (2) whether the disclosure is likely to contribute significantly to an understanding of specific government operations or activities; (3) whether disclosure of the requested information will contribute to the understanding of the public at large, i.e., the general public must benefit from disclosure; and (4) whether you have a commercial interest the magnitude of which is sufficiently large, in comparison with the public interest in disclosure, that disclosure is "primarily" in your commercial interest.

The decision to deny your client's fee waiver request is based on Item (2) because the disclosure would not be likely to contribute to an understanding of government operations or activities when nothing new would be added to the public's understanding. Much information on Oliver North is already currently available to the public; therefore, the public would not be the primary beneficiary of the disclosure, as intended by the Act.

If you disagree with the decision regarding fee waiver denial, you may file an appeal to the NSA/CSS Freedom of Information Act Appeal Authority. The appeal

must be postmarked no later than 60 calendar days after the date of the initial denial. The appeal shall be in writing addressed to the NSA/CSS FOIA Appeal Authority (DC34), National Security Agency, 9800 Savage Road STE 6248, Fort George G. Meade, MD 20755-6248. The appeal shall reference the fee waiver denial and shall contain, in sufficient detail and particularity, the grounds upon which you believe waiver of fees is warranted. The NSA/CSS FOIA Appeal Authority will endeavor to respond to the appeal within 20 working days after receipt, absent any unusual circumstances.

We estimate that the duplication fees for this request will be approximately \$2,700.00. Fees are assessed in accordance with DoD Regulation 5400.7-R. Duplication fees are computed at \$0.15 per page. Our policy is to request advance payment prior to completing the processing of a FOIA request. Since this is only an estimate, if, as we process your request, we determine that duplication fees will be significantly greater than the estimate, we will notify you before continuing with our processing.

If you would like us to proceed with the processing of this request, we request that you remit to the FOIA office (see below for address) a check or money order made payable to the Treasurer of the United States in the amount of \$2,700.00. as follows:

Defense Exhibit 82 for Identification, which is not in evidence, consists of a group of highly accurate and reliable intelligence reports obtained by lawful and authorized intelligence collection methods at the request of LtCol North and at the direction of his supervisors. The reports are the result of an extensive use of intelligence assets devoted to following and reporting the Iranian initiative.

The reports generally range from two to several pages and are in chronological order commencing on September 1983 and ending in December 1986. There is no particular pattern of frequency of the reports, but the reports are frequent. These reports provide an accurate record of information obtained by various methods of surveillance.

These reports remain classified to the TOP SECRET CODEWORD level. Codeword is defined by the intelligence community as

highly sensitive and compartmented information that is distributed only to individuals who have a specific need to know this information. Individuals must have special clearances for this particular information. These reports also contain other restrictions to limit the dissemination of the information to a very small group of very senior government officials and their designated assistants.

The intelligence was able to be collected based in large part on information provided by LtCol North and provides information regarding the pricing and delivery of missiles and military material sold to Iran and the release of American hostages held in Lebanon. The reports show individuals involved, including General Secord. The reports contained information about pricing of this material and those recipients of the reports at the Central Intelligence Agency, National Security Council, and Department of Defense who knew the actual cost of this material to the DoD could have known the Iranians were being significantly overcharged. The reports of very late November and early December 1985 revealed that HAWK missiles were shipped to Iran from Israel in connection with hostage recovery efforts.

The documents are addressed exclusively for National Security Advisor Mr. McFarlane, Admiral John Poindexter, LtCol Oliver North, Director of Central Intelligence Mr. Casey, Deputy Director of Central Intelligence Mr. McMahon (later, Mr. Gates), Secretary of Defense Mr. Weinberger, Assistant to the Chairman of the Joint Chiefs of Staff Vice Admiral Moreau, Director of NSA General Odom, Messrs. Rich, Lord and six other senior intelligence officials. The reports were delivered by special courier to ensure that the information would be seen promptly by the addressees and only by those authorized to receive it.

This is a third interim response to your Freedom of Information Act (FOIA) request of 5 July 1995 for all records pertaining to the pre-publication review of *The Codebreakers* by David Kahn. A copy of your request is enclosed.

As we stated in our 18 December 2006 letter, you are considered a representative of an educational or noncommercial scientific institution. There are no search fees associated with this request; however, as an "Academic" requester you are responsible for duplication fees in excess of 100 pages unless you qualify for a fee waiver or reduction. Duplication fees are computed in accordance with DoD Regulation 5400.7-R and are assessed at \$.15 per page. Until the processing of your request has been completed, we are unable to determine the exact total of releasable pages. However, we do not anticipate total duplication fees to exceed \$45.00.

