Kennedy Center Gets Slaps

If Rose Kennedy, the devout daily communicant, was bewildered by Leonard Bernstein's concept of the Roman Catholic Mass she covered her true emotions with customary courage. It was "fine," she told radiant Barbara Walters on NBC-Today show. But the way the slender matriarch said "fine" sounded as if she was saying "Oh dear God!"

One of her daughters, Mrs. Sargent Shriver, flipped over the mass; said it was just great, and that it's high time some layman got around to giving the ritual a new thrust--after all the meddling the bishops have done with it since Christ's first one.

Octogenarian Alice Longworth, long-time East Coast distributor of sterling silver bludgeons, said it was the best thing of its kind she had seen since "Hair."

Legislators Get Another Salary Hike

Gov. Francis W. Sargent yesterday signed into law legislation increasing the salaries of the House and Senate chairmen of the committee on government regulations.

As a result of the new law, Sen. Charles V. Hogan (D-Lynn) and Rep. William Q. MasLean (D-Fairhaven) will receive pay raises of \$3,900.

The base pay of legislators is \$11,400. However, recent practice has had the legislature grant additional compensation to the chairmen of both the House and Senate ways and means committees, the committee on taxation, and the committee on counties.

In addition, the House speaker gets double the pay of legislators, while the minority leader, and the assistant legislative leaders of both the speaker and the minority leader receive additional compensation.

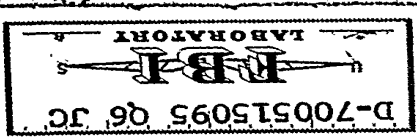

C. Case Faces Highest Test

Court to Review Abort

WASHINGTON (UPI) — The Supreme Court, in a case that could produce a landmark decision, agreed Monday to examine the constitutionality of the District of Columbia's abortion law.

The court will schedule arguments next fall on an appeal by the Justice Dept. from a ruling last Nov. 10 by U. S. District Judge Gerhard A. Gesell striking down the district's 69-year-old criminal statute against illegal abortion. The case will be decided by written opinion of the high court.

Gesell dismissed an indictment of Dr. Milan Vuitch, a Yugoslav immigrant who has been crusading for more liberal abortion policies.

Many states have laws similar to the district's, which bars an abortion except when "necessary for the preservation of the mother's life or health."

The American Civil Liberties Union and other abortion law activists have participated in recent stepped-up efforts to liberalize abortion laws. The most liberal one went into effect March 11 in Hawaii.

A number of state legislatures have pending bills similar to the one enacted in Hawaii. Others have liberalized their criminal codes to a lesser extent since Colorado did so in 1967.

A judge Federal Court in Milwaukee struck down part of Wisconsin's abortion statute. Lawsuits are pending in New York and New Jersey. More are planned.

The ACLU, feminist groups and others argue that an abortion is a matter solely between a woman and her physician. They say that the laws discriminate against the poor.

Earlier this term, the Supreme Court refused to re-

view a state court decision in California striking down the law in that state.

District Judge Gesell's opinion in the Washington case said the clause "necessary for the preservation of the mother's life or health" is so vague that a person accused of violating it cannot properly defend himself. He said it also places on the defendant the burden of proving that he made the right medical judgment.

The Justice Dept. appealed on the ground that Gesell should not have thrown out the case before trial but should have applied the law to the specific circumstances of Vuitch's case. The department added that the doctor's medical judgment is not always an issue because physicians sometimes perform abortions after doing nothing more than establishing the fact of pregnancy.

~~Kenneth R. O'Donnell~~ at a press conference Wednesday, became the first of the gubernatorial candidates to announce specifically what his campaign strategy will be, both for the September primary and, if successful in that political war, the November election.

Although regarded as a liberal, progressive leader, one who gave himself the label "the anti-establishment candidate," O'Donnell has chosen a traditional theme of party versus party, Democrat against Republican, as the foundation of his strategy.

~~O'Donnell~~ doesn't say that the Democrats need revitalizing, only an attractive candidate that can win. He says the lack of desirable options in the past has forfeited victory to the Republicans.

