The arts and cultural community welcomes the opportunity to communicate with President-Elect Obama and his staff in re-imagining how the federal government can inspire and support creativity in communities nationwide through robust policies that advance participation in the arts for all Americans.

The following policy recommendations have been developed by the national associations listed above, whose memberships comprise thousands of American cultural institutions and artists as well as state and local government arts agencies. We speak as a collective voice for our members, who make enormous artistic, educational, and economic contributions to the well-being of the nation and its communities.

President-Elect Obama's platform in support of the arts acknowledges the importance of American creativity and addresses a range of key federal policy areas that can be strengthened in the new Administration. We whole-heartedly affirm his goals of boosting support for arts education, improving cultural exchange and the U.S. visa process for foreign guest artists, mobilizing an ArtistCorps, increasing funding for the National Endowment for the Arts (NEA), providing health care for artists, and advancing fair tax policies for the arts. As you are aware, Federal policies affect the arts across a broad swath of issue areas involving many agencies, including the NEA, National Endowment for the Humanities, and Institute of Museum and Library Services, as well as the Departments of State, Interior, Treasury, Education, Transportation, Homeland Security, the Internal Revenue Service, and the Corporation for National and Community Service.

For many years, however, federal policy towards the arts has been fragmented and uncoordinated, lacking coherence and occasionally at cross-purposes with itself. To complement President-Elect Obama's current arts platform, the following recommendations in several key areas address, in varying degrees of detail, ways in which federal leadership can amplify the capacity of the arts to help our nation meet its goals of increased prosperity, international diplomacy, and community vitality. We ask above all that the new Administration approach arts policy holistically. To that end, one of our recommendations is that it appoint a senior-level official in the White House itself. We also urge a more coherent presence for the arts within the various agencies and the opportunity for the arts to be included in forthcoming economic stimulus programs.

We hope that the Office of Presidential Transition will find these recommendations useful as it assembles the new team, and we would be glad to discuss any of them in further detail.

## **National Endowment for the Arts**

## **Background**

It is the mission of the National Endowment for the Arts (NEA) to foster the excellence, diversity, and vitality of the arts in the United States and to broaden public access to the arts. The NEA must provide support for building the capacity of American arts organizations and artists to create and share their work, by initiating national programs, partnering effectively with state and local arts agencies, and helping to ensure lifelong learning in the arts for every American. We urge the Administration to empower the National Endowment for the Arts with the authority and resources to broaden and deepen participation in the arts throughout the United States.

## **Policy Recommendations**

Support a National Endowment for the Arts with the resources to provide national leadership.

- Create a capacity-building initiative to support artistic excellence, improve organizational financial structures, develop a national cultural arts infrastructure, and broaden participation by all Americans.
- Support arts education by engaging educators, artists, and arts organizations in extending the experience in arts education through lifelong learning, and collaborating with the U.S. Department of Education to advance the federal role in K-12 arts education.
- Make flexible grants that increase the capacity of American arts organizations and artists to create and present meaningful arts experiences for Americans, recognizing the value of establishing fellowships to individual artists, providing grants for multi-year support, and permitting arts service organizations the opportunity to regrant funds.
- Increase the NEA budget to \$319.2 million, the FY 1992 peak budget level of \$176 million adjusted for inflation and population as a step toward providing a more appropriate level of artistic benefits to the American people.

Support a National Endowment for the Arts with the **capacity** to provide national leadership.

- Expand the research capacity of the NEA and the federal commitment to initiating research issues in the arts and cultural policy.
- Involve close consultation with artists, arts organizations, and the communities they serve in developing and advancing new programs and initiatives at the NEA as well as enhancing existing programs.
- Enhance support and technical assistance to the field through such means as instituting site visits and technical assistance grant support, and serving as a convener for policy panels.
- Nurture collaboration around goals shared by not-for-profit arts organizations and the commercial arts sector.
- Strengthen the National Council on the Arts through appointments broadly representative of artistic disciplines and concerns, geographically diverse, and characterizing the multiple and collective cultural interests of all Americans, and create a stronger forum for expanding the presence of and access to the arts in this country.

## Cultural Exchange

## **Background**

International cultural exchange in the performing, visual, literary, and folk arts is a valuable tool for addressing U.S. diplomatic goals, strengthening our country's international relations, and enriching the skills of our artists. The shared experience, which transcends any language gap, can bring together people of different backgrounds, allowing cultural exchange to serve as a tool for diplomatic efforts. By reinforcing the commonalities among cultures and illuminating our unique differences, cultural exchanges foster understanding and, at a time when the U.S. image abroad is in dire need of improvement, investing in cultural exchange is essential.

