By cablegram 7-20-61 the Legal Attache, Mexico City, advised that the President's brother, Edward M. Kennedy, had arrived in that city on a tour of Latin America accompanied by Dr. John N. Plank; [redacted]; Bela Kornitzer; and [redacted]. The group is making a study of social and economic conditions and reportedly departed for Costa Rica on 7-21-61. They are reportedly interested in meeting with "leftists" to talk with them and determine why they, the "leftists," think as they do. The Director inquired as to what our files contain concerning Plank, [redacted] Kornitzer and [redacted].

No information is contained in Bureau files concerning Dr. Plank, who is described as a Harvard University professor [redacted]; or [redacted]. The latter two individuals are reportedly personal friends of Edward Kennedy and [redacted] is the son of former professional boxer Gene Tunney.

No investigation has been conducted by the Bureau concerning Bela Kornitzer; however, the following information is contained in our files. Kornitzer, born 11-28-10, at Szerencs, Hungary, entered the United States in November, 1946, as an official of the Hungarian Government for the purpose of, according to his own statements, making a study of social and economic conditions in America. Later, in 1953, he became a naturalized citizen. A source has advised that Kornitzer had been a reporter and author in Hungary before World War II. Kornitzer has claimed in interviews with Bureau Agents that during the Nazi occupation of Hungary, he assumed a false identity and took refuge on a small farm near Budapest. Kornitzer has further advised that in 1945 at the end of World War II when the Russians occupied Hungary, he helped organize the Ministry for Public Supply in the first coalition government of Hungary and served under Prime Minister Ferenc Nagy. This position was obtained through Kornitzer's friendship with a prominent Hungarian military leader.

Shortly after his arrival in the United States, according to Kornitzer, he addressed a group of Hungarian Jews denouncing the communist influence in Hungary. He was subsequently notified he was no longer a government official. A Catholic priest who met Kornitzer

shortly after his arrival advised that Kornitzer, in conversation with him, had stated that he was not in sympathy with communism but praised the conduct of Russian soldiers in Hungary. Kornitzer further reportedly stated that when he came to the United States articles appeared in two procommunist papers praising him, but he had requested them to stop as he did not want to appear as a communist or propagandist. Since his arrival, Kornitzer has been in contact with many of the leading political personalities in the United States, including former Presidents Truman and Eisenhower, and has written various books, including "American Fathers and Sons" (1952), "The Great American Heritage, The Story of the Five Eisenhower Brothers" (1955); and "The Real Nixon," a biography (1960). He has claimed to be a personal friend of both former President Eisenhower and former Vice President Nixon.

In connection with his writings, he has on numerous occasions attempted to meet the Director and to obtain material for his books. In 1947 he claimed to have met the Director; however, the Director commented, "I never met him." He has been most persistent in the past and on one occasion in 1951 intimated to Inspector Wick that he might contact former President Truman or former Attorney General McGrath in the hopes they might convince the Director to see him. He continues to send the Director copies of all his works and as recent as September, 1960, an acknowledgment was written concerning the receipt of an article. In 1947 former Assistant Director McGuire described Kornitzer as a smooth-talking, fast-operating, tricky individual who would use a contact with the Director to his advantage in meeting others. He has been interviewed in various investigations conducted by the Bureau and has always been cooperative. (100-344383; 62-82351)

BIOGRAPHICAL DATA:

SUMMARY

Edward M. Kennedy defeated Republican candidate George C. Lodge during the election on 11-6-62. Senator Benjamin A. Smith, the incumbent, was not a candidate for re-election.

The 9-28-62 issue of "Time" magazine contained an article concerning

Senator Kennedy which reflected that he had obtained a Bachelor of Arts Degree in 1956 from Harvard, and when he was turned down by the Harvard Law School, he entered the University of Virginia Law School where he earned a Bachelor of Laws Degree in 1959. The 4-9-62 issue of "U. S. News and World Report" carried an article concerning the announcement by Kennedy that during his second semester at Harvard, he was having difficulty in a foreign language course and arranged for a fellow freshman to take the examination for him. When school officials learned of this, both students were asked to withdraw and apply for readmission later. Kennedy was married in 1958 and has two children, Kara and Edward, Jr.

INFORMATION IN BUFILES:

On 5-11-54 Kennedy's father, Joseph P. Kennedy, called the Bureau and spoke to former Assistant to the Director Nichols. He advised he had received information that Drew Pearson was going to write a story about his son "Teddy" in that "Teddy" had not been permitted to go to school at Fort Holabird, Maryland, while in the U. S. Army because of an adverse FBI report which linked him to a group of "pinkos." Mr. Kennedy stated he had sent word to Pearson that he would sue him for libel if he printed so much as one word of this in that he would not tolerate his son being victimized in any form. Mr. Kennedy stated that his son had enlisted in the Army at the age of 19 after attending Harvard for one year. Bufiles reflected that we had conducted no investigation concerning Edward Kennedy, and Mr. Kennedy was advised of this fact.

In June, 1956, information was received that Edward Kennedy had requested a visa for travel to Egypt as a representative of the International News Service.

In November, 1960, the North Carolina State Bureau of Investigation advised that one [redacted] telephoned Kennedy at Hyannis Port, Massachusetts, on

9-2-60. The purpose of this call was not known; however, it is noted that [redacted] was sentenced by a North Carolina court on 11-3-60 to a two to three year sentence for conspiracy and four to six year sentence for felonious larceny. .

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On 1-24-61 the Boston SAC advised that [redacted] Boston, Massachusetts, had confidentially advised that Joseph P. Kennedy had expressed an interest in placing "Teddy" as the Assistant District Attorney of Suffolk County. [redacted] advised he had heard statements attributed to the President that he was not satisfied with political conditions in the Democratic Party in Massachusetts and surmised that the President was using this way to get "Teddy" into politics. It is noted that "Teddy" was sworn in as an Assistant District Attorney on 2-7-61. Kennedy indicated he would accept a fee of \$1 and waive the remainder of his \$5,000 salary.

In July, 1961, Edward Kennedy made a familiarization and orientation tour of Central and South American countries. During this tour, the Mexico City Legal Attache reported that Kennedy had expressed an interest in meeting with "Leftists" to talk with them and determine why they think as they do. Kennedy met with a number of individuals known to have communist sympathies. While in Mexico City, Kennedy asked the Ambassador to invite left-wingers to the Embassy where he could interview them; however, the Ambassador refused to do so and stated that if any such interviews were to be conducted, all arrangements would have to be made by Kennedy himself.

In August, 1961, a confidential source advised that Edward Kennedy had recently dined with Dr. Lauchlin Bernard Currie, former White House Aide to President Roosevelt. Currie's name had been mentioned in Washington investigations of Soviet spy rings. It was also noted that Dr. Currie had recently been invited to the U. S. Embassy at Bogata, Columbia, where Currie presently resides.

In October, 1961, a confidential source on Portuguese matters advised that Edward Kennedy was planning to enter politics and had retained one [redacted], an attorney in Boston, to be his advisor on how to obtain Portuguese votes in Massachusetts. This source described [redacted] as being a rightist and an extremist on behalf of the Portuguese Government. Inasmuch as there was a question as to whether [redacted] should be registered as a foreign agent with the Department of Justice, Attorney General Kennedy was advised, and he spoke to "Teddy" about this. [redacted] subsequently registered as a foreign agent on 12-29-61.

SENATOR-ELECT--MASSACHUSETTS

In January, 1962, Edward Kennedy wrote to Assistant Director Callahan on behalf of Special Agent John Sullivan who desired a transfer from Cleveland to Boston. Mr. Kennedy was advised that Sullivan had resigned 12-15-61, and that Sullivan had never specifically requested a transfer to Boston.

On July, 1962, the Boston Office received information of a threat to kill Edward Kennedy. This information was furnished to the Secret Service and the Attorney General.

