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

Re: Freedom of Information Act Request HQ-2010-00130-F

Dear Mr. Greenewald:

This is the of the Office of Inspector General (OIG) response to your request for information that you sent to the Department of Energy (DOE) under the Freedom of Information Act (FOIA), 5 U.S.C. 552. You asked for a copy of all records that pertain to investigation number I05SR008, "WMD Terror Threat; Savannah River Site; Aiken, SC."

The OIG has completed the search of its files and identified 31 documents responsive to your request. A review of the responsive documents and a determination concerning their release has been made pursuant to the FOIA, 5 U.S.C. 552. Certain information has been withheld pursuant to subsections (b)(6) and (b)(7)(C) of the Act, or Exemptions 6 and 7(C), respectively.

Documents 2 and 3, 12 through 26, and 29 through 31 are released with information withheld pursuant to Exemptions 6 and 7(C). Documents 1 and 4 through 11 are released in their entirety.

Exemption 6 protects from disclosure "personnel and medical and similar files the disclosure of which would constitute a clearly unwarranted invasion of personal privacy. . . ." ." Exemption 7(C) provides that "records or information compiled for law enforcement purposes" may be withheld from disclosure, but only to the extent the production of such documents "could reasonably be expected to constitute an unwarranted invasion of personal privacy. . . ."

Names and information that would tend to disclose the identity of certain individuals have been withheld pursuant to Exemptions 6 and 7(C). Individuals involved in OIG investigations, which in this case include subjects, witnesses, sources of information, and other individuals, are entitled to privacy protections so that they will be free from harassment, intimidation and other personal intrusions.

To the extent permitted by law, the DOE, in accordance with Title 10, Code of Federal Regulations (C.F.R.), Section 1004.1, will make available records it is authorized to withhold pursuant to the FOIA unless it determines such disclosure is not in the public interest.

In invoking Exemptions 6 and 7(C), we have determined that it is not in the public interest to release the withheld material. In this request, we have determined that the public interest in the identity of individuals who appear in investigative files does not outweigh these individuals' privacy interests. Those interests include being free from intrusions into their professional and private lives.

Documents 27 and 28 originated with the DOE's Savannah River Operations Office (SROO) or a contractor under the purview of that office. The documents have been forwarded to SROO for a determination concerning their releasability. They will respond directly to you concerning the documents.

As required, all releasable information has been segregated from the material that is withheld and is provided to you. See 10 C.F.R. 1004.7(b)(3).

This decision may be appealed within 30 calendar days from your receipt of this letter pursuant to 10 C.F.R. 1004.8. Appeals should be addressed to the Director, Office of Hearings and Appeals, HG-1/L'Enfant Plaza Building, U.S. Department of Energy, 1000 Independence Avenue, S.W., Washington, DC 20585-1615.

Thereafter, judicial review will be available to you in the federal district court either (1) in the district where you reside, (2) where you have your principal place of business, (3) where the Department's records are situated, or (4) in the District of Columbia.

Pessimism takes hold of SRS workers

Pessimism takes hold of SRS workers

AIKEN - John Wetherbee says his Savannah River Site colleagues were growing disheartened well before the Jan. 18 announcement that 400 people would be laid off.

"There is plenty of concern about the shrinking environment at SRS," said Mr. Wetherbee, who was among those let go. "People talk about that all the time."

For Mr. Wetherbee, a career engineer who'd already been laid off once before, in 1997, his release came as a sort of blessing.

"For the last 10 years I've wanted to go into business," the 48-year-old said.

The University of Florida graduate is well positioned to pursue his goal. As part of his severance package, he's getting his salary for most of the next two months - and will receive a week's pay for each of the 19 years he worked at the site.

He'll also get medical and dental insurance benefits, along with half his pension.

For others, losing their jobs won't be so easy. And, as threatening letters mailed to two top site executives in the days after the layoffs suggested, the process has been unnerving for some.

The letters - which were mailed to Westinghouse Savannah River Co. President Bob Pedde, who leads the private company that manages SRS, and Bechtel Savannah River Inc. President Larry Simmons - appear to be the most extreme form of backlash most can remember after layoffs at the site.

Those laid off and those employed have overwhelmingly condemned the threats.

"I hope they catch those who did it quickly," one person wrote at a chat room for SRS employees at www.ourchat.net. "We don't need people like that floating around here. We don't need a term like 'going postal' to get started about SRS employees."

The latest round of layoffs dropped the site's work force to about 11,000 people. It's supposed to be followed by another cutback of 800 people in coming months.

Without new missions from the U.S. Department of Energy or other federal agencies and the private sector, the site's work force is projected to drop to about 5,000 in the decades to come.

Site managers have stayed optimistic.

Mr. Pedde told the SRS Citizens Advisory Board on Tuesday that he estimated the next round of layoffs "won't come close" to the 500-800 mark.

He also expressed optimism that construction would start soon on a plant at SRS that would convert plutonium into fuel for commercial reactors and take as many as 1,500 people to build. But he paired his optimism with a dose of reality.

"The real question is how far we'll go with these cuts before (that) comes," he warned.

Local SRS supporters point out that Washington Group International, the parent company of Westinghouse, and other engineering companies are hiring some of the laid-off engineers.

That has done little to soothe the concerns of SRS workers, Mr. Wetherbee said.

"They are not very optimistic about new missions at SRS," he said. "Management wants you to believe things are good, but employees aren't buying that."