Your request for a waiver of fees has been denied. You may consider this an adverse determination, and you may submit an appeal to the appeal authority as indicated below. This decision was made in accordance with the provisions of the FOIA that permit an agency to waive or reduce fees if that agency determines that such an action would be in the public interest. In reaching this decision, several factors were examined: (1) whether the subject of the requested records concerns the operations or activities of the government; (2) whether the disclosure is likely to contribute significantly to an understanding of specific government operations or activities; (3) whether disclosure of the requested information will contribute to the understanding of the public at large, i.e., the general public must benefit from disclosure; and (4) whether you have a commercial interest the magnitude of which is sufficiently large, in comparison with the public interest in disclosure, that disclosure is "primarily" in your commercial interest.

The decision to deny your fee waiver request is based on Items (2) and (3). Since many of the responsive records have already been released in a previous FOIA request,



we do not believe that disclosure would contribute significantly to an understanding of government operations or activities when nothing new would be added to the public's understanding. Additionally, while we agree that you have an expertise in law, as evidenced by your position as a law school professor, your ability and intent to disseminate the information you seek will be limited to a small segment of the population only (law school students). The public at large, therefore, would not be the primary beneficiary of the disclosure, as intended by the Act.

Your request has been processed under the FOIA, and this further response provides additional documents responsive to your request. This second release of 124 pages, added to the original release of 61 pages, provides you with a total of 185 pages to date. Duplication fees for all pages released will be due when processing has been completed. If you would like us to continue with the processing of the remaining information responsive to your request, please provide to the FOIA office (see below for address) a statement regarding your willingness to pay all assessable duplication fees. Please include the number assigned to your case on any correspondence. If we do not hear from you within 60 days of the date of this letter, we will assume that you are no longer interested in pursuing the remainder of your request, and we will administratively close your case with no further processing.

Information has been deleted from the enclosures. Some of the information deleted from the documents was found to be currently and properly classified in accordance with Executive Order 12958, as amended. This information meets the criteria for classification as set forth in Subparagraphs (c), and (d) of Section 1.4 and remains classified TOP SECRET, SECRET and CONFIDENTIAL as provided in Section 1.2 of the Executive Order. The information is classified because its disclosure could reasonably be expected to cause exceptionally grave damage to the national security. The information is exempt from automatic declassification in accordance with Section 3.3 (b)(1, 6) of E.O. 12958, as amended. Because the information is currently and properly classified, it is exempt from disclosure pursuant to the first exemption of the FOIA (5 U.S.C. Section 552(b)(1)).

In addition, this Agency is authorized by various statutes to protect certain information concerning its activities. We have determined that such information exists in these documents. Accordingly, those portions are exempt from disclosure pursuant to the third exemption of the FOIA which provides for the withholding of information specifically protected from disclosure by statute. The specific statutes applicable in this case are Title 50 U.S. Code 403-1(i); and Section 6, Public Law 86-36 (50 U.S. Code 402 note).

There are some documents where information was redacted without code blocks. In those cases, we no longer have an original full text version, only a previously hand-redacted copy. Because we were unable to re-review information on those pages for potential release and are unable to determine the underlying text or exemption codes originally used, we have redacted them as they were originally provided to Mr. Kahn. Where original full text versions were available, the documents were carefully reviewed and additional information released to you when warranted. In those cases, redaction code blocks explain the redactions.