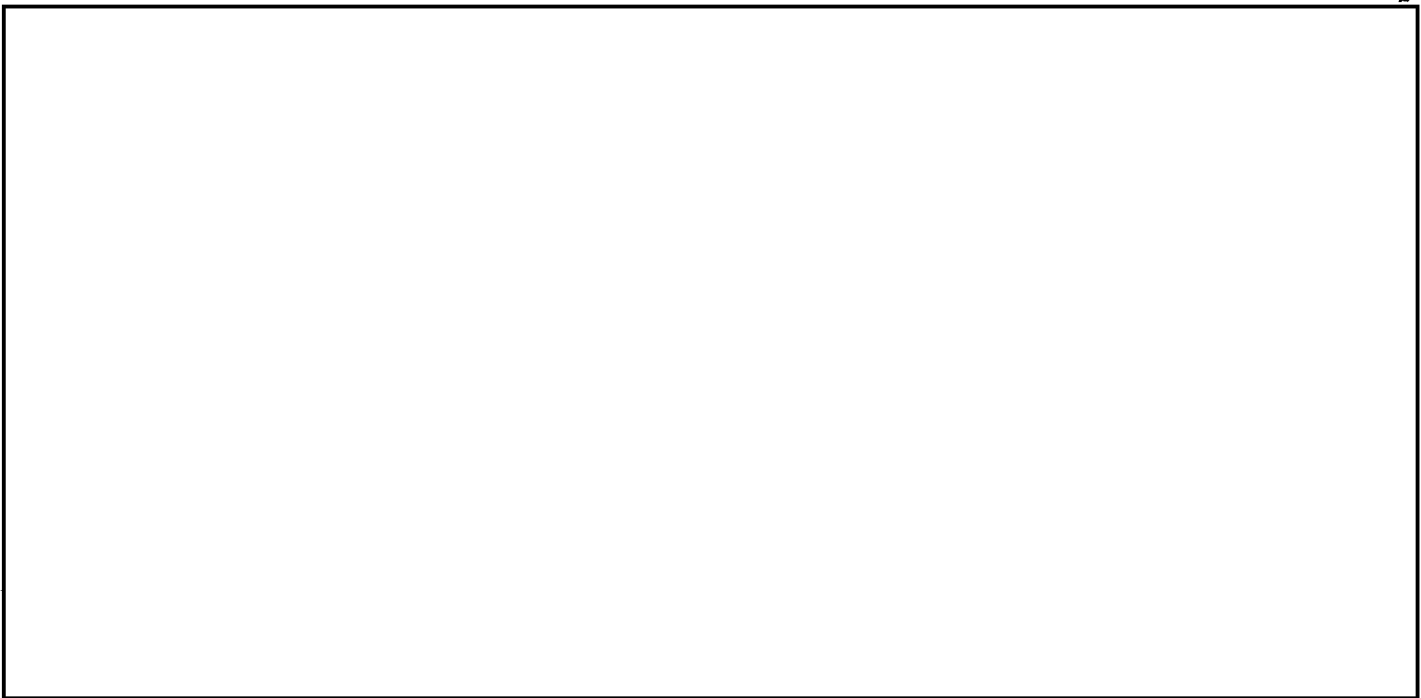

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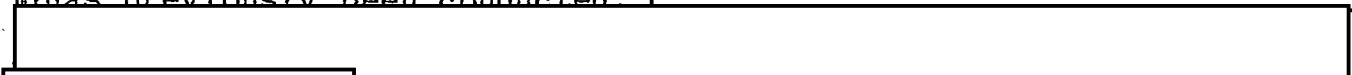

Kornitzer, a minor official of the post World War II Hungarian Government, initially entered the U.S. in 1946 and remained here after a disagreement with the Hungarian Government. Since 1947 he has been in touch with the Bureau on numerous occasions making repeated efforts to arrange for an interview with the Director on one pretext or another with the objective of writing an article or biography of the Director. As an author and biographer, Kornitzer has been in contact with many leading political personalities in the U.S. and has authored several books including one on the Eisenhower brothers in 1955 and another on former Vice President Nixon in 1960. Kornitzer, while disclaiming to be a "name-dropper," frequently uses this technique. In 1947 a Bureau official described Kornitzer as a smooth-talking, fast-operating, tricky individual who would use a contact with the Director to his advantage in meeting other individuals.




Special Agent Joseph Condon of the Boston Office telephonically advised that Special [redacted] had contacted the Attorney General at about 12:30 a.m. today and offered to be of any assistance possible in getting him to the hospital where his brother was taken after the plane crash. The Attorney General said he was most appreciative of the assistance offered by the FBI but since the Massachusetts State Police had a squad car assigned to the gate to the Kennedy estate, transportation arrangements had already been made.

On the morning of June 20, 1964, Special Agent [redacted] of our Springfield, Massachusetts, Resident Agency was at the hospital and assisted in moving Senator Kennedy into another room. [redacted], who personally knows the attending physician, was informed by him that the Senator's condition can only be regarded as fair, but the prognosis is good. Special Agent [redacted] talked with the Attorney General at the hospital, and with Deputy Attorney General Katzenbach, and with Senator Kennedy's wife. He offered to be of any assistance possible. All expressed appreciation for the offer but indicated there was nothing further that need be done at this time. The Boston Office is keeping in touch with this situation and will advise the Bureau of developments.

The following is submitted with reference to the Director's inquiry as to the whereabouts of Deputy Attorney General Katzenbach following the airplane accident involving Senator Kennedy.

At about 1:00 a. m. , on Saturday, June 20, 1964, Mr. Ed Guthman, Special Assistant to the Attorney General, telephoned me and advised that he and Deputy Attorney General Katzenbach were proceeding to Northampton, Massachusetts, to join the Attorney General at the hospital where Senator Kennedy was confined. He said that they were traveling on the Air Force plane carrying the military physicians who had been ordered to the hospital by the President. Guthman asked for no assistance and none was offered.

Guthman subsequently advised me on Sunday afternoon that the plane left Washington at about 3:00 a. m. , but the party did not reach Northampton until about 8:00 a. m. , as the plane had to land at Stewart Air Force Base in New York because of adverse weather conditions at Northampton. Army cars then drove the party to the hospital.

Deputy Attorney General Katzenbach was with the Attorney General in the hospital at the time our Resident Agent spoke to them and offered to be of any assistance to the Attorney General as well as to the Senator's wife. It is not known when Katzenbach returned to Washington but he was in his office early Monday morning, June 22nd.

In the future, of course, the Bureau will not be injected into a situation of this kind unless we are specifically requested.

It is noted the Attorney General plans on staying in Massachusetts until his scheduled departure for Europe, Wednesday, June 24th.

The communication is undated. The writer has just learned of the air crash in which Senator Edward Kennedy was involved. He is very sympathetic and wishes to convey to the Senator his best wishes for a prompt recovery also on behalf of the majority of Italian boys and girls.

Since he does not know the Senator's address and has been corresponding with the Director, he hopes that the Director will forward the remaining portion of the letter to Mr. Edward Kennedy whom he addresses personally.

In the portion of the letter addressed to Senator Edward Kennedy, the writer encourages the Senator to look forward to a brilliant future, pointing out that the cloud which has cast a temporary shadow on his life will soon disappear under a most resplendent sun.

He wants the Senator to know that he is not the son of an important man, but the son of humble workers, a capacity which, in his estimation, makes him entitled to interpret the feelings of the Italian working people best.

The letter closes with a few words again addressed to the Director to thank him, together with the Agents and Interpreter, for the "cumulative effort" which will make his message reach Senator Kennedy.

Mr. Hoover has indicated he would be agreeable to providing Senator Kennedy with such an article.

INFORMATION IN BUFILES:

Joseph P. Kennedy is on the Special Correspondents' List and is known to the Director on a first-name basis. On numerous occasions, he has expressed a great admiration for Mr. Hoover and the work of the FBI. He was a Special Service Contact of the Boston Office from 1943 until 1954, following which he was an SAC Contact of that Division.

The FBI has never conducted a complete investigation of Mr. Kennedy; however, a limited inquiry was made in May, 1951, at the request of the Department. This concerned an allegation that Mr. Kennedy, then owner of the Merchandise Mart in Chicago, had given \$100,000 for the removal of Government offices from that building. No specific facts were developed and the inquiry was closed on 6-7-51.

On October 27, 1964, Miss GRACE EVERETT, Route 20 at Intersection Ball Camp Pike and Middlebrook Pike, Knox County, Tennessee, furnished the following information to Special Agents JOHN R. REILLY and [redacted] of the Knoxville FBI Office.

Miss EVERETT, a white female, aged 58, said she is presently divorced but had prior marriages to [redacted]. She is a retired Ensign in the U. S. Navy having previously served in the U. S. Navy as a nurse from 1930 to 1938, NSN 64648.

She rents a house to Mr. JAMES B. LESTER and his wife CLARA at the above address but she has asked them to move effective November 10, 1964. She described Mr. LESTER as a white person 75 to 77 years old who is a retired painter. She said Mrs. LESTER is approximately 65 years old and both live on \$105.00 per month income.

Both Mr. and Mrs. LESTER are opposed to "the KENNEDY wealth". They have been renting from Mrs. EVERETT for three years and they are "bitter toward the KENNEDYS". On the day following the plane crash involving Senator EDWARD KENNEDY, Miss EVERETT showed Mrs. LESTER the morning paper giving an account of the accident. Miss EVERETT commented to the effect that tragedy has struck in the KENNEDY family again and Senator KENNEDY might die. Mrs. LESTER then said, "I wish he would" and, "I wish 'they' would get that brother, BOBBY too". When Miss EVERETT asked what she meant by "they", Mrs. LESTER said "Oh, just they--they will get him".

Miss EVERETT stated she did not understand "their hate" although she considered them loyal Americans. She said she has asked them to move due to their attitude but had just now decided to report the matter. She further related that the LESTERS did not indicate they personally would take any action against Senator EDWARD KENNEDY or Mr. ROBERT KENNEDY.