Artists make powerful and effective ambassadors, and their skills have the profound ability to inspire both at home and abroad. Just as it is important to send American artists abroad, there is tremendous value in helping foreign artists share their talents with American audiences. Cultural exchange results in a more vibrant U.S. cultural scene and as artists experience and share their creative products, a broadening of their creative skills takes place. Additionally, cultural exchange serves to expand the development of international trade relations.

## **Policy Recommendations**

- Strengthen support for cultural policy among senior leadership at the Department of State and increase federal funding for cultural exchange programs. Leadership should provide greater staffing and funding resources to facilitate cultural exchange opportunities and raise the public visibility of federal support. Likewise, create a dedicated position within the Domestic Policy Council to focus on international cultural policy, which would allow cultural exchange to have a broader focus beyond the availability of program funding. By the joint effort of these leadership positions, cultural exchange could enter and enhance national and international policy discussions.
- Encourage increased public/private partnerships to maximize resources used for the promotion of cultural exchange. Opening avenues to funding from multiple sources creates new opportunities to participate in cultural exchange and subsidized touring. Furthermore, public/private partnerships may enable participation in multi-year, sustainable exchange programs.
- Expand Americans' access to the cultures of the world through an increase in support for translations (fiction, poetry, drama, and books about the performing and visual arts).
- Improve the U.S. visa and tax procedures for foreign guest artists, which are burdensome and prohibitive. Welcoming foreign artists to perform in the United States provides Americans the opportunity to experience a diversity of artistic talent and encourages a supportive climate for U.S. artists abroad.

# Arts Education in School, Work, and Life

## **Background**

In order to respond to the changing climate of global competitiveness, demographic shifts, and economic disparity, major changes to the delivery of education to our nation's children are inevitable. As our nation contemplates these changes, and prepares students to be global citizens, the federal commitment to arts education must be strengthened so that the arts are implemented as a part of the core curriculum of our schools and are integral to every child's development. The recommendations below are consistent with President-Elect Obama's public statements and proposals in support of a comprehensive arts education for every student.

## When needed most, the arts are being cut from our schools.

- The arts are uniquely able to boost learning and achievement for young children, students from economically disadvantaged circumstances, and students needing remedial instruction.
- A 2007 study from the Center on Education Policy has found that, since the enactment of NCLB, 30% of districts with at least one school identified as needing improvement have decreased instruction time for arts and music. These are the districts whose students are most responsive to the benefits of the arts, as demonstrated through numerous research studies.

# The public, business leaders, and economic experts agree that the arts are essential to a complete education and preparing a 21<sup>st</sup> century workforce.

- According to the Conference Board, there is overwhelming consensus from superintendents (98%) and corporate leaders (96%) that "creativity is of increasing importance to the U.S. workforce." Of those corporate respondents looking for creative people, 85% said they were having difficulty finding qualified applicants with the creative characteristics they desired.
- The New Commission on the Skills of the American Workforce, in its report *Tough Choices or Tough Times* (2006) states, "It is a world in which comfort with ideas and abstractions is the passport to a good job, in which creativity and innovation are the key to the good life…"
- A Lake Research poll of 1,000 likely voters revealed that, "83% of voters believe that a greater focus on the arts alongside science, technology, and math would better prepare students to address the demands of the 21<sup>st</sup> century."

## **Policy Recommendations**

## Prevent economic status and geographic location from denying students a comprehensive arts education.

- Ensure equitable access to the full benefits of arts education when reauthorizing the Elementary and Secondary Education Act so that all, not just some, students can learn to their full potential.
- Exercise leadership to encourage arts-based and other creative learning environments for academically atrisk students participating in Title I-funded programs.
- Retain the arts in the definition of core academic subjects of learning and reauthorize the Arts in Education Programs of the U.S. Department of Education.
- Fund after-school arts learning opportunities and support arts education partnerships between schools and community arts and cultural organizations.

# Move federal policy beyond simply declaring the arts as a core academic subject to actually implementing arts education as an essential subject of learning.

- Require states to issue annual public reports on the local status and condition of arts education and other core academic subjects.
- Improve national data collection and research in arts education.
- Invest in professional development opportunities for teachers in the arts.

### Deploy arts education as an economic development strategy.

- Authorize and encourage inclusion of arts learning in STEM (science, technology, engineering, and mathematics) initiatives in order to foster imagination and innovation. Without the arts, STEM falls short of its potential to advance education and workforce development.
- Fully preparing students with the creative skills they will need to advance our nation's position in the 21<sup>st</sup> century global economy requires implementing the arts as a core subject of learning and ensuring that all students attain cultural literacy.
- Ensure that the full range of federal initiatives that advance workforce development, such as Department of Labor programs, provide training in the skills of creativity and imagination.