(U) Please note that DocID 3610961 is incomplete. DocID 3610973 contains the State Department version of a transcript of the Russian pilots involved in the incident, based on the audio recording of the incident. NSA has released its versions of this transcript, as well as the audio recording and is posting them to its FOIA webpage. DocID 3610973 includes shorthand notes on page 8. We were only able to interpret a small portion of the text, but from what we could see, it appears to have been a note added by the State Department. We have left this for your review to determine releasability. If you identify any NSA equities in this text, please return to NSA for review. 1. (U//~~FOUO~~) We received a FOIA request, dated 23 December 1993, from David Banisar, representing the Computer Professionals for Social Responsibility, for copies of all of the minutes of the National Security Telecommunications and Information Systems Security Committee (NSTISSC). The original request and relevant correspondence regarding this request are also enclosed (Enclosure A).
2. (U//~~FOUO~~) As you will see, the original request went to the Office of the Secretary of Defense who then referred requester to NSA and forwarded relevant correspondence to NSA. This correspondence was received in NSA on 18 February 1994. A search was made for the documents at that time within NSA. DDI found the responsive documents (Enclosure B) and forwarded them to the FOIA office. The case was then placed on the hard queue to wait its turn for processing. It has now arrived at the top of the queue and the responsive documents need to be reviewed for releasability by the NSA OPI. In addition, we request that IAD advise us regarding the need to coordinate these documents with all other agencies with an equity in this material. That would seem to be at least all participating members of the NSTISSC.
3. (U) A line-by-line review is required so that non-exempt portions of the documents can be released, while the exempt portions are protected. Please highlight or bracket (in a color other than yellow) those portions which remain classified, indicate the level of classification, and detail the impact that such a release would have on NSA's current mission.

4. (U) We ask that you provide us with a harm statement detailing the impact a release would have on NSA's current mission or on the national security.

5. (U) Material can be protected if it falls within one of nine categories of exempted information. The first exemption allows for the withholding of classified information. If the enclosures are properly marked, those portions will be protected. Therefore, we ask that you verify the classification of the material and re-mark any paragraphs which are not properly classified. If information is classified, it is are exempt from disclosure pursuant to the first exemption of the FOIA (5 U.S.C. Section 552(b)(1)).

6. (U) In addition, information can be protected under the third exemption of the FOIA which precludes the release of information protected by statute. The statute which may be applicable in this case is Section 6 of Public Law (P.L.) 86-36. P.L. 86- 36 protects, inter alia, functions and activities of NSA. In considering information which potentially falls within this category, the primary question is how closely related the information is to the central functions and activities of NSA. The closer the connection to sensitive NSA functions and activities, the stronger the justification for withholding under P.L. 86-36. This statute applies to classified and unclassified material. In addition, 18 U.S.C. Section 798 may be cited to protect against the release of classified communications security information.

7. (U) Another exemption which may apply to the enclosures is the fifth exemption. This exemption allows an agency to protect information which is deliberative and pre-decisional, if the release of such information would cause a foreseeable harm. For example, if the release of the information would hinder the flow of candid opinions or negatively impact the deliberative process, it may be protected.

8. (U) You may also find information contained within the enclosures which meets the protection criteria of the second exemption, which protects information the release of which would allow for the circumvention of the rules or practices of an agency. If the information would allow someone to bypass procedures set in place to ensure security of systems, for example, or the information would expose vulnerabilities, it may be protected.

9. (U) The FOIA requires that information which does not fall under an exemption be segregated from protected information and released. If there are unclassified portions within a document carrying an overall classification of TOP SECRET, for example, those portions must be released unless they fall within another exemption. In identifying information to be protected, please indicate the harm you believe would result if the information were released . Dear Mr. Kelly:

This is in response to your Freedom of Information Act (FOIA) request of 15 March 1994, for any files or information held on the Pan Am 103 bombing over Lockerbie, Scotland.

In your letter, you state that you are making the request in your capacity as a media representative but provide no information supporting your stated media status. In the absence of such support and since we have been unable to confirm your status as a media representative, we have categorized you as an "all other" requester for this request.

In processing your request, we will conduct an Agency-wide search of our files. We estimate that the manpower and computer costs involved in this search will be approximately \$5191.00. In accordance with DoD Regulation 5400.7-R, the manual search fee is computed at \$25.00 an hour. If you authorize us to proceed with this search, please be advised that 5 U.S.C. 552 (4) (A) (iv) (II) allows two hours of the search to be completed at no cost to you. Therefore, your estimated search cost will be \$5141.00. Our policy is to request advance payment prior to initiating the search. Be advised that NSA regulations and Department of Justice guidelines preclude the conducting of partial searches.

Please be advised that your agreeing to incur these fees will not necessarily result in the disclosure to you of any information. If records are found which are responsive to your request, a detailed review to determine the releasability of the information would follow. It has been our experience, that any records responsive to your request, if such records exist, most likely would be classified or otherwise exempt from release in accordance with the exemption provisions of the FOIA. The application of these exemptions to NSA information has been consistently approved by the Federal Judiciary.