The files of the Knoxville Office of the Federal Bureau of Investigation reflect one JAMES BROWNLOW LESTER, wife CLARA HARTSELL LESTER, was investigated as an applicant for the Atomic Energy Commission in 1947. Mr. LESTER's application submitted at that time reflected he was born December 26, 1889 at Corryton, Tennessee, and was employed as a painter. This applicant type investigation was favorable except according to files of the Security Office at the Atomic Energy Commission, his employment was terminated at Stone and Webster Company, Oak Ridge, Tennessee, July 18, 1945 as "discharged for participation in work stoppage in an emergency equivalent to striking". The files of the Knoxville Office of the Federal Bureau of Investigation contain no information identifiable with CLARA H. LESTER.

"I called them as I saw them at the time, even when it got me into trouble..." (U. S. News and World Report, 1-1-62, page 47)

This terse statement was used by Joe Kennedy to describe his years in politics, but I think it actually represents his lifelong creed in everything he undertook.

In all the years that we have been friends, I have never known him to dodge making the hard choice--once he decided that was the only road open. And he always made his choice known with a candor and a blunt honesty which were refreshing and completely free of deviousness.

Everyone talks about him, yet few know very much about him. A thousand myths have sprung up around this thoroughly unique man, primarily because he has had the courage to fly in the face of the prevalent

political theories, public policies and prejudices of the time. With his

"Irish" up, Joe Kennedy has brought a welcome fury to bear on things he believed to be wrong, and his blunt opinions have often unsettled those who could not comprehend the depth of his discernment and perception.

And he has never been without his detractors!

Unfortunately, mediocre minds usually condemn everything which is beyond their comprehension. And it is equally sad that those with mediocre talents often earn more of a reputation than is achieved by true merit.

Despite his critics, I have never known Joe Kennedy to be other than totally dedicated to his country. He has stood by it with absolute disregard of personal consequences, and, to my knowledge, he has never refused to come forward when needed. And the United States has profited greatly from the tremendous talents he brought to bear on any job he was asked to do.

I recall that when he was appointed to the newly created Securities and Exchange Commission in 1934, his selection was blasted as "a slap in the face" of the supporters of President Franklin Roosevelt. Yet, I understand that in 431 work-crammed days, Joe Kennedy laid foundations for some of the procedures still used by that agency today.

In 1937, he was asked to become the chairman of the new Maritime Commission which had been set up to create an American

merchant marine and to cope with a shipping industry that was then plagued with high costs, low efficiency and strikes.

Again, Joe Kennedy brought his enormous skill, resourcefulness and good sense to bear on a difficult situation in which the public had a vital interest.

Once again he became the target for much personal abuse because of his insistence on reforms which are standard today. For example, he demanded that the maritime industry submit its labor disputes to conciliation and mediation. (Life, 1-25-63, page 66B)

And, as before, Joe Kennedy again demonstrated that he had few peers when it came to getting things done more effectively, faster and better than anyone else. In 75 16-hour workdays he laid out a pattern of operation which, I am told, became the guide for his successors in bringing our merchant marine to its maximum practicable strength and, with the coming of World War II, enabling us to retain the mastery of our own destiny. (Time, 11-4-40, page 19)

I also recall how Joe Kennedy served as Ambassador to Great Britain in the days when the world was going to war. He went to London straight from his job of trying to build up a modern merchant marine.

Reaction to this appointment was the same as before-- his critics had a field day! They correctly foresaw such incidents as Joe's telling Queen Elizabeth to her face that she was "cute." What they did not foresee was that the Queen would be pleased and flattered beyond words. (Time, 9-18-39, page 14)

Joe Kennedy, with his usual scorn for deceit and guile, began his ambassadorial tour by giving his critics new grounds for attack. With typical straightforwardness, he left the British Government in no doubt about his convictions with his very first speech as an Ambassador. In March, 1938, he made it very clear that he opposed the entry of the United States into the war. Pessimistic about England's ability to defend herself, he called the shots as he saw them. He reported to President Roosevelt that sending military aid to Britain would only be throwing it down the drain.

For this, Joe Kennedy was accused of being pro-Nazi and anti-Semitic!

In retrospect, I wonder how many know that when he left England in 1940, the London "Times" paid him a great tribute?

"Whether he comes back to us or not, he has earned the respect due to a great American Ambassador who never for a moment mistook the country to which he was accredited for the country of his birth."

(Time, 11-4-40, page 19)

What more could we ask of any diplomatic representative?

It is a sad fact that refutations seldom catch up with accusations. The dissemination given Joe Kennedy's initial appraisal of the situation in Great Britain completely exceeded that given to his overall career as an Ambassador.

He revised his belief about Britain's ability to defend herself, and he rapidly became closer to the British Government and the people than any Ambassador anyone could remember. And before he left for home, he admitted: "I did not know London could take it. I did not think any city could take it. I am bowed in reverence." (Time, 9-18-39, page 15)

The London "Daily Herald" summed up his ambassadorial career with these words: "Forever, in deeds if not in written words, we are Allies. Largely, that is Joseph Kennedy's work. Good-by Joe! Heaven bless you! Your job is done." (Time, 11-4-40, page 19)

Perhaps, Joe Kennedy's entire distinguished career as a former top governmental official and diplomat was destined to be "forever, in deeds if not in written words." His glowing record of service to his Nation has been somewhat eclipsed by his fabulous success as an American businessman. But the record he compiled in his work for the country is there for any who care to read it. He set an excellent example of selfless devotion to the United States.

Down through the years, I have always valued Joe Kennedy's suggestions and opinions very highly. I only recall one instance when it was necessary for me to reject his advice.

In 1955, he wrote to me, saying he understood I was interested in becoming a candidate for the Presidency. He urged me to run for this position either on a Republican or Democratic ticket, guaranteeing me the largest campaign contribution I would ever get from anyone, and his personal services as the hardest campaign worker in history,

I explained to him that I have never had any political ambitions, and that I have always felt what contribution I can make to my country can best be given in my present position as Director of the Federal Bureau of Investigation.

But I was deeply touched by the wonderful confidence implicit in his offer.

On Arturo Toscanini's eightieth birthday, someone asked his son what his father ranked as his most important achievement. The son replied, "For him there can be no such thing. Whatever he happens to be doing at the moment is the biggest thing in his life--whether it is conducting a symphony or peeling an orange." (A Second Reader's Notebook, Gerald Kennedy, page 2)

The same can be said about Joe Kennedy. Whatever he set out to do--whether as a fond father, a successful businessman or an astute servant of his government--his hallmark was always a smoothly efficient performance.

[redacted] advised that the Senator had just called him from Boston and told him he was sending his aide, [redacted] to Selma, Alabama, to see what assistance he could give to a Reverend Reeb who was badly injured during the recent civil rights incident.

Mr. [redacted] advised that the Senator had checked with the Department of Justice to see whether a Department attorney could meet [redacted] plane this afternoon in Birmingham and lend him assistance. Senator Kennedy was told by the Department that their attorneys in Alabama were deeply involved and they could not be of any help. The Senator then told [redacted] to check with the FBI and see if an FBI Agent could meet Mr. [redacted] plane in Birmingham and lend assistance to him. [redacted] was questioned as to what kind of assistance Senator Kennedy's aide required. [redacted] said frankly he did not know whether it was a transportation problem or if there might be a feeling that [redacted] would need some sort of protection. The Senator's aide was to arrive in Birmingham at 5:13 p.m. this afternoon, Washington time.

I called Senator Edward Kennedy to give him a rundown on developments. I advised him that, last night after he had talked to me, I started to check here and in Italy; that in the meantime, the Washington Bureau of the Herald Tribune called and stated they were carrying a story today to the effect that the FBI had not conducted a thorough investigation in that it had not turned up this association with [redacted], Senator Kennedy and Morrissey. I related that the official here who answered the phone asked how they could print a story of that kind when they had never had access to FBI reports; unless they have definite proof of this alleged story, they are getting themselves out on a limb and may be sawed off with a heavy libel suit; and they stated in view of that they are not going to carry any story today. I further advised that we have checked all editions of the paper and it has not appeared.

I told Senator Kennedy that back in 1961, there was a photograph of Mrs. Kennedy and him taken at the Naples Airport and there is a man in the background. I stated this picture is in the possession of the Immigration Service; that I have sent for a copy of it to identify the third person. He stated he is sure that it is not [redacted]. I replied that I am certain also and anyway, if it were, it would have no significance at all.

I related that we did learn that [redacted] who is anxious to get back into this country - having been deported in 1953, returned in 1960, and been redeported, - went out of his way to be cordial and friendly to every American who went to Capri and tried to get a picture taken with them, hoping to get influence to get back into this country. I stated the people in Naples say a picture was taken of him, Mrs. Kennedy and a man named Morrin who was a judge; however, subsequently [redacted] was able to have the picture killed and it was not printed in the newspaper; that the only one printed in the newspaper was the picture taken at the airport. I stated I will have this picture today.

I advised him that [redacted] is now at Livorno, Italy; that he was at Capri on October 6, and left for Livorno on October 8.