## National Service and the Arts

## Background

The Corporation for National and Community Service (CNS) works to fill various unmet needs, from education and housing to healthcare and community development. The arts bring individuals of all ages together, increase communication across cultural and ethnic boundaries, strengthen public education, and bring joy and entertainment to millions of Americans. Together, National Service and the arts create a powerful force, demonstrating the ability for Americans to take initiative, tap into their creative forces, and work together to address a broad array of unmet needs in our country.

The arts have a successful record of partnering with the Corporation for National and Community Service. AmeriCorps members have helped to build and administer summer arts camps in rural communities, designed and painted murals in low-income city districts, and strengthened programming at local arts councils. Learn and Serve America has partnered with arts organizations to strengthen arts education and community service education in the public schools in Florida and RSVP (Retired Senior Volunteer Program) members, under the SeniorCorps Program, have toured Delaware teaching art and music to children in after-school activities.

Additionally, a study issued by the National Endowment for the Arts in 2006, "*The Arts and Civic Engagement: Involved in Arts, Involved in Life,*" found that individuals who participate in the arts are more likely to volunteer in their communities and engage in positive civic activities.

A stronger, more clearly defined relationship between the arts and national service will enable our country to more effectively meet community needs in education, community understanding, and economic development while allowing millions of people to enjoy and participate in the arts.

## **Policy Recommendations**

The Corporation for National and Community Service oversees three large programs: AmeriCorps, Learn and Serve America, and SeniorCorps. Arts organizations and art-related projects have a proven record of filling unmet community needs through AmeriCorps, Learn and Serve America, and SeniorCorps.

- To strengthen the relationship between the three CNS core programs, arts organizations, and individual artists, it is recommended that CNS give specific reference to community arts projects and not-for-profit cultural organizations in the list of eligible national service programs as detailed in the National and Community Service Trust Act.
- Further, CNS should create, within the Special Initiatives Program, a recognition program for a successful community arts project with a noticeable impact on unmet needs.

# Expand and strengthen national service initiatives at senior administration levels, above and beyond the Corporation for National and Community Service.

- Establish a "Volunteer Generation Fund" to help not-for-profit organizations recruit and manage more CNS volunteers.
- Establish a Commission to study and improve how the federal government, not-for-profits, and the private sector can work together to meet national challenges effectively.
- Establish a network of "Community Solution Funds," venture capital funds for the not-for-profit sector to support innovation in the sector.

CNS should seek to develop a fourth program branch to be known as the ArtistCorps, to connect artists, not-for-profit arts organizations, volunteers, and CNS resources with communities across the country to fulfill unmet needs in education, community development, economic activity, and culturally diverse communities. To assist with this recommendation, it is suggested that CNS:

- Include the word, "cultural," as a primary need in the National and Community Service Act.
- Partner with private initiatives in the visual, performing, literary, and folk and traditional arts, such as the Music National Service Initiative (www.musicnationalservice.org), which brings the skills of professional musicians to supplement music education in the public schools and provide lifelong learning opportunities for all ages.

# Appoint Senior-Level Administration Official to Coordinate Arts and Cultural Policy

#### **Background**

Policy issues relating to the arts and culture have reached a level of diversity and complexity where the National Endowment for the Arts' grant-making and leadership role alone cannot sufficiently address our nation's cultural policies. The enormous potential to integrate the creative economy, technology issues, changing demographics, and workforce development into policy through the federal government will require leadership directly from the White House.

There are various federal agencies that maintain programs relating to the arts: service at Corporation for National Service, international exchange at the State Department, and arts education at the U.S. Department of Education to name a few. Beyond these examples, there is greater opportunity to bundle together a portfolio that would provide leadership in economic development opportunities at the U.S. Department of Commerce, intellectual property issues, and other arts-related areas.

Current policy advisory groups similar to our recommendations exist, providing helpful guidance in how to construct the best fit:

- The President's Committee on the Arts and the Humanities is an advisory committee traditionally led by the First Lady that makes recommendations for awards and participates in diplomatic activities relating to international cultural events; however, this committee is outside the direct policy work developed by the President's staff.
- The Office of Science and Technology Policy (OSTP), in the Executive Office of the President provides a good example of policy work within the White House, led by a director with an Assistant to the President rank.

#### **Policy Recommendations**

- The President should name a senior-level administration official in the Executive Office to coordinate arts and cultural policy, guiding initiatives from federal agencies responsible for tourism, education, economic development, cultural exchange, intellectual property policy, broadband access, and other arts-related areas.
- This new Administration official or office would help to supply critical information for those exercising the "bully pulpit" of the White House, such as the President, the First Lady, and other top leadership figures. The bully pulpit could be used to encourage philanthropy and promote support of the arts and artists. It could further the search for model approaches that allow the arts to contribute to the economy and ensure that the American people's access to artistic work is not limited by systemic choke points. Finally, it could urge all Americans to learn and engage personally in the arts.