And, of course he identifies himself as the only contending Democrat who can tip over Gov. Francis W. Sargent come election day.

Republican control of government doesn't work in the executive branch of a state in which the legislature is overwhelmingly Democratic, says O'Donnell. And this is not because the

legislature becomes obstructionist, he adds.

O'Donnell contends that, historically, his party, has led the way for all liberal and progressive programs, and that the Republicans have conceded their support only when forced to do so.

He considers Sargent highly vulnerable because of lack of accomplishment. He denounces him as an "Autumn liberal," indicating that the governor comes in with late support for programs only after they have been proven popular.

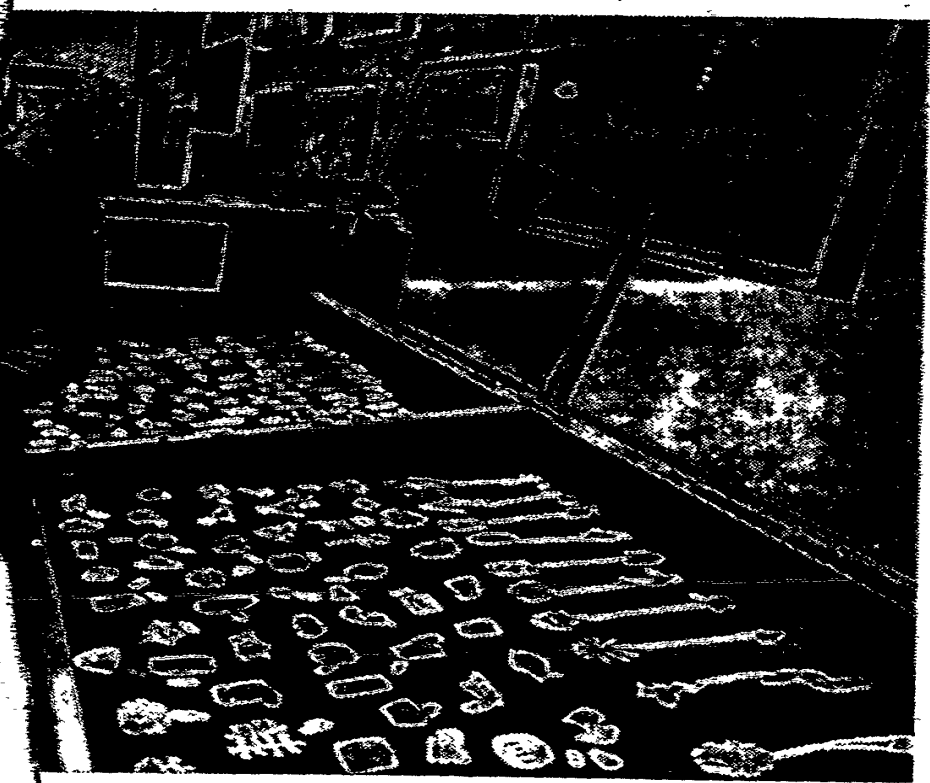
O'Donnell intends to "make Sargent a Republican, a Nixon Republican, a man who carries out Republican policy."

He says Sargent, in the spirit of the regime of former Gov. John A. Volpe, blames resistance from the Democratic legislature for failure to get things done. Behind the O'Donnell strategy is his conviction that the majority of Bay Staters prefer to vote Democratic; that the 40 percent of the voters who are registered Democrats represent a decisive base for any Democratic candidate of that a majority of the voters who regard them

Nixon Says Cambodia Neutrality Vital to U.S.

WASHINGTON (UPI)—The
 White House said Monday
 that the United States has "an
 overriding interest" in pre-
 serving the Cambodian neu-
 trality because of the effects
 a Communist takeover would
 have on the U. S. war effort
 in South Vietnam.

Press Secretary Ronald L.
 Ziegler said: "The President
 is deeply concerned about the
 course of events in Cambodia
 and is closely following devel-
 opments."

He said Nixon wanted to
 preserve the territorial integ-
 rity of Cambodia and viewed
 with concern violations of
 Cambodian territory by North
 Vietnamese troops in "Blatant
 disregard" of the 1954 Geneva
 Accords.