I stated we are running this down; that I think for the time being the thing is quiet; that we are taking the position here of "no comment"; that I fail to see how they could print such a story; that we would make no comment; and that we want to run the angle down at Livorno.

Senator Kennedy said he thinks there are two things: one, this investigation that is being done about Morrissey in reference to the Georgia dates and his other testimony, is that available? I replied that should be done by sometime this morning or afternoon; that the deadline was set today to finish the investigation and forward it to the Attorney General. He asked if that will be independent of this and I told him it will be unless there is some story printed and we do not believe the Herald Tribune will do it today since the picture they allege to have was not taken at Capri.

The Senator again stated he knows [redacted] is not in that picture. I said it doesn't mean anything and it would be absolutely libelous to draw conclusions from it; anyway Morrissey was not in the picture. I said I will have a copy made of this picture and send it over to him so he can have it and, when we get the check on [redacted] I will let him know the results of that. He thanked me.

Dear Senator Kennedy,

Last week I had pleasure of visting Washington D. C. for the first time. I also had the great pleasure of visiting the beautiful monuments and institutions which have made our nation's capitol world-famous. One of my visits was to the FBI, conducted for us by a future FBI special agent. As I saw the many techniques of the FBI, as well as its responsibilities, I noticed a sign which said that the FBI does investigate conspiracies of any person(s) directed toward depriving any U. S. citizen of his constitutionally guaranteed rights and privileges . The pamphlet about the FBI's role in these matters is entitled "The FBI.. Guardian of Civil Rights" states that "... the FBI has authority to investigate... conspiracies to deprive a citizen of the free exercise or enjoyment of any right or privilege secured to him by the constitution or laws of the United States and conspiracies against citizens resulting from their exercise of such rights..." Webster defines "conspiracy" as a secret planning together.

After the tour ended, I happened to walk around to the other side of the justice department building and see the American Nazi Party picketing the department and Attorney General Katzenbach for advocating the Home Rule in Washington D. C. They carried such disgusting signs as "Jail LBJ for advocating Black Rule" and "Home Rule is Black Rule," etc. Earlier this summer I saw this same group carry similarly disgusting and deceitful signs in front of the park in Wilmette Ill. where Martin Luther King spoke. Even though I am not a lawyer, I still strongly believe that it is profoundly unjust for such groups to be allowed to freely, openly as well as secretly, operate and actively try and accomplish its aims. Therefore I am asking you, as one of the members of the Senate Judiciary Committee to investigate this very grave situation (the Ku Klux Klan and other rightest groups also being engaged in similar activities.) Thank you very much

Enclosed are eight copies of letterhead memorandum which is self-explanatory. The confidential source who furnished his information to the Milwaukee Office is [redacted]. This information is being furnished to the Bureau for information and any appropriate action deemed advisable.

It is noted that this information is nebulous and vague and it is not anticipated that [redacted] will logically be receiving information regarding any future details of the alleged plot. It may be that some information has been received by the Bureau from other divisions similar. There is no indication that this plot is something which would develop locally in the Milwaukee Division; and talk of such a plot among the Italian hoodlum element would not be an unusual expectation in view of the former Attorney General's attacks on organized crime in this country.

No further action is being taken in this matter by the Milwaukee Division. The Bureau will be advised on the event the informant obtains any further information concerning this matter.

On July 29, 1935, a confidential source in Milwaukee, Wisconsin, who has furnished reliable information in the past and who is acquainted with some of the Italian hoodlum element in Milwaukee and Wisconsin, area advised as follows:

This source recently learned from an individual whom he was not in a position to identify that the Italian outfit (La Cosa Nostra) in this country wants to and allegedly are making plans to attack the characters of United States Senators Edward Kennedy and Robert Kennedy and their brother-in-law Peter Lawford. This is allegedly to be accomplished by working with outfit associates of Frank Sinatra to arrange for their women to be placed in compromising situations in the presence of any or all of the two Kennedys and Peter Lawford.

The confidential source who furnished this information was not in a position to evaluate its reliability or to approximate times, places, and details of how this alleged character assassination might be carried out. The confidential source did state that the individual from whom he heard this information is not a member of La Cosa Nostra but is an acquaintance of and ally of some La Cosa Nostra members, who were referred to by this source as Italian outfit members. In addition it was alleged that this plot was predicated by the attacks of the former Attorney General Robert Kennedy against organized crime.

Mrs. HAMMOND has two children, one a daughter who resides with the father, the other, a son who resides with her but is boarding in a school in New England. She spends some time each year in Switzerland.



Subject claimed he has \$1,200 cash retainer from "Look" Magazine in his possession, that "Look" Magazine took care of all expenses for the family trip home from China and is paying all of the family's current expenses. He also told his father "Look" Magazine has or will pay him enough money for he and his family to live in the United States for the next two years if he cannot find a job.

Subject claimed he had a job offer to teach English or World History at the University of California (University of California not further described). He also claimed to have unknown friend at Columbia University and stated he has job offers from other Universities but did not identify these schools. Subject asked his father if his wife and child could stay at the family farm at Fort Ann, New York if and when he made a trip to California. (Presumably for above job interview)

Subject told his father that he had had 3 or 4 hour conference with Senator TED KENNEDY in Hong Kong and that Senator KENNEDY promised to send the subject a book about his brother, JOHN F. KENNEDY.

We immediately alerted the U. S. Capitol Police, Metropolitan Police Department and the U. S. Secret Service. Mr. Wick's office alerted [redacted] Administrative Assistant to Senator Kennedy.

Richmond advises that they interviewed [redacted] at Rixeyville, Virginia, on 1/11/66, the uncle of [redacted] [redacted] acknowledged coming into the room and overhearing a portion of the conversation between his niece and the FBI in Washington on 1/10/66. He advised that at the time she was suffering from delirium tremens and that immediately thereafter he took her to the hospital at Culpeper, Virginia, where they placed her under sedation. [redacted] advised he is currently making an effort to have his niece committed to an institution, indicating she had previously been committed to the Westbrook Sanitarium in Richmond, Virginia.

[redacted] promised to make every effort to prevent his niece from making any calls such as this. Mrs. [redacted] was observed by Bureau Agents in the [redacted] residence on the afternoon of 1/11/66.



On January 10, 1966, a caller identifying herself as [redacted] (Mrs. [redacted]), [redacted] Rixeyville, Virginia, advised she was calling long distance from Rixeyville to warn of a plot to assassinate Senator Edward M. Kennedy on the steps of the Capitol Building in Washington, D.C. at 4 p.m. on January 11, 1966.

She stated she became aware of this plot when voices she had been hearing since last July or August had instructed her to perform the assassination. Although she later stated she had seen some "people" she could not further identify, outside her window last night, she stated initially she had never seen these people, did not know who they were and explained their ability to communicate with her by the fact the "house is wired." These voices had told her they had selected her to act on their behalf since she was attractive and could get close enough to the Senator to be able to shoot him. "They" were to pick her up at 8:30 a.m. January 11, 1966, to take her to Washington, D.C. and claimed that if she told anyone "they" would wipe out the whole Kennedy family.

When asked for information regarding her background, she stated the [redacted] was a cattle farm in Culpepper County, Virginia and she was not under a doctor's care at the present time. She admitted having an "alcohol problem" and to having been committed to the Westbrook Sanitorium, Richmond, Virginia, in August 1965, for two or three weeks. She heard the voices there also, and was told they were the result of "DT's" but she did not believe it. She explained she heard the voices mainly when her nerves are bad and she had been drinking. She stated she was calling from telephone number West 7-3291 and her husband was not home. When asked who was with her, she stated her aunt and uncle were there and when asked if her uncle would come to the telephone, she stated "he would just tell you I'm crazy," and then hung up.



On January 11, 1966, Virginia State Police Troopers [redacted] and [redacted] Culpeper, Virginia, State Police Barracks, advised they were well acquainted with [redacted] of Rixeyville, Virginia. Both advised that Mrs. [redacted] was an alcoholic and that they had received numerous false complaints made by her during periods she was under the influence of alcohol. Both advised that Mrs. [redacted] had resided with her husband at Rixeyville, Virginia, in a farm house across the street from an estate owned by her uncle, [redacted] owner of [redacted] and a wealthy estate owner. They advised that [redacted] in recent months, has been residing with her children at the [redacted] wife

Kennedy. [redacted] stated at the time of the call, she was suffering from delirium tremens and that after completion of the call, he had taken her to the Culpeper, Virginia, Hospital where she was treated by Dr. [redacted] who placed her under sedation and is treating her with antabuse. [redacted] stated that Mrs. [redacted] was presently in the [redacted] home under sedation. [redacted] advised he is currently making attempts to have Mrs. [redacted] committed and stated that during the past June and July, approximately, she had been committed to the Westbrook Sanitorium in Richmond, Virginia.

He stated that if any information came to our attention concerning Klan activities on other matters which might relate to the Senator's trip he assumed that this would be brought to the attention of the local authorities. He stated he had not heard of any Klan interests in the trip but if we should hear of anything, he would appreciate knowing of it.