# The Role of the Arts in the Not-for-Profit Community

#### **Background**

Unique in the world in its size and scope, America's not-for-profit sector provides a multitude of services that in most other nations are delivered by government agencies. From health care to social services to arts and culture, American not-for-profit organizations enrich lives in communities large and small nationwide. Acknowledged to be more efficient and flexible than the government and more service-focused than the corporate sector, not-for-profit organizations rely on contributions and volunteers, with individual citizens choosing where and when to donate their funds and services.

A large percentage of the cultural institutions in this country are not-for-profit, charitable organizations with a mission of service. This service comes in many forms, nourishing the imagination, providing emotional solace in times of need; educating children, teachers, and lifelong learners; and strengthening communities. As one leader has said, our institutions "reflect creativity, history, culture, ideas, innovation, exploration, discovery, diversity, freedom of expression, and the ideals of democracy." They also include millions of people in a host of capacities, including artists, scholars, administrators, technicians, carpenters, accountants, and many more.

Not-for-profit arts organizations protect and add to America's cultural heritage, making it accessible to all through exhibitions, performances, and online programming. These organizations give Americans access to the best of the past and present, providing inspiration, education, and entertainment. In presenting cultural heritage, they are governed by a commitment to their mission: excellence, integrity, and transparency. Historically, these institutions have relied on the generosity of donors and volunteers, with a very small percentage of funding coming from governmental or corporate sponsors. Ticket sales and admission fees alone do not come close to subsidizing the artistic presentations, educational offerings, and community-based programming of not-for-profit arts organizations. A significant percentage of direct financial support for non-for-profit arts organizations is derived from charitable giving, and without this support, the ability of these organizations to serve the public would be significantly diminished. Diverse types of charitable giving provide support for arts organizations of all sizes: individual contributions; planned giving; family, business, and corporate foundation grants; in-kind contributions; and gifts of property. There are no profits or shareholders, therefore income is put back into service to the community.

#### **Policy Recommendations**

Ensure that the fundamental characteristics of federal support for the not-for-profit community, which have built an unrivalled cultural sector that is the envy of the world, not only remain in place but are strengthened for the future.

- Any mission-related income is exempt from federal tax, as is any endowment income.
- Real property is exempt from property tax.
- Charitable contributions should be fully tax-deductible.
- Governance is by a board of volunteers.
- Contributions of their own work by artists and writers should be tax deductible, as provided by the Artist-Museum Partnership Act (cosponsored by Senator Obama on February 25, 2008). The new Administration could include this as a provision in their budget proposal next year.



The National Day of Service and Remembrance was created by the Edward M.



#### The Arts and Social Change: The United We Serve Opportunity

Community service will be one of the hallmarks of the Obama Administration. This commitment began in earnest on June 22, with the launch of the United We Serve campaign. The Administration is calling on all Americans to find ways to improve their communities and help people less fortunate than themselves. The initial summer of service (June 22 through September 11) will be followed by other "seasons of service," making this a year-round and Administration-long initiative.

The initiative is catalyzed by the White House, but it is intended to become a self-organizing movement. Different sectors will have distinctive approaches to this call to action. In the arts, national arts service organizations are distributing information about United We Serve to their members, and the National Endowment for the Arts is encouraging trade associations, artists and others to think creatively about how they can boost volunteerism and service.

This is an unprecedented opportunity for the artists and arts organizations whose artistic practice focuses on community organizing and social change. Community service is embedded in all aspects of the work of these artists and organizations, and they possess deep knowledge about how best to use the arts and culture to catalyze community change, particularly in low-income contexts. These artists and organizations know first-hand how the arts animate and empower individuals and groups, and contribute to other important dimensions of community life – education, health care, economic development, housing and the built environment, to name a few.

The Obama Administration has already recognized the special power of this kind of artistic activism. On May 12, the White House sponsored a briefing on Art, Community, Social Justice, and National Recovery, which involved more than 60 artists and creative organizers engaged in civic participation, community development, green jobs, youth activism, and related enterprises. White House staffers repeatedly solicited this field's participation in United We Serve.

Those who attended the White House briefing represent the vast network of people and organizations similarly dedicated to using the arts as a catalyst for greater equity and progressive change. This diverse and dynamic network includes Hip Hop organizers; green designers; performing, visual and media artists; social entrepreneurs; and thousands of other creative people working in both nonprofit and commercial contexts to improve American communities.