Ziegler could give no indi-
 cation of when a decision
 would be made by Nixon.

He called off for a third
 time a scheduled meeting of
 the National Security Coun-
 cil, but Ziegler said the ses-
 sion was not intended to deal
 with the Cambodian situation.

Ziegler said Nixon met both
 Sunday and Monday with top
 diplomatic and defense ad-
 visers to assess implications
 of North Vietnam's actions in
 Cambodia. The United States
 says there are 40,000 North
 Vietnamese and iVet Cong
 troops in Cambodia.

The White House statement
 followed one Friday by Zieg-
 ler characterizing the Commu-

 "foreign invasion."

He termed the measure a "step backward" in urban renewal.

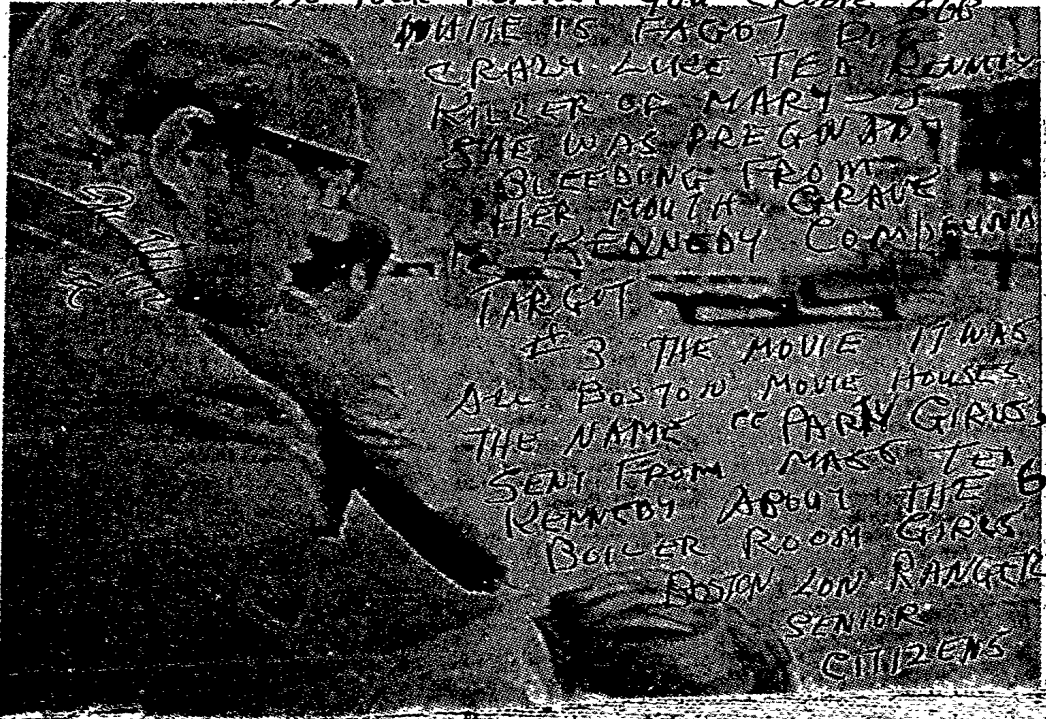

ON THE MIDDLE EAST, the Secretary urged the Yugoslavian leaders, as he had the Arab officials with whom he conferred in Bahrain and Kuwait, to try to persuade Egypt to enter direct negotiations with Israel. Vietnam Peace Talks Outlook 'Encouraging', Rogers

DUBROVNIK, Yugoslavia—Secretary of State William P. Rogers told Yugoslav foreign minister Mirko Tepavac yesterday the United States government has some reason to hope a resumption of the Vietnam peace talks in Paris July 13 will lead to "something substantive and encouraging."

He did not go into details. But he did express the belief the war is going to end although he could not say just when and how.

However, he said President Nixon believes China and Russia want to see the Vietnam conflict settled, though it is not clear how much pressure they are bringing on Hanoi to negotiate.