We are, therefore, suspending the processing of your request pending receipt of your certified check or money order within 30 days made payable to the Treasurer of the United States in the amount of \$5141.00. In addition, you should be aware that this estimate is only for the fees associated with a search for documents responsive to your request. It does not include the

From 1989 to 1992, I was retained as associate producer and researcher by BBC for the documentary entitled "CIA" which aired in the United Kingdom and the United States (Arts & Entertainment) in 1992 to the educational benefit of the public. In 1992, I served as research specialist for the Observer Film and Television Ltd. for the critically-acclaimed documentary, "Operation Gladio" broadcast in the United Kingdom and the U.S. in 1992. In 1992, I served as associate producer and researcher for BBC and Impact Media Ltd. for the documentary entitled "Diamond Empire" which was broadcast on February 1, 1994 on the PBS program "Frontline." This was considered one of the first television program educating the public about the diamond industry. Also in 1992, I served as associate producer for an Australian Broadcast Corporation documentary about the U.S. presidential campaign for ABC's flagship program, "Four Corners." In 1993, I worked for IPTV producing a documentary for Channel 4 about the National Security Agency and economic intelligence which was broadcast in July 1993. I worked as associate producer on a similar program for Focus Film which aired on WDR/Cologne in September 1993. On Sept. 2, 1958, Russian MiG-17 pilots shot down an unarmed U. S. Air Force C130 transport aircraft that had inadvertently violated the Turkish-Soviet Armenian border in the vicinity of Kars, Turkey. The Aerial Reconnaissance Memorial in National Vigilance Park commemorates the lost of the seventeen crew members who paid the ultimate price in that Cold War shootdown incident.

This is a follow-up request for which I never received a final response. My previous request was dated Mar 19, 1996 and your "FOIA/PA Request Interim Response" indicated that your office received the request on Mar 28, 1996 and listed it as BACKLOG 403 and Case Number J9203-96.

Informally, I have been told that copies of the recorded conversations of the pilots and transcripts of the conversations in Russian still exist. Given the publicity that the Aerial Recon Memorial has brought to this incident, copies of the recording and transcript should be readily available

On Sept. 2, 1958, Russian fighter pilots shot down an unarmed U. S. Air Force C130 transport aircraft that had inadvertently violated the Turkish-Soviet Armenian border in the vicinity of Kars, Turkey. At the time, the Soviet Government denied that Russian pilots shot the plane down and claimed that the aircraft intentionally violated their sovereign borders and that the enemy aircraft 'fell' on its own, crashing in Soviet Armenia. Although there were 17 crew members aboard the American aircraft, the Soviet Government claimed to have recovered only 6 bodies from the crash site—the Soviets returned the six bodies to U. S. control on Sept. 24, 1958, but refused to acknowledge the existence of the other eleven crew members.

Having caught the Soviet Government in several bald-faced lies regarding the shooting down of the American aircraft and in an effort to force the Soviets to come clean about the incident, the U. S. State Department released to the public on Feb. 5, 1959 a recording and transcripts in English and Russian of the Russian pilots conversations during the pilots' attacks and downing of the '4-engined' transport.

With a thaw in American/Russian relations at the end of the Cold War, the Russians ultimately admitted that Russian pilots did in fact shoot down the C-130 aircraft, and provided some additional details regarding the incident.

I request that you provide me (a) one copy of the tape recording in Russian, (b) one copy in Russian of the transcript of the recording, and (c) one copy in English of the transcript of the recording of the Russian pilots' conversations. (I understand that those items were declassified in Feb. 1959 when the State Department provided the tape recording and transcripts to reporters at a press conference.) In addition, I request that you provide me a copy of any other declassified files in your possession regarding the shootdown and subsequent investigations of facts relevant to the shootdown.





I represent Linda Hunt. Ms. Hunt is an award-winning free-lance journalist and author with over fifteen years of professional experience as an investigative reporter. She has held management positions with three TV investigative news units. As Executive Producer of CNN'S I-Team, she supervised the reporting, writing and post production of reporters' series for the unit. She also originated and headed an investigative news unit for WNED-TV Buffalo, producing a weekly half-hour hard news documentary series. And, as Senior Producer, WPXI-TV Pittsburgh, she supervised post production and produced segments for a monthly investigative news magazine.