Mobilizing this national network in the context of United We Serve could have multiple important long-term impacts, including:

- 1. Elevating the visibility of artists and organizations working for community change and recognizing this sector's significant role in addressing the needs of diverse communities;
- 2. Attracting other people and financial resources to support the work of art and social change;
- 3. Highlighting best practices in using the arts for community empowerment, social justice and progressive change;
- 4. Improving coordination among organizations working in this realm;
- 5. Laying the groundwork for the arts and social change sector's ongoing participation in the Administration's multi-year community service campaign;

6. Integrating artists and community-based arts programs into the work of the Corporation for National and Community Service as well as other important centers of policy development and change, including the White House Office of Engagement and the Office of Social Innovation, thereby enabling artists and arts activists to become valued resources for the Administration on an array of policy issues.

The arts and social change sector is large, growing rapidly, and active in all parts of the country. But it is a grassroots movement, decentralized and poorly funded. To effectively mobilize this field as part of the United We Serve campaign will take an extra measure of community organizing and some seed financing. A leadership group from the field has come together to catalyze this mobilization, and seek initial funding for this work.

Our plan has three major components:

- 1. Developing a Coalition and Working Advisory Committee a leadership group will oversee and advise the project. This leadership group will establish a coalition of art and social change enterprises interested in connecting to the United We Serve initiative. The coalition will provide a platform and organizing body for efforts associated with this summer's efforts and for future work of mutual interest.
- 2. Organizing and Implementing a mobilization an experienced grassroots organizer will be hired to implement activities this summer and plan for the future. Components of this assignment include:
  - a. Promoting the United We Serve concept among leading practitioners of art and social change, and connecting their efforts.
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  - e. Identifying a communications firm or press representative to develop and execute a media strategy
- 3. Developing Long-term Partnerships coordinating efforts with Corporation for National and Community Service, national and regional arts service organizations and networks, social change networks engaging the arts, the National Endowment for the Arts and trade associations on activities associated with United We Serve this summer, and relevant Administration priorities.
- 4. Assessment and Planning reviewing the impact of various components of this initial organizing effort, refining strategies, and laying the groundwork for participation in subsequent Administration-initiated community service and community development efforts.

We are seeking \$150,000 to support this activity between June and February 2010. This will cover costs of personnel, publicists, website design and operation, and related administrative

costs. Leveraging Investments in Creativity (LINC) will serve as the fiscal umbrella for the project.

# CREATIVE ECONOMY TALKING POINTS FOR DCCAH DISCUSSION, July 1

Hard to say when the creative economy movement began.

- Arts organizations, especially local arts organizations have been doing this kind of community development, economic impact, and cultural tourism work that the term "creative economy" entails for decades.
- But the term came into more common parlance around 2000, especially with **Richard Florida**'s 2002 book, *The Rise of the Creative Class: And How It's Transforming Work*, *Leisure, Community and Everyday Life.*
- For NEA, the April 2002 conference developed in partnership with the Appalacian Regional Commission titled **Building Creative Economies: The Arts, Entrepeneurship, and Sustainable Development in Appalacia**.

### Definition of "creative economy"

- Developed from a need for greater creativity and innovation in the workforce.
- Involves traditional economic benefits, community revitalization, sustainable development, tourism, cross-sector partnerships, and civic engagement.

Some statistics.

- From Americans for the Arts. "Nationally, there are 686,076 businesses in the U.S. involved in the creation or distribution of the arts. They employ 2.8 million people, representing 4.20 percent of all businesses and 2.04 percent of all employees, respectively. These data are current as of January 2009."
- According to the U.S. Small Business Administration, any organization with average annual revenues of less than \$7 million qualifies as a small business. More than one in three full-time artists -- nearly 690,000 workers -- is self-employed, compared with less than 10 percent of the labor force. Cleary, artists are entrepreneurs and sole proprietors, the very definition of small business.

Some recent publications. Hope you've all seen

- The NEA's study *Artists in the Workforce* (June 2008), there are two million trained, entrepreneurial working artists across the country that are assets to their communities. Representing 1.4 percent of the U.S. labor force, artists constitute a sizeable class of workers -- only slightly smaller than the total number of active-duty and reserve personnel in the U.S. military (2.2 million).
- A 2008 study released by the National Governors Association titled *Arts & the Economy: Using Arts and Culture to Stimulate State Economic Development* states, " Arts and culture-related industries, also known as 'creative industries,' provide direct economic benefits to states and communities: They create jobs, attract investments, generate tax revenues, and stimulate local economies through tourism and consumer purchases."

Many successful creative economy projects taking place across the country. To cite two;

#### Maine

- After the 2002 election, the newly- elected Governor John Baldaci cited the creative industry as a driving force in the state's economy and convened the 2004 Blaine House conference to rally public support. After the conference, the governor was instrumental in forming the Creative Economy Council to offer guidance on developing creative economy projects.
- In March 2006, the Council released two publications; *Maine's Creative Economy Connecting Creativity, Commerce and Community*, featuring recommendations for strengthening Maine's grassroots creative industries and creative workforce, and *Maine's Creative Economy Handbook*, a practical guide for communities and leaders interested in building creative commerce.