The Secretary also told the Yugoslav that it is now clear the international community as a whole wants to see the Vietnam war end.

While the Yugoslav Communist regime strongly favors the North Vietnamese and opposes the use of American air power to support South Vietnam, the foreign minister refrained from publicly condemning the American bombing in the toast speech he gave at a Saturday night dinner in Belgrade in Rogers' honor.

Tepavac omitted from his speech a protest against the bombing which was included in the prepared draft. He did so in deference to Rogers' wishes.

In the discussion of Vietnam, the foreign minister said he knew that Rogers was aware of the Yugoslav view on Vietnam. He did not specifically criticize American policy nor urge the bombing be stopped.

Tepavac told Rogers he had discussed the Vietnamese situation a few days ago with the North Vietnamese ambassador in Belgrade, who gave the impression Hanoi was still

standing on its seven-point peace plan, which calls for a coalition government "national accord" in South Vietnam in which the Communists would have a dominant influence.

In the discussion on the Arab-Israel problem, Rodgers said the American government is distressed that the Mideast was the one area of international tension where the disputants were not talking to one another. He cited India and Pakistan, North and South Korea and East and West Germany.

The Secretary was trying to convey the hope that the Yugoslavs, who have good relations with the Arabs might urge Egypt to start direct talks with Israel.

Tepavac said Yugoslavia was concerned about the supply of arms to the parties in the Middle East. Rogers pointed out that for eight months the U. S. withheld the supply of war planes to Israel and only resumed them

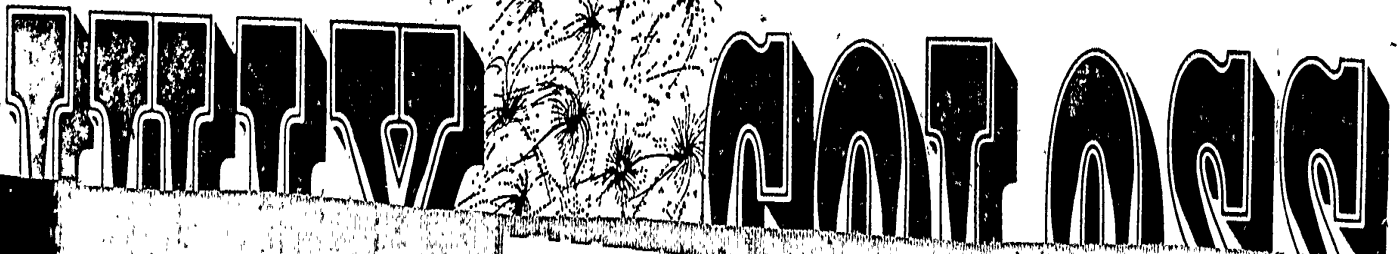

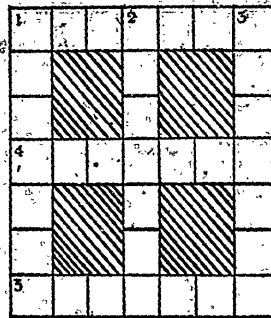

The world's astronomers are set to name three small craters on the front face of the moon for Neil Armstrong and Edwin Aldrin, the first men to walk on the moon, and for Michael Collins, their Apollo 11 comrade who orbited above them.

In a notable exercise in international

cooperation, the astronomers also are scheduled to name features on the far side of the moon for the late Yuri Gagarin, the first man to fly in space, and several other dead and living Soviet cosmonauts, The Globe has learned.

A list of 500 place names proposed for approval at the triennial assembly of the International Astronomical Union (IAU) in Brighton, England, which begins Monday, includes those of the writers Chaucer, Dante and Omar Khayyam.

Also on the list are the physicist J. Robert Oppenheimer, the Russian rocket developer and the legendary Greek artist his son, Icarus, who flew too close to the sun; the science fiction writer Jules Verne and the French soldier-physician Paul Bergeat, who wrote through the eyes of an imaginary visitor to the moon.