Mr. [redacted] said that he had just received a call from an unknown male who made the following statement and hung up: "Senator Kennedy will be dead before Friday." According to [redacted], both Senators Kennedy are in Palm Beach.

Supervisor [redacted] advised that Miami is furnishing this information to the Palm Beach Police Department, Palm Beach Sheriff's Office and to Secret Service and if the Bureau approves, will have the Resident Agent in Palm Beach advise both Senators Kennedy if they are still in Palm Beach.

After checking, I told him this was agreeable, but that they should not insist on advising either of the Senators personally, but just advise someone traveling with them.

Mr. Wick is also advising a representative of Senator Robert F. Kennedy's office in Washington and the Washington Field Office is advising the Metropolitan Police Department and Secret Service at headquarters.

If this is not true she could not understand why they were discussing putting these children on tour rather than only discussing the question of special hospital care.

One cannot help but reflect that if the late Senator Joseph R. McCarthy had been caught so flagrantly wrong in a congressional inquiry as has been Sen. Edward M. Kennedy, D-Mass., there would have been no end to the lamentations and outcries of foul play.

The Kennedys are apparently immune to this kind of treatment from the journalistic and intellectual community because their names are deemed to be pure.

But it remains the fact that Teddy Kennedy was embarrassingly wrong when he impugned the testimony and motives of a metropolitan police officer from Nashville, Tenn., named John Sorace.

Capt. Sorace advised the Eastland committee concerning a federal amphetamine case a Nashville fireman named Fred Brooks. Brooks was a "liberation school" teacher Negroes how to get along with the help of funds of a Nashville poverty program.

Sorace spoke of Brooks being on the poverty program payroll, where his name was although he had not yet been paid and might technically be considered as not on an operative payroll. Teddy Kennedy rose in a heated indignation to defend the record of the poverty program headed by his brother-in-law, Sargent Shriver.

The poverty program, proclaimed Teddy, was implicated in an exact but unfortunate way and many of us believe that the poverty program is more related to the problems of riots in the poorer parts of the country than the anti-legislation (anti-riot) we are holding hearings on.

So the truth might catch up with us by Kennedy from

the Rev. J. Patrick Davis, chairman of the Nashville Metropolitan Action Committee, implying during that Brooks was on the poverty program payroll. The Mr. Davis then testified that his commission had incurred no expenses for the student summer project that involved the liberation school.

With great satisfaction Kennedy announced that Sorace's testimony had been "reconsidered" and added, "I am just hoping that the truth will catch up with what is falsehood."

Brooks did his part by telling an interviewer from the Nashville News-Sun that Sorace "is a liar and should be killed," which was duly published under the headline, "Will Sorace Brooks Says."

Brooks, upon arriving back home in Nashville, Mr. Davis quickly found it necessary to correct himself in a long telegram to Senator William Eastland, D-Miss. He had discovered that in fact the commission financed by Sargent Shriver's poverty program had indeed agreed to pay rentals to house teachers and aides for the liberation school and furnish supplies.

It was not true that the commission had incurred no expenses for the student summer project. It appeared furthermore that Mr. Davis' statement that Fred Brooks was not on the payroll, that his application "has not yet been acted upon," was a charitable interpretation.

So there was no longer any doubt that poverty funds were involved in Brooks' project. It was a school so rich hatred of whites, and Teddy Kennedy had clouded up the facts out of his emotional belief that poverty is the primary cause of revolutionary activity by 20-year-old extremists.

Eastland's comment with respect to Sorace's testimony was, "We have substantiated what he said."

This is not the first indication that the poverty program gave a helping hand to the riot and

hatred matters. There is evidence of it in Newark, Cleveland, Buffalo and other cities, and it is to the credit to Teddy Kennedy that he would try to create a contrary impression.

His smug satisfaction that he had blown out of the water a false charge and had thus brought discredit upon the Eastland committee was another reflection of his righteous, but mistaken, optimism.

It is not only the fuzzy sense of so many people that will not direct them to the specific circumstances which have been obscured in the riots, but which to wander off into the generalities of thickets and black society in general and all the members individually for condition, they had no part in creating.

Senator James Eastland called me at 2:55 p.m., 8/18/67 to advise, in strict confidence, that his committee had voted late yesterday to form a subcommittee, composed of Senators Ted Kennedy, Philip Hart, and himself. He stated this subcommittee was formed for the purpose of making specific and final decisions on the identity of witnesses to be called for future hearings. He stated this action was needed in view of the many controversies that had been raised by Senators Kennedy and Hart as to various witnesses who should be called.

The subcommittee met in Senator Eastland's office last night, 8/17/67. There was considerable wrangling. Senator Kennedy insisted on the Director and the AG being called. Senator Hart was lukewarm concerning the matter. Senator Eastland was very much against the Director and the AG being called and specifically told Kennedy and Hart that he would not under any circumstances agree to either the Director or the AG being called. Eventually the three men on the subcommittee reached unanimous agreement that the Director and the AG would not be bothered. This action was supposed to be for the record and final in nature.

Senator Eastland told me that, much to his disgust, Senator Kennedy, immediately following the subcommittee meeting, went out in the hallway and met with three reporters. He told these reporters, point-blank, that the subcommittee had voted unanimously to invite Mr. Hoover to appear before the Senate Judiciary Committee. Senator Eastland stated this, of course, was a lie and both he and Senator Hart were very much put out about Kennedy's actions.

Senator Eastland stated he wanted to know the above information inasmuch as he had given his word that the Director would not be called and he intended to keep his word, regardless of pressure brought by Kennedy or anyone else.

MEMORANDUM FOR MR. TOLSON

Mr. DeLoach called and advised that Senator Eastland had advised that the Senate Judiciary Committee yesterday voted a Subcommittee of Eastland, Ted Kennedy, and Philip Hart would get together and decide who would be called to testify before the crime hearings. Later they met last night in Eastland's office; had an argument as to who would be called; finally reached a unanimous agreement to call John McCone as scheduled, people from Detroit, and a number of other individuals, but would not call either the Attorney General or me.

Eastland told Mr. DeLoach that after the meeting, Ted Kennedy met three reporters and made an announcement that they had voted unanimously to call me. Eastland said this is a lie and even Senator Hart was angry and shocked at the way Ted Kennedy behaved; that they would not call me under any circumstances. I said this shows what an irresponsible persons Ted Kennedy is.

Mr. DeLoach further advised that he has all the testimony and he has a firm agreement - informally - with [redacted] that he can keep this over here in his office until we get through with it and can make any changes we want. I asked how it looked and if the stenotypist got all of it. Mr. DeLoach said she was not a good girl and missed a lot of it. I instructed him to go over it very carefully and let me see it. Mr. DeLoach advised that it will probably be Monday before they get through with it. I said this is all right.

On June 10, 1968, [redacted] George Hotel, 906 Howard Street, San Francisco, California, telephoned the FBI office to advise that a note was found in the outgoing mail box at the hotel signed by [redacted], Room 302, which was addressed "Mailman, give this to a police, please." The contents of the note read as follows:

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"There are people wandering around the place where I live shouting out they are going to do the same thing to Ted Kennedy. They speak in Spanish and sometimes in English but generally in Spanish. I live at George Hotel, Howard and 5th. I only want to be in peace with myself if something will happen.

(Sgd.) [redacted]"

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[redacted] was not available for interview this date, nor could anyone be located who knew where he was employed or could be reached.

[redacted] made available the note, which was given to Special Agent [redacted], U. S. Secret Service, 450 Golden Gate Avenue, San Francisco, at the time this information was furnished orally to him on June 10, 1968, at 2:30 P.M.

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[redacted] stated his records show that [redacted] had registered at the hotel on May 9, 1968, and listed his home as Miami, Florida. He said that [redacted] had lived at the hotel since that time and did not appear to be an itinerant type of person as he had received letters from [redacted] Chicago, Illinois, and [redacted], Tampa, Florida, among others.

[redacted] was unable to identify who the Spanish-speaking persons referred to in the note might be as many of the residents of the hotel, as well as the general area, speak Spanish.

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This information was also furnished to [redacted], Intelligence Unit of the San Francisco Police Department, on 6/10/68 at 3 PM.





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On June 10, 1968, [REDACTED] General Telephone Company, (Gentelco), Tampa, Florida, telephonically advised the Tampa Office of the Federal Bureau of Investigation that on June 9, 1968, an unidentified individual calling from a pay phone in the Tampa, Florida area had attempted to telephonically contact Mrs. Jacqueline Kennedy, Joseph Kennedy and Senator Ted Kennedy at the Kennedy residence at Hyannis Port, Massachusetts. This individual indicated to the telephone company operator at Hyannis Port that he had information that there was to be another Kennedy assassinated. The telephone company ascertained the location of the pay phone, contacted the Tampa Police Department, which in turn located an individual at the pertinent pay phone and reportedly took him into custody.

Special Agent in Charge Arnold Peppers, U. S. Secret Service, Tampa, was telephonically advised of the above information at 9:30 a.m., June 10, 1968, by Special Agent John A. Ambler.