#### Washington State

- In 2003, the Washington State Arts Commission and a group of cultural leaders met to explore how Washington's creative sector could measure its contributions to both the state and local economies.
- The group came up with the Creative Vitality Index, an annual measure of the health of Washington's arts-related creative economy that includes both nonprofit and commercial activity and incorporates statistics around community arts participation and arts-related occupations.

### **Opening for talking about United We Serve**

In addition to the economic perspective, creative economies encompass quality of life factors such as the degree of civic engagement.





### All for Good Tip Sheet

### How does search ranking work on All for Good?

We are constantly tweaking the search algorithm, but the ranking currently works like this:

- We favor nearby locations over locationless listings, and locationless listings over far away ones. Yes, you can give us both a locationless and location version of the "same" listing, if that's appropriate. It's also fine to send us nationwide listings for each location.
- We favor listings whose start date is near in the future (one hour to one week), penalize listings that are further in the future, and (by default) don't show listings ending in the past.
- We favor listings with exact keyword matches over less exact matches, much like a common web search.
- We favor listings whose titles and descriptions seem to be higher quality, as judged by a variety of signals. We're not secretive like commercial search engines, but the reality is that query independent ranking algorithms change a lot faster than this document will.
- To avoid gaming, we don't directly incorporate the number of "likes," clicks, etc.
- As it becomes a problem, we will penalize people who game the system: in plain terms, as a provider you should worry about the basic things like getting your data into the system, making sure it matches on the keywords, locations and dates are correct, etc.
- Remember that listings are basically "ads" trying to recruit volunteers-- make them fun, approachable, targeted/specific and credible. Try to imagine why the 'perfect person' would want to volunteer for your activity, e.g. community involvement, skills/resume building, meeting people and making friends.

### What is the most effective way to use geography?

Your listing will appear in more searches if you include City, State and Zip Code.

## How do you use keywords? Should I reference the list of suggested search terms (below the search box) to adapt my listing?

The search function matches exact words. If you think your opportunity should appear when a user searches "housing", be sure to include "housing" in your description. Feel free to list a series of relevant keywords at the bottom of your entry if they don't otherwise appear in the description.

Please do not 'adapt' your listing to the suggested keywords unless they're actually appropriate-we consider this a form of hostile spam/SEO and will penalize your listings (including your other listings, i.e. we'll penalize attackers enough to discourage experimentation).

### How can I increase the number of people who see my listings?

Hands down, the most effective trick is to "grab" our gadget, modify it to favor your town or your listings (by keyword), then re-distribute this gadget on webpages, blogs, etc. For example, you can ask your local newspaper to put the gadget on their website.

## I'm still having problems -- I don't think my organization's listings are showing up. What can I do?

There are a lot of reasons that one or two particular listings might not be showing up. If you're worried about your feed, check for a number of different opportunities, using different search terms, in different locations across the country. Remember these tips too:

- Add locations (state, cities, and zip codes) to your opportunities.
- Add relevant keywords (see above though for what not to do with regards to keywords).
- If you believe your feed has been submitted and you're still having problems with a number of opportunities in different geographic locations, please e-mail <u>provider-support@allforgood.org</u>. In your e-mail, please be as specific as possible and include URL addresses of the opportunities, screenshots, and/or the search terms you used to look for the opportunities, as well as a brief description of the problem. We will monitor this e-mail address regularly and try to respond to as many of the e-mails as we can within 48 hours.
- Once you submit or update a feed, changes in it will not be reflected for 24-36 hours so please wait for that time period to pass before e-mailing us.

### **OPM Guidelines on Employee Volunteering**

### Guidance on Scheduling Work and Granting Time Off to Permit Federal Employees to Participate in Volunteer Activities

The Office of Personnel Management (OPM) has prepared the following guidance to support the efforts of departments and agencies to encourage employee participation in volunteer activities. Departments and agencies should also review any applicable regulations or policies and collective bargaining agreements before making determinations on these matters.

### SCHEDULING WORK AND TIME OFF

GENERAL. The Federal personnel system provides departments and agencies with considerable flexibility in scheduling hours of work and time off. Departments and agencies are encouraged to make appropriate use of this flexibility in responding to requests for changes in work schedules or time off to allow employees to engage in volunteer activities, while giving due consideration to the effect of the employee=s absence or change in duty schedule on work operations and productivity.