Ms. Hunt's other TV news experience includes Reporter for NBC News' Cleveland Bureau based at WKYC-TV; Reporter/Anchor for WNEM-TV Saginaw (Michigan) and WPTA-TV Fort Wayne (Indiana). The national magazine stories she has written include the award-winning "U.S. Cover-up of Nazi Scientists," Bulletin of the Atomic Scientists, (April 1985), and "The New KKK," Common Cause Magazine (December 1986). Her awards include the Investigative Reporters & Editors Award, 1986, for "U.S. Cover-up of Nazi Scientists;" the Bar Association national Media Awards for Documentaries, for "Battered Wives: Behind Closed Doors," 1978; two Freedom Foundation Awards for Documentaries, "When Johnny Comes Marching Home," 1979, and "Brave Victory," 1978. "Brave Victory" also won the Special Olympics National Media Award.

Ms. Hunt is currently Assistant Professor of Journalism, Pennsylvania State University. She has also taught journalism at American University, Central Michigan University, and Salisbury State College in Maryland.

Ms. Hunt is author of Secret Agenda (St. Martin's Press, 1991).

Pursuant to the Freedom of Information Act, 5 U.S.C. § 552 et seq., Ms. Hunt requests all records on or pertaining to Oliver Lawrence North. According to Guts and Glory: The Rise and Fall of Oliver North, by Ben Bradlee, Jr., Mr. North was born in San Antonio, Texas, on October 7, 1943.

Pursuant to 5 U.S.C § 552(a)(3), Ms. Hunt requests a waiver of all search fees and copying costs.

On the facts, set forth above, Ms. Hunt is clearly a "representative of the news media" and cannot be charged searched fees under the FOIA. See 5 U.S.C. § 552(a)(3)(A)(II); See National Security Archive v. Department of Defense, 881 F.2d 1381, 1387 (D.C.Cir.1989) (a representative of the news media" is "a person or entity that gathers information of potential interest to a segment of the public, uses its editorial skills to turn the raw material into a distinct work, and distributes that work to an audience."

Ms. Hunt also requests a waiver of all copying costs pursuant to 5 U.S.C. § 552(a)(4)(A)(iii). The information requested is likely to contribute significantly to the understanding of the operations or activities of the government and is not primarily in her commercial interest. This information will shed light on the official activities of Oliver North while he was a government employee. Because Mr. North plans to campaign for the Republican senatorial nomination and to run for election as Senator from the State of Virginia next fall, there is a very strong public interest in information that will shed any light on his fitness to hold public office.


Because the selection of the Republican candidate for Senator will occur in June of this year, it is essential that this request be expedited. In keeping with the primary purpose of the Freedom of Information Act to assure that voters will be fully informed about the choices they must make, the information requested by Ms. Hunt must be received well before the election date so that it may be disseminated to the electorate.

In this regard, if there is to be any delay in processing this request, please supply the readily available 201 file on Mr. North before proceeding to process the other items of this request.

As you know, the fee waiver provision was amended in 1986 so that it would be even more liberally applied than before. The legislative history shows that the sponsors of the amendment intended waivers to be freely granted to all but commercial requesters: "It is important to reaffirm that fee waivers play a substantial role in the effective use of the FOIA, and they should be liberally granted to all requesters other than those who are commercial requesters." 132 Cong. Rec. S.14298 (daily ed. Sept. 30, 1986) (remarks of Sen. Leahy) (emphasis added). My client is not a

commercial requester as that term is used in the FOIA. See National Security Archive, supra, 881 F.2d at 1387-1388.

I request that you provide me the information that I describe herein in accordance with my rights to receive said information under the Freedom of Information Act. A description of the information that I am requesting follows.

On Sept. 2, 1958, Russian fighter pilots shot down an unarmed U. S. Air Force C130 transport aircraft that had inadvertently violated the Turkish-Soviet Armenian border in the vicinity of Kars, Turkey. At the time, the Soviet Government denied that Russian pilots shot the plane down and claimed that the aircraft intentionally violated their sovereign borders and that the enemy aircraft 'fell' on its own, crashing in Soviet Armenia. Although there were 17 crew members aboard the American aircraft, the Soviet Government claimed to have recovered only 6 bodies from the crash site—the Soviets returned the six bodies to U. S. control on Sept. 24, 1958, but refused to acknowledge the existence of the other eleven crew members.

Having caught the Soviet Government in several bald-faced lies regarding the shooting down of the American aircraft and in an effort to force the Soviets to come clean about the incident, the U. S. State Department released to the public on Feb. 5, 1959 a recording and transcripts in English and Russian of the Russian pilots conversations during the pilots' attacks and downing of the '4-engined' transport.