On June 10, 1968, Captain [REDACTED] Patrol Division, Tampa Police Department, advised Special Agents of the FBI that on June 9, 1968, the Tampa Police Department, acting on information received from the telephone company, had dispatched a patrol car to investigate an individual reportedly calling the Kennedy residence in Massachusetts from a pay phone located at the corner of Polk and Florida in Tampa, Florida. Police officers who responded to this call located a man who identified himself as [REDACTED] in this phone booth and on determining [REDACTED] was quite intoxicated, took him into custody. Captain [REDACTED] said he had determined that this individual was subsequently placed in the Tampa Jail.

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Captain [redacted] further advised that a representative of the U. S. Secret Service had been furnished on June 10, 1968, with all information obtained by the Tampa Police Department concerning this incident.

On June 10, 1968, Special Agents of the FBI reviewed records of the Tampa Police Department, which records reflected that [redacted], Tampa Police Department #139393, was arrested at 6:45 P.M., June 9, 1968, at the corner of Polk and Florida, Tampa, Florida, on Drunk charges by Officers [redacted] and [redacted]. [redacted] appeared before a local magistrate on June 10, 1968, and as a result of the Drunk charges, was fined \$25.00 or twenty-five days. He was then remanded to the Tampa Police Department stockade and as of the evening of June 10, 1968, was still in custody. At the time of his arrest, the following descriptive information was obtained:

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No other record identifiable with [redacted] could be located in the files of the Tampa Police Department.

On June 10, 1968, Officer [redacted] Tampa Police Department, advised Special Agents of the FBI that on June 9, 1968, he and Officer [redacted] had responded to a radio call to investigate a man making a phone call from a phone booth located at the corner of Polk and Florida, Tampa, Florida. On arriving there, they found a white male standing by the telephone, holding the receiver. The man appeared to be in a stupor and it was their opinion that he was quite intoxicated. The investigating officers asked this individual what he was doing and he informed them he was attempting to call someone in Massachusetts. It was observed by the officers that approximately 35¢ in coins lay on the phone booth platform. They

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[redacted]

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then interviewed him concerning his identity which he readily furnished, informing them that he was working for former Alabama Governor George Wallace. He told them he was quite concerned about the assassination of Senator Robert F. Kennedy and pointed out that this was the second member of the Kennedy Family who had been murdered. In discussing this assassination, the murder of Rev. Dr. Martin Luther King was discussed and [redacted] stated to the officers that he was not sorry about this and in fact, wished that all Negroes in this country would be killed. In view of [redacted] intoxicated condition, the officers took him into custody on Drunk charges and informed him of this decision. He then asked them to call former Alabama Governor George Wallace who would see to it that he, [redacted], would be released. Officer [redacted] recalled that [redacted] appeared to be quite nervous and upset when discussing the assassination of Senator Robert F. Kennedy.

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Officer [redacted] Tampa Police Department, was interviewed by Special Agents of the FBI on June 10, 1968, and furnished substantially the same information as that provided by Officer [redacted]. Officer [redacted] recalled that on arriving at the phone booth, the individual later determined to be [redacted] was holding the receiver and staring into space as if in a trance. [redacted] said he took the receiver from [redacted] hand and spoke into the telephone to attempt to determine with whom [redacted] had been speaking. He said he believed that a telephone company operator was on the line, but that the connection was extremely poor and that he was unable to understand her although he obtained the impression that she was a long-distance operator in Massachusetts.

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On June 11, 1968, [redacted] Gentelco, Tampa, advised a Special Agent of the FBI that he had subsequently determined from local operator [redacted] that at 6:05 PM, June 9, 1968, an individual calling from a pay phone in Tampa had attempted to reach the residence of Senator Ted Kennedy at Hyannis Port, Massachusetts, but that no one answered the phone. This individual then told the operator it was imperative he speak with some member of the Kennedy family, if possible either Joseph Kennedy or Mrs. Jacqueline Kennedy. The operator determined these individuals have unlisted telephone numbers and therefore consulted with the chief operator at Hyannis Port to determine whether the call could be put through to the Kennedy residence. Assistant chief operator [redacted] at Hyannis Port, Massachusetts took the call and indicated that prior to placing it, the identity of the individual

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calling and the purpose of the call should, if possible, be determined. [redacted] apparently then spoke with the caller and on receiving the impression that he was either intoxicated or mentally unbalanced, notified the Tampa operator and requested that the location of the phone booth from which the call was being made be determined. The local operator was able to ascertain the call was placed from Tampa telephone #229-9761, a pay phone located at the corner of Polk and Florida in Tampa and this information was furnished to the Hyannis Port operator who in turn apparently notified the Tampa Police Department and requested that the caller be investigated.

On June 11, 1968, [redacted] U. S. Secret Service, Tampa, advised a Special Agent of the FBI that he had interviewed the captioned individual concerning this incident.

[redacted] informed [redacted] he had no permanent residence, but could be reached through a sister who resided at [redacted] Memphis, Tennessee. He said he receives mail through General Delivery, Tampa, Florida, and has no fixed residence in Tampa. He advised [redacted] he was formerly a patient at the Veterans' Administration Hospital, Ft. Lyon, Colorado where he had been treated for nervousness, prior to being released in July, 1967.

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[redacted] told [redacted] that on June 9, 1968, he had been in an unidentified bar in St. Petersburg, Florida, and while there, had overheard two men, identities unknown to him, discussing the assassination of Senator Robert F. Kennedy and talking about the Kennedy Family in general. [redacted] apparently believed he heard the men discussing the murder of another Kennedy, but said the men had not confided this information to him and that he had only overheard portions of their conversation. He indicated this was the purpose of his attempted phone call to the Kennedy residence from Tampa, Florida, on June 9, 1968.

On June 14, 1968, Mr. [REDACTED]

[REDACTED] advised that on Sunday, June 9, 1968, he attended a gathering to meet the intended in-laws of his [REDACTED]. He stated that the father of the bridegroom to be is a Mr. [REDACTED] [REDACTED] Atlanta, Georgia. *TRIFOLION-1*

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Mr. [REDACTED] stated that during the course of the gathering they talked about Senator Robert F. Kennedy and the recent events occurring in Los Angeles, California. He said that Mr. [REDACTED] then questioned himself and Mr. [REDACTED] as to their religious beliefs, which happened to be Episcopalian. Mr. [REDACTED] stated that "Mr. [REDACTED] then brought up the subject of the K.K.K., and his short harangue ran along the lines of 'I said: K.K.K. - Kennedy, King, and Kennedy. Get it? K.K.K. Now there is only one to go - Teddy'". *B. APR 67*

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Mr. [REDACTED] described Mr. [REDACTED] as being white male, approximately [REDACTED] years of age, wife [REDACTED]. He stated that Mr. [REDACTED] seemed to be somewhat uneducated and apparently was in the trades of some sort. He also advised that the [REDACTED] son, [REDACTED], was presently a junior at Georgia State College.

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The foregoing information is being made available to United States Secret Service, Atlanta, 111th Military Intelligence Group, Ft. McPherson, Georgia, and DeKalb County Police Department.

On June 20, 1968, Detective Lieutenant [REDACTED] [REDACTED] Kankakee Police Department, Kankakee, Illinois, advised that [REDACTED] was arrested on June 18, 1968, on a battery charge (City Ordinance) and posted a \$25.00 bond and was released.

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His residence at the time of arrest was [REDACTED] Kankakee, Illinois.

Lieutenant [REDACTED] advised that he had received information that [REDACTED] had reportedly made a statement in the presence of [REDACTED] at the City National Bank which statement was something pertaining to [REDACTED] having a gun.

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On June 20, 1968, [REDACTED] [REDACTED] City National Bank, Kankakee, Illinois, advised that about two days after Senator ROBERT KENNEDY was shot and killed, [REDACTED] came into the bank, walked over to his desk, and while he was talking to a customer, [REDACTED] pounded his fist on [REDACTED] desk and said, "The damned KENNEDYS," and "I have a gun," or something to that effect as best [REDACTED] could recall.

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He stated that [REDACTED] then walked away and went to one of the teller's counter and subsequently left the bank.

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On June 20, 1968, CARL W. FEICKERT, United States Attorney, Eastern District of Illinois, East St. Louis, Illinois, was telephonically contacted and furnished information regarding [REDACTED] background, his commitment to the Federal Medical Center, Springfield, Missouri; previous commitments to the Illinois State Hospital, threats on former President DWIGHT D. EISENHOWER, statement [REDACTED] made at the desk of [REDACTED], City National Bank, Kankakee; and information regarding [REDACTED] call to Albuquerque on June 6, 1968, and his statement made during conversation with Officer [REDACTED] [REDACTED] Jailer, during telephone contact.

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Mr. [REDACTED] advised he did not consider the statement an attempt to extort as defined under the Extortion Statute, but merely a threat.

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He advised that he would desire that the State's Attorney, Kankakee County, be apprised of [REDACTED] present activity and that the State's Attorney consider committing [REDACTED] to a state mental hospital.