ALTERNATIVE WORK SCHEDULES. Departments and agencies have the flexibility to approve a variety of work arrangements for employees seeking to engage in volunteer activities during normal work hours.

Alternative Work Schedules (AWS) -- Flexible or compressed work schedules may be established for employees who wish to engage in volunteer activities during normal working hours. Employees represented by an exclusively-recognized union may participate in a flexible or compressed work schedule only to the extent expressly provided under a collective bargaining agreement between the agency and the exclusive representative.@ (See 5 U.S.C. 6130(a)(2).) To review the extent to which AWS programs have already been applied, departments and agencies should review their internal AWS policies and practices and collective bargaining agreements. To determine how additional AWS flexibilities may be implemented, departments and agencies may also consult subchapter II of chapter 61 of title 5, United States Code; regulations in 5 CFR part 610, subpart D, Flexible and Compressed Work Schedules; and the Handbook on Alternative Work Schedules (http://www.opm.gov/oca/aws/index.htm) and OPM's Labor-Management Relations Guidance Bulletin: Negotiating Flexible and Compressed Work Schedules (http://www.opm.gov/cclams/index.htm).

*Credit Hours* -- Credit hours are those hours within a flexible work schedule that an employee elects to work in excess of his or her basic work requirement (e.g., 80 hours in a pay period for a full-time employee) so as to vary the length of a workweek or workday. Employees may use credit hours to fulfill their basic work requirement, thereby gaining time off from work to pursue volunteer activities and for other purposes. If a department or agency authorizes credit hours under its flexible work schedules program, the maximum amount of credit hours that may be carried over from one pay period to another is 24 hours.

SCHEDULING TIME OFF FROM WORK. Employees seeking to participate in volunteer activities during basic working hours may be granted annual leave, leave without pay, compensatory time off, or, in very limited and unique circumstances, excused absence,

as discussed below. (Employees may also be permitted to use accumulated credit hours under flexible work schedules, as discussed above.)

Annual Leave -- When employees request annual leave to perform volunteer service, departments and agencies should be as accommodating as possible in reviewing and approving such requests consistent with regulations in 5 CFR part 630, subpart C, Annual Leave, and applicable collective bargaining agreements.

Leave Without Pay -- At the discretion of the agency, leave without pay (LWOP) may be granted to employees who wish to engage in volunteer activities during normal working hours. As with annual leave, OPM encourages departments and agencies, whenever possible, to act favorably upon requests by employees for LWOP to perform volunteer services. However, LWOP is appropriate for extended periods only if the employee is expected to return to his or her job at the end of the LWOP. Agencies should review their internal policies on LWOP and applicable collective bargaining agreements.

Compensatory Time Off -- Departments and agencies may approve requests from employees for compensatory time off in exchange for performing an equal amount of time in irregular or occasional overtime work. For employees under flexible work schedules, departments and agencies may approve employee requests for compensatory time off for both regularly scheduled and irregular or occasional overtime work.

*Excused Absence (administrative leave)* -- Each department or agency has discretion to excuse employees from their duties without loss of pay or charge to leave. OPM advises that the granting of excused absence for volunteer activities should be limited to those situations in which the employee=s absence, in the department=s or agency=s determination, is not specifically prohibited by law and satisfies one or more of the following criteria: (1) the absence is directly related to the department or agency=s mission; (2) the absence is officially sponsored or sanctioned by the head of the department or agency; (3) the absence will clearly enhance the professional development or skills of the employee in his or her current position; or (4) the absence is brief and is determined to be in the interest of the agency. Ultimately, it is the responsibility of each department or agency head to balance support for employees= volunteer activities with the need to ensure that employees= work requirements are fulfilled and that agency operations are conducted efficiently and effectively. Agencies should review their internal guidance on excused absence and applicable collective bargaining agreements.

PART-TIME EMPLOYMENT AND JOB SHARING. Part-time employment or job-sharing may also be appropriate for employees who request such arrangements in connection with performing volunteer service. Regulations in 5 CFR part 340 provide additional information on part-time employment and job-sharing.

### AWARDS FOR VOLUNTEERISM

Departments and agencies are encouraged to recognize their employees who volunteer their skills to help others. A department or agency may wish to become a Certifying Organization for the President's Volunteer Service Award (http://www.presidentialserviceawards.gov). Certifying Organizations agree to perform the following roles:

Verify that the volunteer(s) has completed the number of service hours required to earn a President's Volunteer Service Award.

Nominate verified volunteers by completing and submitting an order form to purchase the award(s).

Pay the nominal cost for the award package and its shipping, either directly or through local sponsorship.

Receive the award package and distribute the award to each recipient.