All but a handful of the names on the hidden far side of the moon are designated until now only

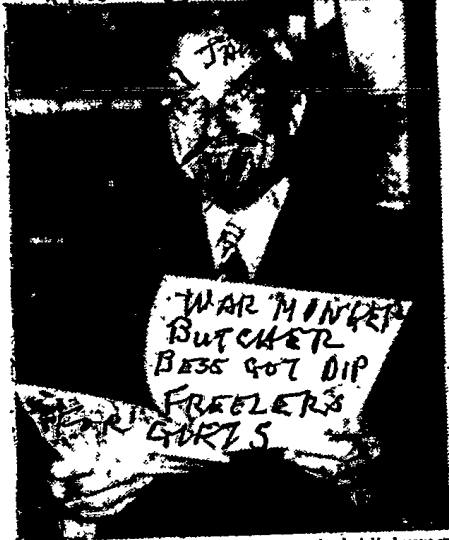

WASHINGTON, Aug. 14 (UP)—Peace came to the world tonight when President Truman announced that Japan has accepted unconditional surrender and Allied forces have been ordered to cease firing. Gen Douglas MacArthur, "the man who came back," was named Supreme Allied Commander to receive the formal Japanese surrender. World War II—bloodiest conflict in all of human history—was at an end, except for the formality of signing surrender documents.

883 Die as U. S. Cruiser Is Sunk

WASHINGTON Aug. 14 (AP)—The Indianapolis, a heavy cruiser, was sunk by a Japanese submarine on July 30, 1945, in the Philippine Sea. The ship was carrying 883 crew members and passengers. The sinking was one of the most serious losses in the U.S. Navy's history during World War II.