Suspicious mail sent to SRS president

Georgia authorities are investigating a suspicious letter sent to the home of the president of the Savannah River Site just one day after he notified 400 employees that they would be fired.

At about 3:45 p.m. Tuesday, Linda Pedde, wife of SRS president Bob Pedde found a white powdery substance after opening the mail, said Capt. Steve Morris of the Columbia County (Ga.) Sheriff's Department. The powder was in a regular envelope inside another envelope, which contained a threatening letter. Morris would not discuss details of the letter.

Authorities evacuated six homes in the 3000 block of Stevens Way in the Stevens Pointe neighborhood as a safety precaution. The sheriff's department sent the envelopes to the Centers for Disease Control in Atlanta for further testing. Pedde's wife and the two sheriff's deputies who first responded to the scene were decontaminated.

"There's been some talk about the layoffs and a connection there," Morris said. "Logically speaking, that could be a motivation, but that is only an assumption right now."

On Monday, Pedde gave about 400 employees a 60-day notice they would be fired. The Associated Press reported. It's the second phase of a 2,000 worker layoff, scheduled to be completed by Oct. 1, 2006.

Threatening letter laced with powder

A suspicious powder and threatening letter were discovered Tuesday at the home of Westinghouse Savannah River Co. President Bob Pedde, one day after he announced the layoffs of 400 people at Savannah River Site.

"Logically, you could assume that it (Tuesday's threat) may be connected (to the layoffs)," said Capt. Steve Morris, of the Columbia County Sheriff's Office. "It's really too early to tell. It would be just an assumption, but it is a possibility."

Will Callicott, a spokesman for Westinghouse Savannah River Co., said the company had no comment and deferredquestions to agencies at the scene. The discovery was reported just before 4 p.m. in Stevens Pointe subdivision. Pam Tucker, the county's emergency services director, said the couple had returned from vacation and found the letter in their mail.

"It's my understanding that it is a threatening letter

with white powder," Mrs. Tucker said.

As a precaution, she said, the county's health department was called to make sure anyone exposed to the letter was OK. The Columbia County Sheriff's Office also was dispatched, as was Martinez-Columbia Fire Rescue, to remove the letter and powder.

Gold Cross EMS, the county's emergency management agency and the Federal Bureau of Investigation

also were called to the scene.

"I'm sure that they'll go ahead and double bag it (the letter and powder) and tag it and get it to a lab so they

can get it tested." Mrs. Tucker said.

Capt. Morris said Mrs. Pedde and two sheriff's deputies were decontaminated as a precaution. About six neighboring homes were also evacuated, but officials said there was no immediate threat to neighbors.

A need for new SRS missions

Another 400 people have been terminated at the Savannah River Site, bringing the total number of workers at SRS to fewer than 9,000.

The dismissals were part two of a three-part implementation that will see a reduction of 800 more workers next year. Although no surprise — since the projected numbers were announced months ago — the dismissals bring to our attention once more that the number of workers at SRS is declining. More reductions will be forthcoming in future years unless SRS gets new missions.

It is imperative that government leaders on the county, state and national stage step forward to push for energy-related and nuclear-related missions that are appropriate for SRS. The Site has the infrastructure already in place for a number of potential missions ranging from a new power reactor to a reactor to create nuclear medicine to continued work on hydrogen research that might become a primary energy source in the future.

SRS has strong local support and always has. This is something that officials from the Department of Energy should take into account as they look for appropriate sites for future missions. While other communities have vacillated on their support for hometown facilities, SRS has always had a warm relationship with its surrounding communities in both Georgia and South Carolina.

This local support along with the desirable nature of a large geographic area on which to place new facilities makes SRS a primary location for many new missions. All those in the Aiken area who wish to see SRS hold a key role in the area's economic growth and in the nation's energy future should urge their representatives to push future missions toward SRS.

Callicott declined to comment on the situation as it unfolded at Pedde's residence late Tuesday afternoon.

Preliminary testing was done at the scene Tuesday, Morris said

The responding officers as well as the residents exposed to the powder were decontaminated.

Authorities cordoned off Stevens Way where Pedde lives and evacuated approximately six neighboring residences.

Morris said they should have some new information as early as today, but he was uncertain how long it would take officials to determine the composition of the substance.

He said officials were being cautious, but expected everyone would be able to return to their homes by late Tuesday evening.
"We can expect normalcy
within the next few hours," he
said as the incident unfolded.

The person who sent the letter could face a number of felony charges, including terrorist threats and acts.

Letter to Pedde undergoes tests

A threatening letter stuffed inside an envelope with a white powdery substance was received at the Martinez, Ga., home of WSRC president Boh Pedde Tuesday, but officials say any speculation that the incident was related to the layoffs announced at the Savaunah River Site earlier this week is only an assumption.

Columbia County Sheriff's Department Investigations Caption Steve Morris said the letter was stuffed inside and envelope with another envelope that contained the substance.

The powder will be sent to the Center for Disease Control in Atlanta today for analysis, but Columbia County officials will conduct their own criminal investigation to determine who sent the letter.

Among other things, officials will test the powder for anthrax

"Logically you can assume this is connected to the layoffs, but that's only an assumption at this point," Morris said. "That is one of the things we will be investigating."

Morris confirmed the letter was a threat to Pedde.

On Monday Pedde said the Department of Energy had given

the go ahead to carry out the dismissal of as many as 400 employees, bringing the total to 1,200 terminated SRS employees since March.

The layoffs are a part of what was called the "workforce restructuring plan" announced last December.