On June 20, 1968, Detective Lieutenant [REDACTED] [REDACTED], Kankakee Police Department, and [REDACTED] State's Attorney, Kankakee County, Illinois, were advised of Mr. [REDACTED] desire.

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Mr. [REDACTED] advised that he was willing to comply with Mr. [REDACTED] desire if a complaint could be filed.

Lieutenant [REDACTED] advised that he was certain a complaint could be filed. On June 21, 1968, Lieutenant [REDACTED] again advised that he is sure a complaint could be filed and that [REDACTED] would be arrested within the next two or three days.

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He stated that as soon as [REDACTED] is arrested he will be examined by a physician and will then be committed to a state institution on advice of the Kankakee County State's Attorney.

Mr. [redacted] advised that he was unable to secure the identity of the car that the individual was driving but through the assistance of the maitre de and a waitress, both of whose names he could not recall, they ascertained through the American Express Credit Card #0531818490, he used was presumably in his own name and identified him as [redacted] Wayne Supply Company, Wayne, New Jersey. He could offer no further information concerning this incident but feels that the maitre de and waitress may have further information and could corroborate his information.

LEONARD L. EDWARDS

At 2:00 P.M., on June 24, 1968, Assistant Chief of Police [redacted], Mountain View, California, Police Department, advised that on June 22, 1968, his department received a telephone call from [redacted], Mountain View, California, in which [redacted] stated as follows:

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One of his neighbors, LEONARD L. EDWARDS, white, male, American, 2400 El Camino Real, Space 40, Mountain View, was acting strangely and made some peculiar remarks to him about a week ago. At that time he observed that EDWARDS had two handguns in his possession, one in each hip pocket. One of the guns was a luger P-38 and the other was a .38 caliber S & W. They were talking in the trailer court about weapons, and the subject of shooting and politics came up. [redacted] said it was too bad that BOBBY KENNEDY had been shot, and that since he was gone, his brother TED would probably now run for the Presidency. At that point EDWARDS said, "Well, we will kill that son of a bitch, too, if he runs." EDWARDS further indicated to [redacted] that he had been in the Watts Area at the time of the riot, and at that time they had numerous weapons in their possession and were ready to use them against any Negro people in the area if they came in. [redacted] said he did not know whether or not EDWARDS had any intention of committing a crime, but he thought by the way he talked he might be connected with some organization of the type that would commit such offenses. [redacted] said EDWARDS is employed as a painter and owns a 1964 Chevrolet pickup truck, green in color, California license S54392, which is registered to him and [redacted] at the above address.

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Special Agent [redacted], U. S. Secret Service, San Francisco, was advised of the above at 3:15 P.M., June 24, 1968, by Special Agent [redacted]

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Mr. [redacted] Mountain View, was interviewed on June 24, 1968, and advised as follows:

This confirms telephonic information furnished to [redacted] on [redacted] AM [redacted] PM by [redacted] at [redacted]

He is acquainted with LEONARD L. EDWARDS, who lives in Space 40 at the above address. EDWARDS resides there with his wife, [redacted], and they have been there about a year and a half. EDWARDS is semi-retired and a painter by trade. His wife sells real estate.

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On Saturday, June 8, 1968, the day of ROBERT KENNEDY's funeral, he [redacted] watched the funeral on television and was particularly moved by the eulogy given by Senator KENNEDY at the funeral service. Some time during the morning he saw EDWARDS in the street outside the trailers and they began talking about politics. The shooting of ROBERT KENNEDY came up. At that time EDWARDS made some strange remarks which he [redacted] thought should be reported. [redacted] mentioned that it was too bad that BOBBY KENNEDY had been shot, and that he had just seen EDWARD KENNEDY on television, and that EDWARD KENNEDY probably now would run for the Presidency. [redacted] then said, "When we don't like them in California, we kill them," and then mentioning Senator EDWARD KENNEDY, said, "We'll kill that son of a bitch, too, if he runs."

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EDWARDS also mentioned that he had been in the Watts Area at the time of the riots, and that they all had guns ready to go in case the Negroes came into their area, but the police told them to hold off.

At various times during the past several months he has seen EDWARDS walking around the streets of the trailer court with handguns in his hip pockets. One of the guns is a German luger while the other is a .38 caliber Smith and Wesson. EDWARDS did not have any guns with him on the morning of June 8 when they were talking about the KENNEDYs. He has not seen the guns recently.

He knows of no criminal activities of EDWARDS or that he has any criminal or undesirable associates. He knows of no organizations that EDWARDS belongs to, although EDWARDS' wife once said she belonged to the John Birch Society.

EDWARDS has a boat, and he and his wife go camping quite frequently for several days at a time. They go by themselves.

He has no knowledge that EDWARDS was in the Los Angeles area at the time ROBERT KENNEDY was shot, and no information to indicate that he had any connection with that shooting.

EDWARDS does not drink except on occasion, but he does not believe EDWARDS was drinking on the morning of June 8, 1968.

He described EDWARDS as white, male, American, age 55-60, 5'10", weight 200 pounds, build stocky, hair brown, eyes brown, complexion dark. EDWARDS owns a 1964 Chevrolet pickup truck, California license S54392, which is registered to EDWARDS and his wife.

On June 26, 1968, ^{MRS.} LEONARD LAWRENCE EDWARDS, 2400 El Camino Real, space 40, Mountain View, advised as follows:

He and his wife, ^{EDWARDS} ^{Calif.} live in a trailer at the above address, having moved there in the Spring of 1966. Prior to that they lived in a trailer in Torrance, California. He is semi-retired, having reached the age of 65. He formerly was a painting contractor at Sunnyvale, California. He now works only at odd jobs on rare occasions. His wife is a real estate saleswoman employed by Fred Miller Realty, Mountain View. She handles sales of trailer parks in Northern California, and they take frequent trips throughout Northern California in connection with her business.

He recalled that early in June, 1968, on the day that Senator ROBERT KENNEDY was shot, they left Mountain View for a trip to Trinidad, which is located in the extreme Northern portion of California. They returned at the end of that week to Mountain View.

He has no recollection whatsoever of making any statements concerning the death of ROBERT KENNEDY or any threats to the life of Senator EDWARD KENNEDY. He specifically does not recall saying "When we don't like them in California, we kill them," and "We will kill that son of a bitch, too, if he runs." He feels certain he made no such statements to anyone, and he would not go around making such statements as he does not believe in violence.

He does not belong to any organizations of any kind, nor does he associate with any individuals engaged in criminal activities or who believe in violence. He has never been arrested.

He and his wife were living in a trailer court in Torrance, California, at the time of the riots in Watts. He and other men organized a defense group under the supervision of the local sheriff to defend the trailer camp in case rioters came to their area; however, no action was taken as nothing happened in that vicinity. He did consider it to be a frightening experience.

He owns several guns as follows:

An old 30-03 modified Army rifle which he formerly used for deer hunting.
 An Ithica 16-gauge shotgun which he used for hunting pheasant and ducks.
 A .38 caliber Smith and Wesson Cobra five-shot detective-model revolver which he used for target shooting.
 A 9-millimeter German luger pre-World War II which he has as a collector's item.
 A .45 DA Smith and Wesson which he used for target shooting. He last used the gun in Oregon in 1964 when he went pheasant hunting.

He keeps the above guns in the trailer but does not carry them around in the open.

This afternoon [Redacted] telephoned the Bureau and spoke to SA [Redacted] of the Crime Research Section.

[Redacted] was extremely difficult to understand, but it appeared that he had overheard a plot to kidnap Senator Kennedy, hold him for ransom and, after collecting the ransom, the Senator would be killed. [Redacted] was unable to identify these alleged plotters over the telephone, but it appeared that they may have been tenants in the same apartment building where he resides in Brooklyn, New York.

SA [Redacted] of the New York Office was telephonically advised concerning this matter and Agents of that office have been sent to interview [Redacted] for further details. [Redacted] advised that he would also notify the New York office of Secret Service.

SA [Redacted] of the Secret Service here in Washington was also apprised concerning this threat, and SA David W. Bowers of the Crime Research Section has advised Don Haider in Senator Kennedy's office.

SA [Redacted] of the Washington Field Office was also informed concerning this matter and he would make arrangements to immediately notify local authorities including the Capitol and Metropolitan Police Department.



Reverend [redacted], Pastor, Salem Baptist Church, Route 3, Apex, North Carolina, on July 10, 1968, advised a member of his church, [redacted], who resides on [redacted] Apex, has recently been overheard to state he plans to do away with the third KENNEDY, namely Senator EDWARD KENNEDY. In this regard, he stated [redacted] has been observed practicing with a high-powered rifle in the rear of his residence on [redacted] Apex, North Carolina, apparently in preparation for carrying out his stated plan.

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[redacted] stated [redacted] is an elder in his church, but in his opinion is mentally unbalanced to some degree. He has no information indicating [redacted] has ever been arrested or has ever been treated for mental disorders. [redacted] is of the opinion that [redacted] is merely talking, but because of his mental condition thinks he could be capable of doing harm, and therefore feels appropriate authorities should be advised of the statements [redacted] has made.