With a thaw in American/Russian relations at the end of the Cold War, the Russians ultimately admitted that Russian pilots did in fact shoot down the C-130 aircraft, and provided some additional details regarding the incident.

I request that you provide me (a) one copy of the tape recording in Russian, (b) one copy in Russian of the transcript of the recording, and (c) one copy in English of the transcript of the recording of the Russian pilots' conversations. (I understand that those items were declassified in Feb. 1959 when the State Department provided the tape recording and transcripts to reporters at a press conference.) In addition, I request that you provide me a copy of any other declassified files in your possession regarding the shootdown and subsequent investigations of facts relevant to the shootdown.

I understand that the Government may charge a nominal fee to reproduce and send the requested materials to me, and I agree to pay those fees. Please bill me accordingly.

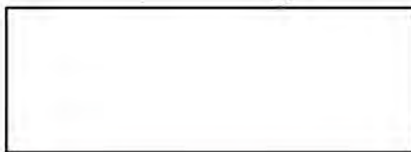

This responds to your December 23, 1993, Freedom of Information Act (FOIA) request concerning National Security Telecommunications and Information Systems Security Committee meeting minutes. Your letter, addressed to Ms. Nadine Dulacki, Office of the Inspector General, was referred to this Directorate. We received your letter on January 11.

(U) DJP4 is processing three FOIA requests for information on the Soviet Shootdown of a US C-130 intelligence collection aircraft over Soviet Armenia on 2 September 1958. This is an historic event of general interest because of the controversy surrounding the incident (the Soviets denied shooting down the aircraft until this incident was re-visited years later) and the fact that the bodies of eleven airmen were never recovered. The 50<sup>th</sup> anniversary of this incident was commemorated on 2 September 2008 with a ceremony at the site of the replica of this C-130 aircraft at the National Vigilance Park.

~~(TS//SI//REL)~~ We propose the following precedent-setting releases: Redacted SIGINT product reports from the time of the incident, including four unique versions of the transcripts of the MIG Pilot conversations in Russian and English, collected Soviet tracking of the US aircraft that was shot down, summaries analyzing both the general activity related to this event and the Soviet tracking; and a CD prepared from the original audio recordings of the Soviet MIG pilot conversations before, during, and immediately after the shootdown. We plan to release a total of 18 documents and the CD at this time.

(U) This is not the first time that the intercept of this Soviet activity has been acknowledged, as the tape of the Soviet MIG audio was played before the UN in 1958 as part of the diplomatic protest of this activity. In addition, there have been numerous press accounts of the incident and unclassified summaries are included on the Cryptologic Museum web site.

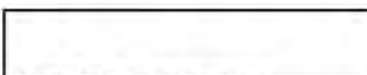

This letter is in response to your Freedom of Information Act (FOIA) request dated 4 March 1994 in behalf of Ms. Linda Hunt for all records this Agency maintains on Oliver Laurence North. Please be advised that a FOIA request may be expedited whenever it is demonstrated that (1) an individual's life or personal safety would be jeopardized by failure to process a request immediately; (2) the substantial due process rights of the requester would be impaired by the failure to process the request immediately and the information sought is not otherwise available; and (3) other narrowly construed exceptional circumstances exist. The fact that Mr. North plans to campaign for an upcoming senatorial nomination does not meet the criteria set forth above and, because of the volume of records, it is not considered an easy case.

As we notified you by our interim response postcard, 432 cases were received by this Agency prior to yours. In fairness to all requesters, cases are handled on a first-in, first-out easy-hard basis. As our postcard explains, the complexity, volume, and sensitivity of the records, as well as the potential need to consult with other agencies, will affect the amount of time it takes to respond to requesters. Your case remains in queue and will be processed in order. We encourage you to be patient regarding the processing of your FOIA request.

Because our denial to expedite your request may be considered by you to be an adverse determination, you are hereby advised of this Agency's appeal procedures. Any person denied access to information may, within 60 days after notification of the denial, file an appeal to the NSA/CSS Freedom of Information Act Appeal Authority. The appeal shall be in writing addressed to the NSA/CSS FOIA Appeal Authority, National Security Agency, Fort George G. Meade, MD 20755-6000. The appeal shall reference the initial denial to expedite your request and shall contain, in sufficient detail and particularity, the grounds upon

which you believe your request meets the criteria for expediting requests as stated above. The NSA/CSS Appeal Authority will respond to the appeal within 20 working days after receipt.