In addition, agencies may wish to establish internal programs to reward employees who donate their time and talents to help others. However, providing cash or paid time off undermines the volunteer spirit in which these individuals donate their personal time and efforts for the benefit of others. Nevertheless, granting appropriate citations and letters of appreciation, or small mementos such as a "You Make a Difference" pin or mug, would demonstrate the agency=s pride in the various beneficial services its employees render to the community.

### LABOR-MANAGEMENT RELATIONS

Agency officials are reminded that conditions of employment (such as work schedules) of bargaining unit employees may not be changed without notifying the exclusive representative of those employees and, upon timely request, bargaining on the matter to the extent required and/or permitted by laws, regulations, and collective bargaining agreements. Moreover, bargaining unit employees may participate in flexible or compressed work schedules "only to the extent expressly provided under a collective bargaining agreement between the agency and the exclusive representative." (See 5 U.S.C. 6130(a)(2).) For further information on an agency's collective bargaining obligations, agency officials should consult with their labor relations officers. Departments and agencies should also consult OPM's Labor-Management Relations Guidance Bulletin: Negotiating Flexible and Compressed Work Schedules (http://www.opm.gov/cplmr/html/flexible.asp).

### **PROHIBITION OF COERCION**

While managers, supervisors, and other agency officials may encourage employees to become more involved in volunteer activities, 5 U.S.C. 6132 provides that employees may not be coerced for the purpose of interfering with their legal rights under flexible and compressed work schedules. (Also see 5 U.S.C. 2302, Prohibited Personnel Practices.)

### CONFLICT OF INTEREST AND HATCH ACT RESTRICTIONS

Departments, agencies, and employees are reminded that conflict of interest laws and related regulations governing outside employment for compensation also apply to Federal employees who engage in volunteer activities. Hatch Act restrictions apply to employees who are on duty, as well as to those on paid or unpaid leave.

### USE OF GOVERNMENT FACILITIES AND EQUIPMENT

Employees may not use Government facilities and equipment for other than authorized purposes. (See 5 CFR 2635.704.) Employees may consult their agency ethics officials or Office of General Counsel for information about what may be authorized by their agency or department.

### LIABILITY FOR WORK-RELATED INJURIES

Departments and agencies need to be aware of liability issues related to employee participation in volunteer activities. The Department of Labor advises that, in most instances, employees who perform mission-related agency sponsored/sanctioned, or skills-enhancing volunteer activities while they are on excused absence are covered by 5 U.S.C. chapter 81, Compensation for Work Injuries. Other kinds of absences would most likely not be covered.

# Example: Corporation for National and Community Service Policy on Employee Volunteering

### Employee Volunteer Initiative Program (EVI)

### Q1: How do Staff request administrative leave for doing approved volunteer work?

A1: The Employee Volunteer Initiative Program (EVI) enables employees to volunteer for a nonprofit service organization during work hours and the Corporation matching annual leave used in a volunteer capacity with up to eight (8) hours administrative leave during a four week period. Organizations must be of a service, not advocacy, nature and have no financial ties to the Corporation. Leave used for this program requires advance supervisory approval. An example of how the program works: An employee is approved to volunteer for 4 hours in pay period 1. The employee should code their timesheet as 2 hours annual leave and 2 hours administrative leave. Requests for administrative leave are coded on webTA for management approval (i.e., coded as admin/excused absence).

- 3. What was the aggregate number of hours you volunteered during that same time period?
- 4. Did you organize a service project? If yes, how many people participated in your project?

  - Community Renewal Education Health Energy and Environment Military Families or Veterans Disaster Preparedness or Response Interfaith Cooperation
- 6. Please share great stories that highlight the impact of your service.
- 7. What was accomplished for your community?

I think you're right that our preparation and the content could be different depending on whether we get 500 lines/people or 5,000 or some higher number. Am. for the Arts' biggest list is 150,000 but there's no way we'd actually get that many people on the phone. Might be great to include WH arts briefing either way. (We just had a dozen or so people from the arts and museum community come to CNCS to learn about core projects - AmeriCorps, etc. I know there's interest in making more

#### connections going forward.)

We wouldn't have to think of doing it for Americans for the Arts but with them as a partner. We've co-hosted calls w/ various groups in the past - Americans for the Arts (a small sub-group of theirs - 150 ppl or so), National Humanities Alliance/Imagining America, Arts Presenters, Arts and Democracy Project, State Arts Agencies, etc. - where the topic is engaging their members/affiliates/etc in United We Serve, so I'd guess this would be okay to do again. The invitation would be from you as with the announcement you did w/ AAPI groups, but we'd include someone from Americans for the Arts in the brief agenda we share as a speaker (so they can talk about their soon-to-be-released

Or to be even more distant/neutral, we could not mention them in the email at all and just make sure **mass** has a chance to speak early on (b)(a) during the call. But this would be a last resort. 