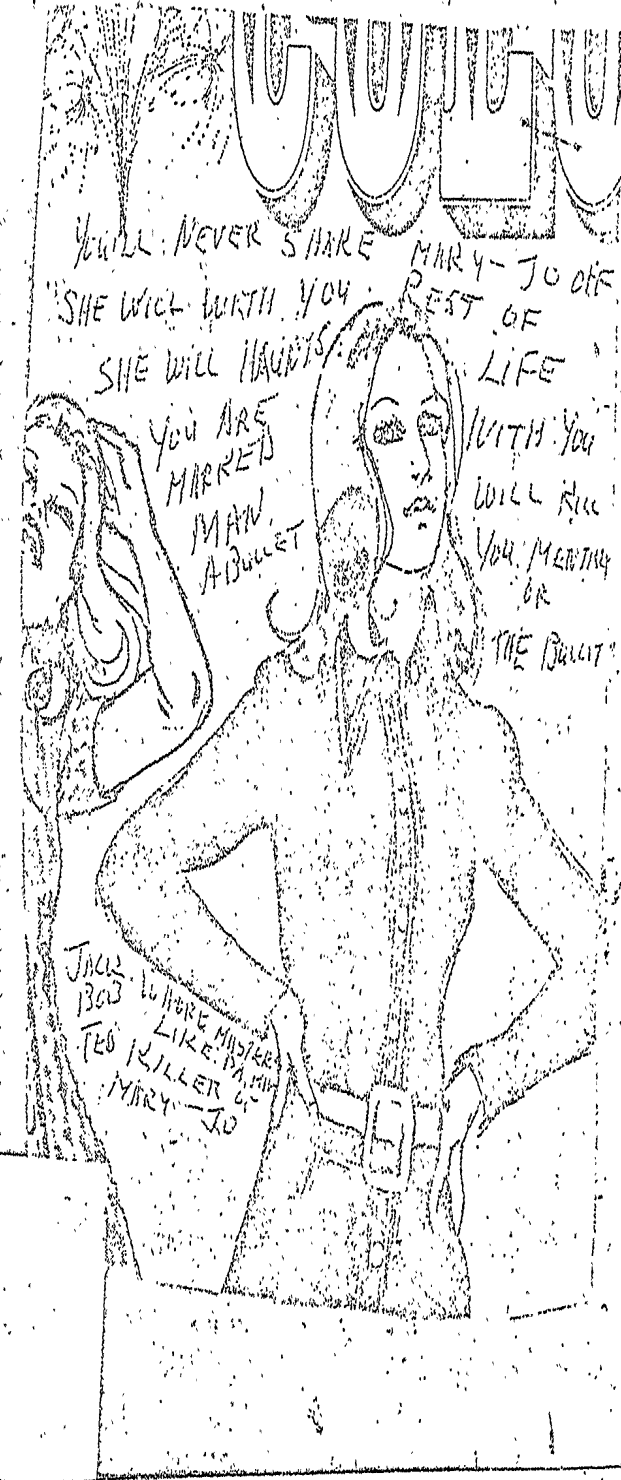

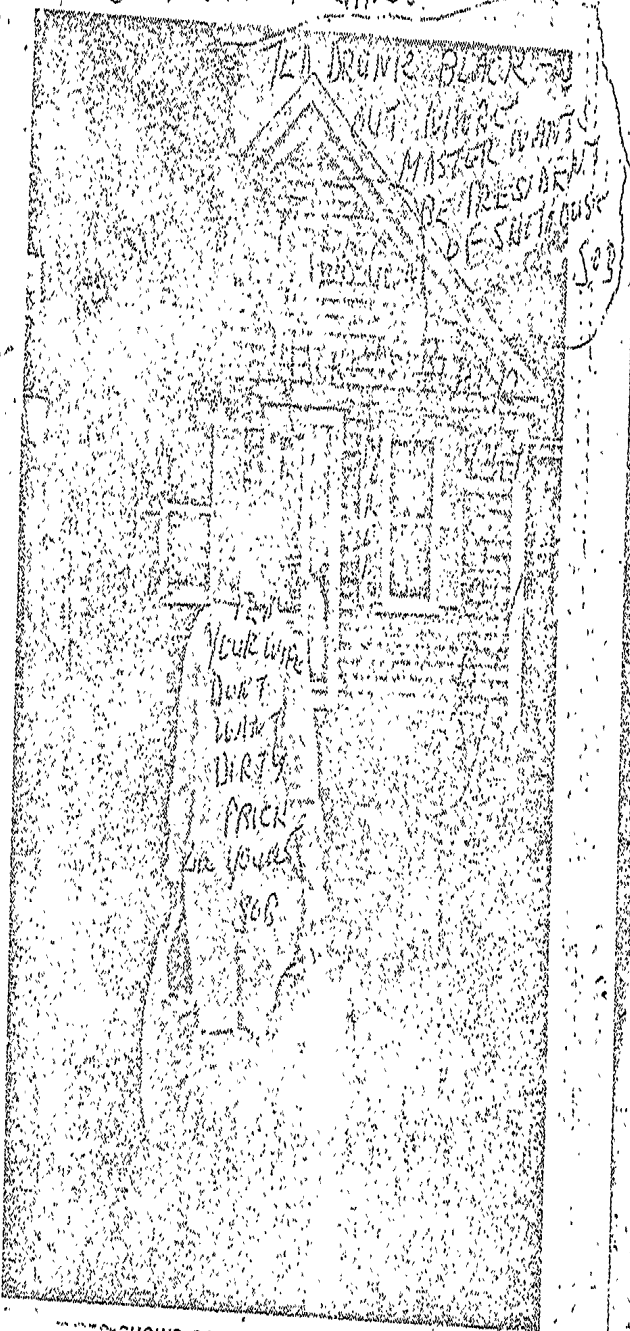

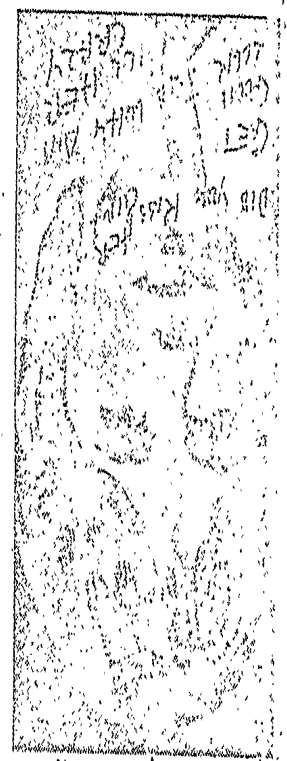