He was unable to furnish any additional details concerning specific statements or activities of [redacted] in this regard. He expressed a willingness to cooperate with any Federal officers who may conduct an investigation concerning [redacted]. 

Dear Sir:

What I have to write is in no way intended to discredit the FBI, and only do so as a concerned citizen. I've discovered leaks out of the Manhattan office of the FBI into the mob. Whether collusion is involved I don't know ^{and} personally hope it can be attributed to carelessness on the part of an agent or agents in possible idle conversation on the outside that was picked up and passed on, rather than ^a ~~betray~~ ^{at} of a public trust.

I had occasion to phone the Manhattan office of the FBI several weeks ago to report a threat overheard against Sen. Edward Kennedy's life. The threat was made in the Stanley Erickson Post of the American Legion in my neighborhood. The individual involved, [Redacted], described himself as German-Irish and remarked to me out of the blue: "We're out to get Ted Kennedy now. He ~~and~~ and his family are traitors to their country." Chances are the threat was made in idle jest, but because of recent events I did not want to take the risk and overlook it, so I reported to the FBI's Manhattan office. I told the agent that if his office thought the threat worth following up, I'd be at the Post against the following Sunday, since [Redacted] indicated to me he would show up again then. [Redacted] is not a member of the Post, which is open to the general public on Sunday mornings. As it turned out, [Redacted] never showed up and if he did he would have been barred. A complaint he urinated at the rear of the Post in full view of tenants in surrounding buildings. *I the day we met.*

Yesterday (Sunday) I was warned that "some people in the neighborhood don't want any Feds around." I mentioned to no one the possibility of Agents showing up in the neighborhood. Please realize that my position today with the mob is extremely tenuous and the hoods are not about to take much more nonsense from me. Not that I'm involved in any way anymore in crusading activities beyond lipping off once in a while when the mood hits me. But as harmless as the phone call to the FBI ~~was~~ ^{and} seems, the information conveyed, the hoods are constantly wary of me or of any calls I might make to the FBI. I followed up the phone call to the Manhattan office with a letter, giving fuller details of the threat and the individual making it.

Another leak I discovered occurred about 8 months ago. It had been falsely rumored that I had sold out to the mob. Who started the rumor I don't know. I had written a letter at the time to the FBI's Manhattan office denying the rumor and lamenting my tribulations with the rackets over the years. While in mob circles a week later I overheard a conversation relating to the contents of my letter to the FBI. While I had nothing revealing or earth-shaking in my letter, which could be dismissed as an ordinary letter, could be easily mistaken as something of informative value possibly feared by the mob, which could place my life in jeopardy. But since the mob knew of the contents of the letter, it had to be a leak since I had mentioned it to no one else.

The possibility of leaks is just between you and me and not for broadcast, but would be willing to help your office trace them out should you be so willing. But you'll have to give me a chance to heal up first. I have an extremely painful physical condition for which I'm being medically treated. For some reason or other the slightest physical exertion, even walking, cause^s pain in my

left arm and shoulder. Sometimes the pain is so intense and paralyzing that it stops me cold when walking in the street. My physician is trying to find out the cause of the pain, which he attributed² partly to palpitation of the heart, leading to muscular spasm². Ironically, I get no pain, or rather I don't feel any pain at all when boozing it up, and I've been doing plenty of ~~the~~^{that} lately; sour grapes I guess.

Frankly, I don't particularly look forward to tracing out the leaks, though I've learned to be pretty good at this sort of a thing. I'm not the old work horse anymore and wilt easier under pressure. Moreover, the loss of my leg doesn't make it easier. As you are aware, this sort of thing is risky business, but having my life threatened more than 30 times directly or indirectly over a period of years, one gets used to this sort of thing. For that matter I'm doing pretty good in this respect lately. I haven't been threat^{ned} outright for more than six months. ~~That~~ The last one occurred on New Year's day at night when walking with my wife. A gink popped out of no where and threatened to knock me off. I told the wife to keep walking and the incident was overlooked. At least my wife got the opportunity to see what I had been going through ~~over~~ over the years. What ~~the threat~~ provoked the threat, I don't know, but sometimes I've got a big fat mouth and chances are I provoked a hood when I had a half a load on.

Frankly I've never been quite the same upon learning of the pipeline the mob had² into the White House. I, like many others, looked at the presidency as the Great White Father, and discovery of the pipeline proved quite disillusioning. The discovery itself proved my undoing and prob^bably accounted for the theft of the instruments in the VA hospital which cancelled my operation and led to a chain of events which led to the loss of my leg.

Please try to indicate to me in some way if you'd like me to help trace out the leaks, but please give me a little time to heal

Incidentally my last big blast occurred a couple of years ago when I shook up Police Commissioner Leary's confidential investigation unit. It turned out the cops were keeping a "phony" file on me though I have no criminal record of any sort. A detective from the ~~file~~ unit insisted with my wife that I had a brother in Chicago with an Italian name, intimating that he was a hood. This proved rather revealing, since the only brother I had went down with his ship in the Navy during World War II. The ~~incident~~ revelation was made during an investigation I had instigated. I needed something like this like a hole in the head at the time ~~since~~ *since* I had just undergone five operations or equivalents in medical procedures and was in no particular mood to do battle. For that matter I was a little looney at the time from the physical shock of the operations, one of which I barely recovered from.

A member of Senator Edward Kennedy's staff has advised that captioned individual contacted the Senator's office several months ago claiming to have been hired by the Senator after they met on a plane. He has since contacted the office on various occasions seeking employment and has always been turned down.

On August 2, 1968, he gained admittance to the Senator's Washington residence by telling the caretaker that he was a member of the Senator's staff. The Senator's secretary found him at the residence and put him out.

On August 4, 1968, subject reportedly attempted to gain passage on a commercial airline flight from Washington to Boston by claiming to be a member of the Senator's staff and demanding that someone be removed from the plane to make room for him. He reportedly has contacted the Senator's office in Boston and the Kennedy residence in Hyannis at various times claiming to be a member of the Senator's staff and asking that an automobile be sent to provide him transportation.

[redacted] in the office of Senator Edward Kennedy, (D-Mass.) on 8-5-68 advised Special Agent Bowers that captioned individual has become a "pest" and she wanted to make the information concerning him a matter of record with the FBI. She stated that several months ago [redacted] called the Senator's office and claimed he had met the Senator on a plane and had been hired by the Senator to join his staff. His story was not true and he was not hired. Since that time he has contacted the office at various times seeking employment and he also has filed an application for appointment as a summer intern.

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He has become increasingly more of a problem in recent weeks and on 8-2-68 he went to the Senator's residence and gained access to the house by telling the caretaker that he was on the Senator's staff. The Senator's personal secretary [redacted] found him in the residence and put him out. Later in the day he called the Senator's office seeking an invitation to a private party being held that evening for the staff.

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On Sunday, 8-4-68 he attempted to board a commercial flight to Boston and when told there was no space on the plane he claimed to be a member of Senator Kennedy's staff and demanded that someone be taken off the plane to make room for him. The airlines subsequently called the Senator's office and reported this incident.

Miss [redacted] stated she has since learned that [redacted] at times has called the Senator's Boston office claiming to be a member of the staff and instructing the office to have a car meet him at the airport or at some other location. He apparently also has called the Kennedy residence at Hyannis, Massachusetts, asking that a car be sent to pick him up at various places.

 - (b) Expressions of strong or violent anti-U. S. sentiment;
 - (c) Prior acts (including arrests or convictions) or conduct or statements indicating a propensity for violence and antipathy toward good order and government.
6. Individuals involved in illegal bombing or illegal bomb-making.

On August 6, 1968, [redacted], Office of Protective Services, Library of Congress, Washington, D. C., furnished to a Special Agent of the Federal Bureau of Investigation an envelope containing a copy of SEPIA magazine, issue of August, 1968, and a copy of a booklet entitled "The Assassination of R.F.K."

The envelope was postmarked Chicago, Illinois, July 28, 1968, and was addressed to Warjaci L. Johnson and Senat i Congres. Warjaci Washington, D.C. (Warjaci is a Polish word for crazy). On the upper left corner appears the name [redacted]. On the inside of the flap there is a rambling senseless sentence in Polish and the name [redacted]

There are a number of scribbled annotations in Polish on both of the publications, much of which is illegible. Written across the flag draped coffin (of Robert F. Kennedy) appearing on the cover of SEPIA is the notation "My money in the coffin--to court-. Washington, D. C., The Kennedy Idiots Senate & Congress & Lyndon Johnson from the year 1636 I gave to the horses."

On page eight of SEPIA there is written across the pictures of President John F. Kennedy, Senator Robert F. Kennedy and Dr. Martin Luther King, Jr., the phrase: "behind bars with the evil bastards, bandits and thieves."

Across the bottom of the page there is written: "away with the tyrants to court."
